## A BILL

for

- 1 AN ACT relating to mines and minerals; providing for
- 2 suspension of certificates and temporary permits issued by
- 3 the mining council; specifying complaint requirements and
- 4 authority to dismiss complaints without hearing; and
- 5 providing for an effective date.

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7 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

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9 **Section 1.** W.S. 30-2-311(a) is amended to read:

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- 11 30-2-311. Revocation of certificate after notice and
- 12 hearing; suspension; reexamination; revocation of
- 13 certificate of inspector or deputy; filing of certificate.

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- 15 (a) Any certificate issued by the council or
- 16 temporary permit issued by the inspector may be suspended

or revoked by the council after hearing under W.S. 16-3-101 1 2 through 16-3-115 for violation of this act or rules and regulations promulgated under this act, intoxication while 3 4 in duty status, mental disabilities or neglect of duty. 5 Except as otherwise provided, the council may revoke or suspend a certificate or temporary permit only after a 6 7 hearing in accordance with the Wyoming Administrative Procedure Act. The council may suspend any certificate or 8 temporary permit pending further investigation and hearing, 9 10 for actions that pose a serious threat to the health and safety of miners. The council shall establish by rule a 11 time limit after the alleged date of an incident as 12 13 provided in this subsection within which a complaint shall 14 be filed. All complaints shall be verified and filed in accordance with the rules and regulations promulgated by 15 the council. The council or designated members of the 16 17 council may, after reviewing the complaint and conducting any investigation deemed necessary, determine that the 18 19 grounds alleged do not warrant suspension or revocation and 20 dismiss the complaint without hearing. No person whose 21 certificate has been revoked under this section for less 22 than ninety (90) days shall be examined by the council. No person whose certificate has been revoked under this 23 section shall be reissued a certificate unless the council 24

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1 finds the incapacity, if any, on which the revocation was

2 based has ceased to exist.

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4 Section 2. This act is effective July 1, 2003.
