## A BILL

for

1 AN ACT relating to nursing education programs; establishing 2 a Wyoming investment in nursing program as specified; 3 specifying eligibility criteria; providing procedures for application, administration and repayment of loans under 4 5 the Wyoming investment in nursing program as specified; providing for appeals; requiring the Wyoming community 6 7 college commission to coordinate the development and implementation of a nurse education program as specified; 8 requiring the commission to coordinate internet or similar 9 proprietary or common carrier electronic system courses to 10 meet prerequisites for entry into nursing programs 11 12 specified; specifying conditions under which the Wyoming 13 community college commission and the University of Wyoming 14 shall fund additional teaching positions in nursing

- 1 education programs; providing appropriations; and
- 2 providing for an effective date.

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4 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

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Section 1. W.S. 9-2-123 is created to read: 6

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- 8 9-2-123. Wyoming investment in nursing loan and grant
- 9 program; eligibility criteria; procedures.

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- (a) There is created the Wyoming investment 11
- 12 nursing program administered by the Wyoming higher
- 13 education assistance authority created under W.S.
- 21-16-703. The program shall be known as the WYIN program. 14
- Applicants may apply for loans from the WYIN program in 15
- accordance with this section. 16

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- (b) To qualify for a loan under the WYIN program, the 18
- 19 applicant shall first:

- 21 (i) Be accepted into a nursing education program
- 22 at a Wyoming community college, the University of Wyoming,
- or, in the case of a candidate for a doctoral degree, an 23
- 24 institution providing the required nursing education

1 courses under contract with the western interstate

2 commission for higher education; and

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4 (ii) Apply for federal financial

5 assistance. Wyoming community colleges shall allow

6 students who apply for admission into an approved nurse

7 aide training or nursing education program, and who will

8 enroll in fewer than six (6) academic credit hours, to

9 apply for federal financial assistance.

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11 (c) Subject to the availability of funds appropriated

12 for this program, loans under the WYIN program may be

13 granted to applicants enrolled or planning to enroll in

14 nursing education programs as follows:

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16 (i) An applicant who is accepted into a Wyoming

17 licensed practical nurse or registered nursing education

18 program may be eligible for a loan to pay the costs of

19 attendance at the licensed practical nursing education

20 program or the registered nursing education program.

21 Students who successfully complete a licensed practical

22 nursing education program at a Wyoming community college

23 shall be deemed to have completed all first year nursing

24 education program requirements for a registered nursing

education program leading to an associate's degree offered 1

2 at the Wyoming community college which awarded the license

3 practical nurse certificate;

4

5 (ii) A registered nurse with a baccalaureate degree who holds an unencumbered license with the Wyoming 6

7 board of nursing, has the equivalent of at least two (2)

years of full-time, continuous service teaching in a 8

9 nursing education program in Wyoming as a registered nurse

with a baccalaureate degree and is accepted into a Wyoming 10

nursing education program at the University of Wyoming 11

12 leading to a master's degree in nursing may be eligible for

13 a loan to pay the costs of attendance at the nursing

14 education program leading to a master's degree in nursing

provided that in order to receive a loan for a master's 15

16 degree program, the applicant shall agree to repay the loan

17 by teaching at a Wyoming college or the University of

Wyoming; 18

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20 (iii) A registered nurse with a master's degree 21 in nursing who holds an unencumbered license with the 22 Wyoming board of nursing, has the equivalent of at least two (2) years of full-time, continuous service teaching in 23

a nursing education program in Wyoming as a registered

1 nurse with a master's degree in nursing and is accepted 2 a nursing education program at an institution into 3 providing the required nursing education courses under 4 contract with the western interstate commission for higher 5 education leading to a doctorate level degree in nursing may be eligible for a loan to pay the costs of attendance 6 at the nursing education program leading to a doctorate 7 level degree in nursing provided that in order to receive a 8 9 loan for a doctorate level degree program, the applicant

shall agree to repay the loan by teaching at the University

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of Wyoming.

13 (d) A loan provided under this section shall not exceed the cost of attendance for the approved program, 14 reduced by the amount of any Pell or other federal grant 15 16 received by the applicant.

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(e) A recipient of a WYIN loan under this section may 18 repay the loan without cash payment by working in Wyoming 19 20 as a nurse or nurse educator as provided in subsection (f) 21 of this section. To qualify as repayment under this 22 subsection, work shall be performed within the following time periods which begin with the calendar month following 23

the month in which the student completed the academic 1

2 program:

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4 (i) If the loan can be repaid with work of two

5 (2) years or less, within three (3) years;

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7 (ii) If the loan can be repaid with work of

greater than two (2) years, but no more than four (4) 8

9 years, within five (5) years;

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(iii) If the loan can be repaid with work of 11

12 greater than four (4) years, within the amount of time the

13 loan could be repaid, plus two (2) years.

