Wyoming wildlife legacy trust.

A BILL

for

1 AN ACT relating to game and fish; consolidating various accounts within the game and fish fund into a wildlife 2 3 legacy trust account; providing additional funding for the account; specifying use of funds; specifying legislative 4 5 findings and intent; requiring annual report; and providing for an effective date. 6 7 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming: 8 9 Section 1. W.S. 23-1-504 is created to read: 10 11 12 23-1-504. Wildlife legacy trust expenditures; 13 purposes. 14 15 (a) Revenues deposited into the Wyoming wildlife legacy trust 16 income account established under W.S.

1 23-1-501(f) shall be available for expenditure by the 2 commission:

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4 (i) For wildlife habitat improvement. To further 5 this goal the commission and department shall work with 6 individuals, communities and industry to improve and 7 conserve existing habitat and minimize and mitigate the 8 effect of development on habitat. No expenditure shall be 9 made from the trust income account to purchase or acquire 10 any interest in real property;

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12 (ii) For gathering information and other 13 necessary work related to species which are likelv potential candidates for listing under the 14 federal Endangered Species Act. As directed by the commission, the 15 16 department shall collect biological information on these 17 species and enhance their habitats when necessary to help ensure their future under state management authority and 18 eliminate the need for listing and recovery programs under 19 20 the federal Endangered Species Act;

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22 (iii) Address human-wildlife conflicts 23 associated with increased development. To accomplish this 24 goal the commission and department shall work with

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1 communities and industry to minimize human-wildlife 2 conflicts associated with increased residential and 3 industrial development and demand for wildlife associated 4 recreation; 5 6 (iv) To promote the enjoyment of wildlife, 7 including the nonconsumptive use of wildlife; 8 9 (v) To promote the maintenance and growth of the Wyoming wildlife legacy trust account through additional 10 11 long term, sustainable funding sources for the account; 12 13 (vi) To make payments in accordance with W.S. 14 23-1-901, for property damage caused by trophy game animals. 15 16 17 (b) The commission shall report annually to the joint appropriations committee on or before August 1, 18 on expenditures made from the trust income account in the 19 20 previous fiscal year. The report shall include the total 21 amount of expenditures and the amount of expenditures made pursuant to each paragraph of subsection (a) of this 22 23 section. For any individual expenditure of ten thousand

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1 dollars (\$10,000.00) or more, the report shall include the 2 amount and a description of the purpose of the expenditure. 3 4 Section 2. W.S. 9-4-601(b)(i)(intro), (iv) and by 5 creating a new paragraph (v), 23-1-302(a)(xxviii), 23-1-501(f), 23-2-101 by creating a new subsection (n) and 6 23-2-201 by creating a new subsection (f) are amended to 7 8 read: 9 10 9-4-601. Distribution and use; funds, accounts, cities and towns benefited; exception for bonus payments. 11 12 13 (b) The state treasurer shall ascertain and withhold 14 all bonus payments received from the federal government attributable to coal, oil shale or geothermal leases of 15 16 federal land within Wyoming and shall distribute it as follows: 17 18 19 (i) Fifty percent (50%), the first seven million 20 five hundred thousand dollars (\$7,500,000.00) of which 21 shall be distributed as follows, but for the fiscal year 22 beginning July 1, 2002 and ending June 30, 2003 any amount 23 in excess of seven million five hundred thousand dollars 24 (\$7,500,000.00) shall be deposited in the Wyoming wildlife

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1	legacy trust account established under W.S. 23-1-501(f),
2	and thereafter any amount in excess of seven million five
3	hundred thousand dollars (\$7,500,000.00) per year shall be
4	deposited into the school capital construction account
5	established under W.S. 21-15-111(a)(i):
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7	(iv) For the fiscal year commencing July 1,
8	1994, and for each fiscal year thereafter And:

