## A BILL

## for

1	AN ACT relating to elections; modifying requirements for
2	filing campaign reports of receipts and expenditures;
3	modifying enforcement provisions; and providing for an
4	effective date.

6	Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:
7	
8	Section 1. W.S. 22-25-106(a), (b)(i) through (iii),
8 9	Section 1. W.S. 22-25-106(a), (b)(i) through (iii), (c) and (d), 22-25-107(a)(intro), by creating new

1	(a) Except as otherwise provided in <u>subsection (g) of</u>
2	this section, and in addition to other statements required
3	by this subsection:

5	(i) Every candidate shall file a fully itemized
6	statement of receipts at least seven (7) days before any
7	primary, general or special election with information
8	required by this subsection current to any day from the
9	eighth day up to the fourteenth day before the election;
10	
11	(ii) Every candidate, whether successful or not,
12	shall file a fully itemized statement of receipts and
13	expenditures within ten (10) days after any <del>primary,</del>
14	general or special election <mark>; The statement</mark>
15	
16	(iii) Every candidate in any primary election
17	shall file a fully itemized statement of receipts and
18	expenditures within ten (10) days after the primary
19	election;
20	
21	(iv) Statements under this subsection shall set
22	forth the full and complete record of receipts including
23	knowing possession of cash, goods or services and except
24	for statements of receipts required under paragraph (i) of
	2 SF

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1 this subsection, of actual and promised expenditures, 2 including all identifiable expenses as set forth in W.S. 3 22-25-103. The date of each receipt of twenty-five dollars 4 (\$25.00) or more, any expenditure or obligation, the name 5 of the person from whom received or to whom paid and the purpose of each expenditure or obligation shall be listed. 6 All receipts under twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) shall be 7 reported but need not be itemized. Should the accumulation 8 9 of receipts from an individual exceed the twenty-five 10 (\$25.00) threshold, all receipts from that dollar 11 individual shall be itemized. Receipts, expenditures and 12 obligations itemized in a statement filed by a political 13 action committee, a candidate's campaign committee or by a 14 political party central committee need not be itemized in a candidate's statement except by total with a reference to 15 the statement; . The statement 16

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18 (v) Statements under this subsection shall be 19 filed with those officers as provided in W.S. 22-25-107. 20 The statement may be filed by facsimile transmission if the 21 original is postmarked on the day the facsimile is sent. 22

Reports of itemized statements of receipt and 23 (b) 24 statements of receipts and expenditures, and statements of

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1 termination shall be made with the appropriate filing 2 officers specified under W.S. 22-25-107 and in accordance 3 with the following:

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5 (i) Except as otherwise provided in this any political action committee, candidate's 6 section, 7 campaign committee, or any political action committee formed under federal law or the law of another state that 8 9 contributes to a Wyoming political action committee or to a 10 candidate's campaign committee, and any other organization 11 supporting or opposing any ballot proposition which expends 12 any funds in any primary, general or special election shall 13 file an itemized statement of receipts and expenditures at 14 least seven (7) days before the election current to any day from the eighth day up to the fourteenth day before the 15 election and shall also file a statement of receipts and 16 17 expenditures within ten (10) days after the a general or 18 special election;

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(ii) A committee formed after an election to defray campaign expenses incurred during a previous election and any political action or candidate's campaign committee which has previously filed a statement of receipts and expenditures and has not filed a statement of

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1 termination shall file an itemized statement of receipts 2 and expenditures on <del>July 1 and</del> December 31 of each odd-3 numbered year;

5 (iii) All candidates and committees shall 6 continue to make the biannual reports required under this 7 subsection until the committee terminates and the candidate 8 or committee files a statement of termination with the 9 appropriate filing officer. A statement of termination may 10 be filed upon retirement of all debts;

12 (c) All statements required by subsection (b) of this 13 section shall be signed by both the chairman and treasurer. The statements shall set forth the full and complete record 14 of receipts including knowing possession of cash, goods or 15 16 services and except for statements of receipts required 17 under paragraph (i) of this subsection, of actual and promised expenditures. The date of each receipt of twenty-18 19 five dollars (\$25.00) or more, any expenditure or 20 obligation, the name of the person from whom received or to 21 whom paid and the purpose of each expenditure or obligation 22 shall be listed. Nothing in this subsection shall be 23 construed to require the disclosure of the names of 24 individuals paid to circulate an initiative or referendum

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1 petition. All receipts under twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) 2 shall be reported but need not be itemized. Should the accumulation of receipts from an individual exceed the 3 4 twenty-five dollar (\$25.00) threshold, all receipts from 5 that individual shall be itemized. If the receipts, expenditures or obligations were for more than one (1) 6 7 candidate, the amounts attributable to each shall be itemized separately. The statement may be filed by 8 9 facsimile transmission if the original is postmarked on the day the facsimile is sent. 10

