A BILL

for

1 AN ACT relating to the Wyoming national guard; defining and clarifying terms; modifying assistant adjutants general and 2 deputy military administrator positions and qualifications 3 4 as specified; clarifying provisions pertaining to national 5 guard officers, officer discharge and officer promotion; 6 prescribing national guard enlistment oath and discharge 7 procedures; clarifying guard member worker's compensation coverage; specifying state service applicable to academic 8 9 disruption protection; and providing for an effective date. 10

11 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming: 12

Section 1. W.S. 19-7-101(a)(v), by creating new paragraphs (viii) through (xi) and by renumbering (viii) as (xii), 19-7-104(a) and (b), 19-9-102(a)(ii) and (b), 19-9-210(b), 19-9-301(b), (c), (e) and (f), 19-9-302(a) and

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1 (b) and by creating new subsections (d) through (f), 2 19-9-403(b), 19-10-107 and 19-11-120(a) are amended to 3 read: 4 5 19-7-101. Definitions. 6 7 (a) As used in this act: 8 9 (v) "Active state service" means service on 10 behalf of the state wherever called upon in aid of civil 11 authorities, under martial law, at encampments ordered by state authority or upon any other duty requiring the entire 12 13 time of the organization or person, including state active 14 duty and duty under title 32, United States Code, except when called or ordered into the federal service of the 15 United States under title 10, United States Code; 16 17 (viii) "State active duty" means service on 18 19 behalf of the state under the command of the governor 20 excluding service while in status under title 32, United 21 States Code, or while in federal service under title 10 of 22 the United States Code; 23

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1 (ix) "Enlisted member" means a member at military pay grades E-1 through E-9, as defined by federal 2 3 rule and regulation; 4 5 (x) "Membership" means an officer's or enlisted member's status when officially serving in the Wyoming 6 7 national guard as a military member commencing with the date of initial appointment or enlistment, as applicable, 8 9 extending through the date of discharge, and is not restricted or limited by service in any specified duty 10 11 position; 12 13 (xi) "Discharge" or "separate" means to separate 14 a member from the organization; 15 (viii) (xii) "This act" means title 19. 16 17 18 19-7-104. Assistant adjutants general; deputy 19 military administrator and fiscal officer; emergency 20 management coordinator. 21 22 (a) The adjutant general shall appoint an assistant adjutant general for the army national guard and an 23 assistant adjutant general for the air national guard. 24 3 HB0117

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1	Each assistant adjutant general shall serve in their
2	respective duty positions at the pleasure of the adjutant
3	general and may be removed from the position by the
4	adjutant general as provided under W.S. 9-1-202(b)(i).
5	Each assistant adjutant general shall hold the rank of
6	brigadier general and shall possess the qualifications set
7	forth in W.S. 19-7-103(a)(i) through (iv) <u>(</u>iii) . No person
8	shall continue to serve as an assistant adjutant general
9	after failing to qualify before a federal recognition board
10	for promotion to the grade of brigadier general.

The adjutant general shall appoint a deputy 12 (b) 13 military administrator for state military affairs, who 14 shall serve in this position at the pleasure of the adjutant general and may be removed from this at-will 15 16 position by the adjutant general under W.S. 9-1-202 (b) (i). 17 Under the direction of the adjutant general, the deputy military administrator shall prepare such reports, returns 18 and requisitions as may be required and is accountable and 19 responsible for all state military property and stores not 20 21 in the possession of organizations. He shall receive and 22 issue to all organizations on approved requisitions such property and equipment as may be required and authorized by 23 24 appropriate state officials for the organizations. The

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annual compensation of the deputy military administrator 1 2 shall be determined and fixed by the Wyoming personnel 3 division. The duties of the deputy military administrator may be delegated to any officers of the Wyoming military 4 5 department upon recommendation of the deputy military administrator and approval by the adjutant general. 6

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8 19-9-102. Organization of national guard; duty of 9 governor.

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11 The Wyoming national guard consists of the (a) 12 following officers and staff in addition to or in 13 combination with such elements of the army and air forces of the national guard of the United States as are allocated 14 to the state by the president, the secretary of defense or 15 16 the secretary of army or air, and accepted by the state:

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18 (ii) Two (2) assistant adjutants general 19 appointed pursuant to W.S. 19-7-105(a) 19-7-104(a);

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21 (b) The national guard shall be organized into 22 separate departments divisions for army and air with an officer not over the grade of brigadier general at the head 23 24 of each department division who is subordinate to the

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1 adjutant general., who serves as Each division head shall be an assistant adjutant general and who shall serve as the 2 acting adjutant general, in order of rank, upon absence, 3 4 incapacity or death of the adjutant general. The governor, 5 by and with the advice of the adjutant general, shall make and publish such orders as necessary to conform the 6 national guard of Wyoming in organization, armament and 7 discipline to that prescribed for the regular army or air 8 9 force of the United States, subject to such general exceptions as authorized by this act and by the laws of the 10 United States. For this purpose, the governor may increase 11 12 decrease the number of officers, noncommissioned or 13 officers and personnel of any grade to the extent made

14 necessary by changes authorized by department of defense orders or national guard regulations. 15

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17 19-9-210. State active duty without pay.

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19 When serving on state active duty, without pay, (b) 20 members shall be deemed state employees for the purpose of 21 being covered under the Wyoming Worker's Compensation Act 22 and their state active state service duty shall be 23 considered an extrahazardous occupation under W.S. 24 27-14-108.

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2 19-9-301. National guard officers generally.

