A BILL

for

- 1 AN ACT relating to motor vehicles; amending and clarifying
- 2 the permitted use of off-road recreational vehicles; and
- 3 providing for an effective date.

5 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

7 **Section 1.** W.S. 31-5-1601 is created to read:

- 10 OFF-ROAD RECREATIONAL VEHICLES

12 31-5-1601. Operation on highways.

- 14 (a) An off-road recreational vehicle may be operated
- 15 upon streets, roads or highways within Wyoming subject to
- 16 the following conditions:

2 (i) Off-road recreational vehicles may 3 operated on the main-traveled roadway only upon that 4 portion of a street, road or highway designated open by the 5 state, local or federal agency with jurisdiction over the roadway and designated a Wyoming off-road recreational 6 vehicle trail pursuant to W.S. 31-2-701 through 31-2-707 by 7 the department of state parks and cultural resources. 8 9 portion of a street, road or highway shall be designated as 10 a Wyoming off-road recreational vehicle trail by the 11 department without the consent of the state, local or 12 federal agency with jurisdiction over the roadway. Off-13 road recreational vehicles operated upon 14 designated as trails shall be subject only to the user registration fee prescribed by W.S. 31-2-703 and shall not 15 16 motorcycle as defined be deemed а in W.S. 17 31-1-101(a) (xv) (E) (I) and 31-5-102(a) (xxii);

19 (ii) Crossings of main-traveled roadways shall
20 be made at right angles to the roadway or as nearly so as
21 practicable, but in any case yielding the right-of-way to
22 all traffic in the main-traveled roadway;

- 1 (iii) If operated at any time from one-half $(\frac{1}{2})$
- 2 hour after sunset to one-half (1/2) hour before sunrise, the
- 3 off-road recreational vehicle shall be equipped with
- 4 lighted lamps and illuminating devices in accordance with
- 5 W.S. 31-5-910 through 31-5-940;

- 7 (iv) The off-road recreational vehicle shall be
- 8 equipped with an adequate braking device that may be
- 9 operated either by hand or foot; and

- 11 (v) If operated on state or federal lands, the
- 12 off-road recreational vehicle shall be equipped with:

14 (A) An approved spark arrester;

15

- 16 (B) A noise muffler which produces a
- 17 propulsion noise level of not more than one hundred two
- 18 (102) decibels at twenty (20) inches in a stationary test.

19

- 20 (b) Nothing in this section authorizes the operation
- 21 of an off-road recreational vehicle upon a street, road or
- 22 highway within Wyoming by a person who has not been issued
- 23 a valid driver's license or permit.

3 (I) A recreational vehicle primarily 4 designed for off-road use which is fifty (50) inches or 5 less in width, has an unladen weight of nine hundred (900) 6 pounds or less and is designed to be ridden astride upon a 7 seat or saddle and to travel on at least three (3) low 8 pressure tires. A "low pressure tire" is a pneumatic tire 9 at least six (6) inches in width, designed for use on wheels with a rim diameter of twelve (12) inches or less 10 and having a manufacturer's recommended operating pressure 11 12 of ten (10) pounds per square inch or less;

14 (II) Any unlicensed motorcycle which 15 has an unladen weight of six hundred (600) pounds or less and is designed to be ridden off road with the operator 16 17 astride upon a seat or saddle and travels on two (2) tires; 18 and

20 (III) Any multi-wheeled motorized 21 vehicle not required by law to be licensed and is designed 22 for cross-country travel on or over land, sand, snow, ice 23 or other natural terrain and which has an unladen weight of

24 more than nine hundred (900) pounds.

22 than one hundred dollars (\$100.00).

11 <u>(a)</u> No person shall operate an off-road recreational 12 vehicle as defined in W.S. 31-1-101(a)(xv)(K) upon public 13 streets or highways except:

(i) For incidental operation of vehicles specified in W.S. 31-1-101(a)(xv)(K)(I), upon a public street or highway located outside the limits of an incorporated municipality pursuant to agricultural operations as defined in W.S. 31-18-801(a)(i). An off-road recreational vehicle operated upon a public street or highway under this paragraph is subject to the same equipment requirements under this act as an implement of husbandry;

1 (ii) For operation of a vehicle in accordance 2 with the provisions of W.S. 31-5-1601. 3 Section 3. This act is effective immediately upon 4 5 completion of all acts necessary for a bill to become law as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of the Wyoming 6 7 Constitution. 8 9 (END)
