A BILL

for

1 AN ACT relating to Medicaid; authorizing the department of

2 health to apply for a federal Medicaid waiver to allow

3 specified individuals to participate in a pharmacy plus

4 program; specifying eligibility criteria; requiring rule

5 making; providing for termination of the pharmacy plus

6 program as specified; providing an appropriation; and

7 providing for effective dates.

9 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

11 **Section 1.** W.S. 42-4-119 is created to read:

12

13 **42-4-119.** Pharmacy plus program; eligibility

14 criteria; rulemaking; termination of program.

1 (a) The department may apply for a demonstration

2 waiver under section 1115 of the federal Social Security

3 Act to allow individuals with income or assets in excess of

4 limits generally established in the state plan to receive

5 services under a pharmacy plus program provided that:

6

7 (i) The individual is a beneficiary under the

8 federal Medicare program, who has not been determined to be

9 eligible for full Medicaid benefits under the state plan;

10

11 (ii) The total family income of the individual

12 does not exceed two hundred percent (200%) of the federal

13 poverty level in effect on April 1 of that calendar year;

14 and

15

16 (iii) An individual determined eligible to

17 receive services under this section shall not be eligible

18 for other services under W.S. 42-4-103, unless the

19 individual otherwise qualifies for such services.

20 Eligibility for assistance under the program created by

21 this section shall not constitute an entitlement and

22 services shall be provided under this section only to the

23 extent funds are available.

1 (b) The department shall provide assurances to the

2 United States secretary of health and human services

3 necessary to obtain approval of the waiver applied for

4 under this section.

5

(c) Effective July 1, 2003, or upon federal approval 6 7 of the waiver applied for under this section, whichever occurs later, the department shall implement the pharmacy 8 9 plus program to assist eligible individuals with payment 10 and management of prescription drug costs. In implementing 11 the pharmacy plus program, the department may use private 12 sector benefit management approaches, including pharmacy 13 benefit managers, preferred drug lists, prior authorization, pharmacist consultation, provider education, 14 disease state management and variable enrollee cost sharing 15 16 in the form of annual or monthly premium assessments, perprescription \co-payment 17 requirements, coinsurance, deductibles and coverage limits. The department shall 18 establish through rules and regulations variable enrollee 19 20 sharing provisions under this subsection 21 graduated basis, taking into consideration the differing 22 income levels of enrollees and the funding available to the 23 program.

1 (d) If the federal Medicare program is amended to provide pharmaceutical benefits for recipients under that 2 3 program, the pharmacy plus program authorized under this

4 section shall terminate upon implementation of the federal

5 Medicare pharmaceutical benefits program.

(e) The department shall project costs of the program 7 created by this section at least quarterly and compare 8 those projected costs against the funds appropriated for 9 10 the program. If the funds available to the program are 11 insufficient to meet the projected costs of the program, 12 the department shall take action to prevent the program 13 from incurring costs beyond available funds, including

taking any of the actions specified in W.S. 42-4-118(e).

Section 2. There is appropriated one million four 16 17 hundred forty-five thousand forty-six dollars (\$1,445,046.00), or as much thereof as is necessary, from 18 the general fund to the department of health for the fiscal 19 20 year beginning July 1, 2003, to implement the purposes of 21 this act. To the extent any state appropriation from any 22 other revenue source becomes available to implement the purposes of this act, this appropriation is void. 23

1 The appropriation is for the first year of the 2 program. For the second year of the program, it 3 is projected that an appropriation of \$2,723,691 4 would be needed. That amount should become part of the Department's biennial budget request to 5 6 the Governor and JAC. 7 8 Section 3. 9 10 (a) Except as provided in subsection (b) of this section, this act is effective immediately upon completion 11 12 of all acts necessary for a bill to become law as provided 13 by Article 4, Section 8 of the Wyoming Constitution; 14 15 (b) Section 2 of this act is effective July 1, 2003. 16 17 (END)