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4 (b) All officers appointed in the national guard of 5 Wyoming except the adjutant general and assistant adjutants general shall hold their appointments membership until they 6 7 have reached sixty-four (64) seventy (70) years of age unless retired or discharged prior to that time. by reason 8 9 of resignation, disability, withdrawal of federal recognition, transfer to armed forces reserves or for cause 10 11 to be determined by a courts-martial or administrative board legally convened for that purpose No officer 12 13 possesses a property interest in any duty position. The 14 adjutant general is the discharge authority for all officers except the adjutant general, for which the 15 governor shall be that authority. Any officer may be 16 17 discharged from the Wyoming national guard according to procedures established by orders and regulations prescribed 18 19 or promulgated by the adjutant general or according to 20 federal law and regulation. An officer discharged from the 21 United States air force or army reserves or who has his 22 federal recognition withdrawn shall also be discharged from 23 the Wyoming national guard effective as of the date of

1 discharge from the reserves or withdrawal of federal 2 recognition.

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4 Initial appointments and promotions will shall be (C) 5 made from the best qualified officers available for service in a unit or organization. Recommendations for selection in 6 the grade of major or above will be approved by the 7 adjutant general and the senior officer in a command 8 9 position from the department in which the appointment or 10 promotion is to be made The adjutant general shall for 11 federal promotions and as required by federal regulation, 12 submit recommendations personally or through a federal 13 recognition board appointed by the adjutant general. For 14 state promotion of officers, the adjutant general shall be 15 the promotion authority.

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17 (e) The moral character, capacity and general fitness for the service of any national guard officer may be 18 19 determined at any time by an administrative board as 20 provided by applicable law and regulations. Commissions of 21 officers of the national guard may be vacated upon 22 resignation or absence without leave for three (3) months 23 upon the recommendation of an administrative board or 24 pursuant to sentence of a courts-martial. Any officer

1	permanently leaving the state shall resign his commission
2	upon request of the adjutant general or may apply to be
3	placed upon the inactive list. Officers rendered surplus by
4	the disbandment of their organization shall be disposed of
5	as provided by federal law and regulations. Upon their own
6	application, officers may be placed on the inactive list as
7	authorized by federal law or regulations.
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9	(f) The compensation of all officers when on duty by
10	order of the governor shall be the same as paid to officers
11	of like grade in the regular armed forces of the United
12	States including longevity pay and allowances for federal
13	and national guard service.
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15	19-9-302. Enlistments; oath; term; reenlistments and
16	extensions; discharge.
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18	(a) After the forming of an organization <u>,</u> recruits
19	may be enlisted into the organization. They shall sign
20	their names to an enlistment contract to be furnished by
21	the adjutant general for that purpose and signing is legal
22	enlistment. Every commissioned officer is empowered to <u>and</u>
23	every noncommissioned officer at military pay grade E-9 as

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1 defined by federal rule and regulation, may administer the 2 oath required on enlistment.

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4 (b) Every enlisted member shall serve for a term of 5 years prescribed by department of defense orders or national quard regulations unless he is properly 6 7 discharged. Upon expiration of the service of any enlisted 8 man, the commanding officer of his organization shall 9 prepare a discharge as provided for in department of 10 defense orders or national guard regulations. 11

12 (d) Upon expiration of the service of any enlisted 13 member or upon his discharge under United States department 14 of defense or national guard regulation, the commanding officer of his organization shall prepare a discharge 15 certificate as provided by federal or national guard 16 17 regulation.

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19 (e) The adjutant general is the discharge authority for all enlisted members. An enlisted member may be 20 21 discharged from the Wyoming national guard according to 22 regulations adopted by the adjutant general or by federal 23 law and regulation.

1	(f) An enlisted member discharged from the United
2	States air force or army reserves shall be discharged from
3	the Wyoming national guard effective as of the date of
4	discharge from the reserves.
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6	19-9-403. Pay and allowances of officers and enlisted
7	men in active state service and state active duty; worker's
8	compensation coverage for national guard members; no
9	pension denied by reason of service.
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11	(b) Members of the Wyoming national guard while in
12	state active state service duty by order or voluntarily at
13	the request of the governor shall be deemed state employees
14	for purpose of being covered under the Wyoming Worker's
15	Compensation Act and their <mark>state</mark> active state service <u>duty</u>
16	shall be considered as an extrahazardous occupation under
17	W.S. 27-14-108.
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19	19-10-107. Worker's compensation.
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21	In the event of disability or death resulting from an
22	injury while in <mark>state</mark> active service <u>duty</u> under orders of
23	the governor, members of the Wyoming state guard are
24	entitled to the same benefits provided for employees under

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1 the provisions of the Wyoming Worker's Compensation Act. 2 Benefits shall be paid out of the general fund of Wyoming 3 upon certification by the state council of defense. 4 5 19-11-120. Academic penalties prohibited. 6 (a) No student member of any uniformed service of the 7 United States shall have his education, including but not 8 9 limited to colleges and universities, vocational or 10 technical or trade schools or secondary educational 11 institutions, unnecessarily disrupted because of his 12 service in the uniformed services. No undue penalties shall be assessed because of his service in the uniformed 13 14 services. No student shall forfeit, and shall be entitled to reimbursement for, any fees or education expenses if 15 16 such student is ordered into active state service for a 17 period of more than thirty (30) consecutive days or active 18 federal service pursuant to a presidential call or mobilization. 19 20

21 Section 2. W.S. 19-7-101(a) (vi) and 19-9-301(d) and 22 (j) are repealed.