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(f) Qualified work under subsection (e) of this 15

section shall be credited so that the student's loan 16

balance is reduced on the basis of one (1) year of full-17

18 time employment repaying the loan balance for one (1)

academic year of full-time enrollment. Qualified work shall 19

20 be credited on a proportional basis.

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22 (g) Any recipient of a WYIN loan who fails:

1 (i) To complete the academic program for which

2 the loan was provided shall commence cash repayment of the

3 loan no later than forty-five (45) days after the recipient

4 leaves the academic program;

5

6 (ii) To obtain employment in the targeted
7 occupation for which the person received the education
8 within ninety (90) days after successfully passing the
9 appropriate certification examination shall commence cash
10 repayment of the loan within one hundred twenty (120) days
11 after successfully passing the appropriate certification

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examination;

The appropriate certification examination 14 (iii) 15 the first attempt may retake the appropriate 16 certification examination at the next available opportunity 17 before commencing repayment of the loan. The recipient shall notify the Wyoming higher education assistance 18 authority or its contractor of the intent to retake the 19 20 examination and the date the examination will be taken. Any 21 recipient of a WYIN loan who fails the appropriate 22 certification examination after the second attempt shall commence cash repayment of the loan within forty-five (45) 23 days after receipt of notification of the second failure by 24

1 the board of nursing. If the recipient of a WYIN loan who

2 fails the appropriate certification examination on the

3 first attempt does not retake the examination at the next

4 available opportunity, cash repayment shall commence within

5 forty-five (45) days after the next available examination

6 is conducted.

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8 (h) Loan repayment options under this section may be

9 deferred for a period not to exceed four (4) years while a

10 loan recipient is serving on full-time active duty with any

11 branch of the military services of the United States.

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13 (j) The Wyoming higher education assistance authority

14 shall have the powers and duties specified in W.S.

15 21-16-705 to implement this section and shall establish

16 terms and conditions of loans issued under this section,

17 including:

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19 (i) Interest rates and loan terms;

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21 (ii) The form and process for loan application,

22 review and award;

1 (iii) Criteria under which students may be

2 relieved from having to repay loans and interest thereon,

3 in whole or in part, where the requirement to repay would

4 cause undue hardship.

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6 (k) Funding of the loan program established under

7 this section shall be by appropriation of the legislature.

8 The authority shall transfer approved loan amounts to the

9 university of Wyoming and to Wyoming community colleges at

10 which loan recipients are enrolled. In consultation with

11 the university and affected community colleges, the

12 authority shall establish procedures for transferring loan

13 amounts and for reporting requirements on the expenditure

14 of transferred loan amounts.

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16 (m) Cash repayment of loans and interest thereon

17 shall be credited to the general fund.

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19 (n) The authority shall annually review the loan

20 program established under this section and report to the

21 governor and the legislature in accordance with W.S.

22 9-2-1014, regarding program results, funds received and

23 loans issued during the preceding academic year, together

 $1\,$  with the status of all outstanding loan commitments and

2 repayments under the program.

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4 (o) This program created by this section shall expire

5 effective June 30, 2011.

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7 (p) Notwithstanding subsection (o) of this section:

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9 (i) Any person beginning a nursing education

10 program as authorized by this section shall continue to

11 receive funding for the program so long as the person

12 remains eligible as required by this section;

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14 (ii) Repayment of loans provided under this

15 section shall continue as specified in this section until

16 all loan obligations have been satisfied.

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18 **Section 2.** W.S. 21-17-107, 21-18-202(b) by creating

19 new paragraphs (v) and (vi), (c) by creating a new

20 paragraph (vii) and 21-18-317 are amended to read:

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22 **21-17-107**. Legislature to make appropriations.

1 (a) The legislature shall appropriate monies intended 2 for the support and maintenance of the University of 3 The appropriations shall specify the purposes for 4 which the monies are intended and may be used. 5 appropriations shall apply to and include all monies received by the university from the United States for the 6 7 endowment and support of colleges for the benefit agriculture and mechanic arts. No expenditure shall be 8 9 made in excess of an appropriation, and no monies so appropriated shall be used for any purpose other than that 10 11 for which they are appropriated.

