SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. SJ0004

Wolf reintroduction-effect on elk populations.

A Bill

for

- 1 A JOINT RESOLUTION requesting Congress to direct all
- 2 federal authorities responsible for wolf reintroduction in
- 3 the state of Wyoming to manage wolves so that the elk,
- 4 moose and deer population, moose and deer habitats and elk
- 5 feed grounds are preserved and to reimburse the state for
- 6 the loss of elk, moose and deer to wolves.

7

- 8 WHEREAS, the federal government is responsible for the
- 9 reintroduction of wolves in the state of Wyoming;

10

- 11 WHEREAS, elk, moose and deer are important to the
- 12 recreational and economic interests of the people of the
- 13 state of Wyoming;

14

- 15 WHEREAS, the use of elk feed grounds provides positive
- 16 benefits for the people of the state of Wyoming by

- 1 maintaining elk population objectives at different
- 2 locations in the state;

3

- 4 WHEREAS, the introduction of wolves creates a negative
- 5 impact on habitats for moose and deer and wolves kill and
- 6 displace moose and deer, thereby posing a threat to the
- 7 maintenance of moose and deer population objectives in the
- 8 state;

9

- 10 WHEREAS, wolves kill and displace elk, moose and deer,
- 11 thereby posing a threat to the maintenance of elk
- 12 population objectives in the state and the use of elk feed
- 13 grounds to achieve those objectives;

14

- 15 WHEREAS, wolves kill approximately three hundred thirty (330)
- 16 elk annually in Wyoming, costing the owner of those elk, the
- 17 state of Wyoming, an estimated one million three hundred
- 18 twenty thousand dollars (\$1,320,000.00);

- 20 WHEREAS, the state of Wyoming does not have jurisdiction to
- 21 regulate wolves while they remain on the federal list of
- 22 threatened species.

- 1 Now, Therefore, Be It Resolved By The Members of the
- 2 Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

3

- 4 **Section 1.** That the Wyoming state legislature
- 5 recognizes the importance of elk, moose and deer to the
- 6 people of the state and the use of elk feed grounds and the
- 7 importance of habitats for moose and deer to maintain elk,
- 8 moose and deer population objectives at various locations
- 9 in the state of Wyoming.

10

- 11 Section 2. That the federal authorities responsible
- 12 for the management of wolves in the state of Wyoming must
- 13 manage wolves in a manner consistent with maintaining elk,
- 14 moose and deer population objectives, preserving the
- 15 habitats of moose and deer and the use of elk feed grounds,
- 16 as determined by state wildlife officials.

17

- 18 **Section 3.** That the federal government should annually
- 19 reimburse the state of Wyoming for the loss to the state
- 20 caused by the killing of elk, moose and deer by wolves.

21

Section 4. That the Secretary of State of Wyoming

2 transmit copies of this resolution to the President of the

3 United States, to the President of the Senate and the

Speaker of the House of Representatives of the United 4

States Congress, to the United States Secretary of Interior 5

6 and to the Wyoming Congressional Delegation.
