## A Bill

for

- 1 A JOINT RESOLUTION requesting the Bureau of Land Management
- 2 to develop and implement a coordinated resource management
- 3 plan for the Jack Morrow Hills area that allows multiple
- 4 use in accordance with the Federal Land Policy and
- 5 Management Act of 1972.

- 7 WHEREAS, continued multiple use of public lands in Wyoming
- 8 under the authority of the Bureau of Land Management is
- 9 essential to the economy of the State and life-style of its
- 10 citizens;

- 12 WHEREAS, the Bureau of Land Management is developing a
- 13 coordinated resource management plan for the Jack Morrow
- 14 Hills area, including portions of Fremont and Sublette

15 counties; and

- 1 WHEREAS, several of the proposed alternatives being
- 2 considered in the planning process would severely restrict
- 3 access to the Jack Morrow Hills area for recreation,
- 4 livestock grazing and mineral development.

- 6 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MEMBERS OF THE
- 7 LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WYOMING:

- 9 **Section 1.** That the Wyoming state legislature
- 10 recognizes the importance of maintaining full access to the
- 11 Jack Morrow Hills area for recreational use, the grazing of
- 12 livestock and the production of minerals.

13

- 14 Section 2. That public recreation, livestock grazing
- 15 and mineral development can be undertaken in a manner that
- 16 recognizes and protects the aesthetic, historic and
- 17 wildlife values of the Jack Morrow Hills area.

18

- 19 **Section 3.** That the Bureau of Land Management proceed
- 20 in a timely manner to develop, analyze, adopt and implement
- 21 a coordinated resource management plan for the Jack Morrow
- 22 Hills area that allows and authorizes recreational use,
- 23 livestock grazing and mineral development to continue to

1 expand under the principle of multiple use as mandated

2 under the Federal Land Policy and Management Act of 1972.

4 Section 4. That the Secretary of State of Wyoming

5 transmit copies of this resolution to the President and

6 Vice-President of the United States, the United States

7 Secretary of the Interior and to each member of the United

8 States House of Representatives and Senate.