10	(A) Ten percent (10%) but not to exceed one
11	million six hundred thousand dollars (\$1,600,000.00) per
12	year, to an earmarked revenue fund account which may be
13	expended by the community college commission in accordance
14	with and in addition to appropriations available under W.S.
15	21-18-205(c). For the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2002
16	and ending June 30, 2003, any amount in excess of one
17	million six hundred thousand dollars (\$1,600,000.00) shall
18	be deposited in the Wyoming wildlife legacy trust account
19	established under W.S. 23-1-501(f). Thereafter any amount
20	in excess of one million six hundred thousand dollars
21	(\$1,600,000.00) together with any unexpended revenues
22	within the account at the end of any biennial budget period
23	shall be credited to the school capital construction
24	account established under W.S. 21-15-111(a)(i);

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2	(B) For the fiscal year beginning July 1,
3	2002 and ending June 30, 2003, forty percent (40%) to the
4	Wyoming wildlife legacy trust account established under
5	W.S. 23-1-501(f) and thereafter to the school capital
6	construction account established under W.S.
7	21-15-111(a)(i).

9	(v) Not more than ten million dollars
10	(\$10,000,000.00) shall be distributed to the Wyoming
11	wildlife legacy trust account pursuant to this subsection.
12	To the extent this limitation would be exceeded under
13	provisions of paragraph (b)(i) and subparagraphs (iv)(A)
14	and (B) of this section, the excess amount shall be
15	distributed to the school capital construction account
16	established under W.S. 21-15-111(a)(i).
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18	23-1-302. Powers and duties.
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20	(a) The commission is directed and empowered:
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22	(xxviii) To reject or to accept and expend for
23	purposes authorized under this section any and all gifts of
24	cash, stocks, bonds or any other form of monies. Gifts

1 shall be deposited and expended as provided in W.S. 2 23-1-501. 3 4 23-1-501. Game and fish fund. 5 6 (f) A trust account separate and apart from the trust 7 account established under subsection (d) of this section is created within the Wyoming game and fish fund to be known 8 9 as the Wyoming wildlife legacy trust account. The trust 10 account shall consist of those funds appropriated or 11 designated to the trust account by law or by gift from 12 whatever source. Revenues collected from the sale of 13 licenses under W.S. 23-2-101(j)(vii) and 23-2-201(d)(viii) 14 and conservation stamps as provided by W.S. 23-2-306(a)(ii)(A) shall be deposited within the trust 15 16 account. Funds deposited within the trust account are 17 intended to be inviolate and constitute a permanent or perpetual trust account which shall be invested by the 18 state treasurer as authorized under W.S. 9-4-711 and in a 19 20 manner to obtain the highest return possible consistent 21 with preservation of the account corpus. Any The state 22 treasurer shall credit annually to a Wyoming wildlife 23 legacy trust income account interest earned from investment 24 of the trust account corpus shall be credited by the state

1	treasurer into the Wyoming game and fish fund to up to an
2	amount equal to five percent (5%) of the balance of the
3	corpus at the beginning of the fiscal year. Earnings above
4	the five percent (5%) amount shall be retained in the
5	corpus of the trust account. Notwithstanding subsection (b)
6	of this section, funds within the trust income account
7	shall be expended by the commission only for purposes

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Section 3. W.S. 23-1-501(c) and (d) is repealed.

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6 Section 4. The legislature finds that Wyoming's wildlife resources are invaluable to the people of the 7 state and our progeny. Wildlife resources can be renewable, 8 9 but those resources currently face a major crisis requiring 10 additional funding to maintain their full potential to the 11 state. Current funding for wildlife resources is provided 12 nearly exclusively by hunting and fishing license fees. The 13 value of wildlife resources extends to all people of the 14 state and the resources should be supported by funding 15 attributable to both consumptive users and other people of 16 the state. The intent of the legislature is to use funds 17 from nonrenewable resources together with funding provided by consumptive users to fulfill the potential of renewable 18 19 wildlife resources. In making expenditures from the Wyoming 20 wildlife legacy trust income account the game and fish 21 commission shall be guided by the provisions of law and the 22 principles enumerated within this section.

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1	Section 5. All funds within the accounts created by
2	W.S. 23-1-501(c), (d) and (f) as of June 30, 2002 shall be
3	transferred to the Wyoming wildlife legacy trust account
4	established under W.S. 23-1-501(f).
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6	Section 6. This act is effective July 1, 2002.