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Subject to appropriation by the legislature, the board of trustees shall fund an entry level teaching faculty position whenever the university expands its nursing program capacity by eight (8) students. The university shall expend the funding under this subsection only if enrollment in the nursing program of the university was not less than ninety-five percent (95%) of the total nursing program capacity at the beginning of the most recent fall academic semester. Funding available for expenditure under this subsection for the specific purpose of expanding a nursing program capacity shall be reduced by an amount equal to that provided to fund one (1) entry

level teaching position for every reduction of eight (8) 1 2 full-time equivalent students in the nursing program, as 3 determined by comparing the beginning enrollments of the 4 two (2) most recent fall academic semesters. Any 5 appropriation made for purposes of this subsection shall be 6 accounted for and distributed separately from 7 appropriations made pursuant to subsection (a) of this 8 section. 9 10 21-18-202. Powers and duties of the commission. 11 12 (b) The commission shall perform the following coordination functions. In performing these coordination 13 functions all affected colleges and the commission shall be 14 involved: 15 16 17 Subject to appropriation by the legislature, 18 coordinate the development and implementation of outreach 19 nurse education programs, including: 20 21 (A) Reviewing applications for development 22 of the programs; 23

1 (B) Contracting with Wyoming community 2 colleges to provide the programs established under this 3 paragraph, giving due consideration to the community 4 college with responsibility for the service area in which a 5 program is offered. 6 7 (vi) Coordinate the provision by means of electronic internet or similar proprietary or common 8 9 carrier electronic system technology, by a community 10 college or several community colleges, of all prerequisite 11 courses necessary for entry into an educational program in 12 the field of nursing at a community college or a 13 baccalaureate degree program in nursing at the University 14 of Wyoming. 15 16 commission shall perform the (C) The following administrative functions: 17 18 (vii) Subject to appropriation by the 19 20 legislature, the commission shall fully fund an entry level 21 teaching faculty position whenever a community college 22 expands its nursing program capacity by eight (8) students. 23 A community college shall be eligible to apply for the 24 funding under this paragraph only if enrollment in the

1 nursing program of the applicant institution was not less 2 than ninety-five percent (95%) of the total nursing program capacity at the beginning of the most recent fall academic 3 4 semester. Funding provided under this paragraph for the 5 specific purpose of expanding a nursing program capacity shall be reduced by an amount equal to that provided to 6 7 fund one (1) entry level teaching position for every reduction of eight (8) full-time equivalent students in the 8 9 nursing program, as determined by comparing the beginning 10 enrollments of the two (2) most recent fall academic 11 semesters. Funding reductions shall not exceed the total 12 amount of funding provided to a community college under 13 this paragraph. Any appropriation made for purposes of this 14 paragraph shall, in accordance with W.S. 21-18-205(e), be accounted for and distributed separately from the funding 15 allocation model for community colleges. 16

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18 21-18-317. Authority to provide educational program; 19 scope and approval of program.

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21 The community college district board of any community 22 college in this state may provide the an educational program education in the field of nursing. The educational 23 program shall be of such the duration and intensity as may 24

1 be deemed appropriate by the community college district

2 board and the Wyoming state board of nursing and shall lead

3 to an associate degree in nursing and prepare each student

4 for licensure as provided by law. Approval of the Wyoming

5 state board of nursing is required prior to the

6 establishment of any such the nursing education.

8 Section 3.

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10 (a) There is appropriated two million eight hundred 11 seventy-seven thousand three hundred twenty-five dollars 12 (\$2,877,325.00) to the Wyoming higher education assistance 13 authority from the general fund for the fiscal year

14 beginning July 1, 2003 to implement the provisions of W.S.

9-2-123. Any funds appropriated under this subsection that

16 are not expended, encumbered or obligated at the end of the

17 biennium shall revert to the general fund as provided by

18 W.S. 9-4-207.

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20 (b) There is appropriated from the general fund to
21 the Wyoming community college commission five hundred
22 fifty-one thousand three hundred sixty-four dollars
23 (\$551,364.00) for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2003,

24 to implement the provisions of W.S. 21-18-202 (b) (v).

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(c) There is appropriated from the general fund to the Wyoming community college commission three hundred seventy-eight thousand three hundred twenty-five dollars (\$378,325.00) for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2003, to implement the provisions of W.S. 21-18-202(c)(vii).

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8 (d) There is appropriated from the general fund to 9 the University of Wyoming sixty-five thousand dollars 10 (\$65,000.00) for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2003, to 11 implement the provisions of W.S. 21-17-107(b).

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Section 4. This act is effective July 1, 2003.