12 chairman of each political party central (d) The 13 committee for the state or county, or an officer of the 14 party designated by him, shall file an itemized statement of receipts of twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) or more, and 15 any expenditures and obligations. The itemized statement 16 17 shall be filed. The statement may shall be filed by facsimile transmission within ten (10) days after a general 18 19 or special election. provided an original signed statement 20 is sent by mail on the same day. The statement shall report 21 all receipts, expenditures and obligations relating to 22 campaign expenses, including normal operating expenses. All receipts under twenty-five dollars 23 (\$25.00) shall be 24 reported but need not be itemized. Should the accumulation

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1 of receipts from an individual exceed the twenty-five 2 (\$25.00) threshold, all receipts from that dollar 3 individual shall be itemized. It shall attribute all 4 campaign receipts, expenses and obligations to a specific 5 candidate only if the campaign receipts, expenses and obligations can be specifically identified to that specific 6 7 candidate to the exclusion of other candidates on the ticket. A copy of the statement shall be furnished to each 8 9 candidate identified in the statement within ten (10) days 10 after the general or special election. 11 12 22-25-107. Where statements to be filed. 13 (a) All statements required under W.S. 22-25-101, 14 22-25-102 and 22-25-106 this chapter shall be filed as 15 16 follows: 17 (b) Statements required to be filed at least seven 18 19 (7) days before any primary, general or special election 20 may be filed by facsimile transmission without the original 21 signatures. Statements required to be filed after any 22 primary, general or special election may be filed by

23 facsimile transmission provided that an original with the

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1	required signatures is postmarked within five (5) days of
2	the day the facsimile was sent.

4	(c) Any statement required under this chapter to be
5	filed with:
6	
7	(i) The secretary of state, may be filed
8	electronically as provided under W.S. 9-2-2501 if the
9	secretary of state has adopted rules which allow for the
10	electronic filing;
11	
12	(ii) A county clerk, may be filed electronically
13	if the board of county commissioners has adopted rules
14	consistent with the requirements of W.S. 9-2-2501 which
15	allow for electronic filing.
16	
17	(b)(d) Whenever "county clerk" is used in this
18	chapter, it means the county clerk of the county in which
19	the person resides.

21	22-25-108. Failure of candidate or committee to file
22	statement.
23	

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1 (a) A candidate who fails to file, within the time 2 required, a full and complete itemized statement of 3 receipts and expenditures shall receive a notice by 4 certified mail return receipt requested stating that 5 failure to file the statement within three (3) calendar days of receipt of the notice shall result in a vacancy in 6 7 nomination or a vacancy in office, as the case may be and may be charged with a criminal offense as provided by W.S. 8 9 22-26-112. If he fails to file within three (3) calendar 10 days after receipt of notice, he shall not receive a 11 certificate of nomination, or election, nor shall he enter upon the duties of the office, as the case may be and may 12 13 charged with a misdemeanor as provided by W.S. be 22-26-112. A late filing fee of twenty-five dollars 14 15 (\$25.00) shall accompany all late reports. If conditions 16 are such that timely filing of a report required pursuant 17 to this subsection is not possible, the candidate may appeal the implementation of these provisions to the 18 19 secretary of state or the county clerk as appropriate, or 20 as otherwise provided by law. 21 22 (b) A candidate who fails to file the statement of 23 receipts required by the seventh day before the election 24 shall have his name printed on a list drafted by the

1	appropriate filing office specified under W.S. 22-25-107.
2	The list shall immediately be posted in the filing office
3	and made available to the public. The candidate may be
4	charged with a misdemeanor as provided by W.S. 22-26-112.
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6	<del>(b)<mark>(c)</mark> In addition to any other penalty provided by</del>
7	law, a candidate who fails to file the statement required
8	by subsection (a) of this section within one (1) month of
9	<del>receipt of the notice provided <u>the</u> report due date</del> is
10	ineligible to run as a candidate for any state or local
11	office for which a statement is required by W.S. $22-25-106$
12	until:
13	
14	(i) Five (5) years have elapsed from the date
15	the statement was first due; and
16	
17	(ii) The person has filed the required
18	statement <u>.</u> and has paid the late filing fee assessed under
19	subsection (a) of this section.
20	
21	<del>(c)<mark>(d)</mark> Any political action committee which fails to</del>
22	file a report as required shall be sent notice by the
23	secretary of state, by certified mail return receipt
24	requested or personal service in accordance with rule 4 of

1 the Wyoming Rules of Civil Procedure, stating that failure 2 to file the statement within three (3) calendar days of 3 receipt of the notice may result in the filing of criminal 4 charges against the committee's officers responsible for 5 the filing. A late filing fee of twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) shall accompany all late reports. Any officer of a 6 7 political action committee who is responsible for filing a report and who knowingly and willfully fails to file a 8 9 required or who knowingly and willfully report as 10 subscribes to, makes or causes to be made a false report is 11 guilty of a misdemeanor punishable by a fine of not more 12 than seven hundred fifty dollars (\$750.00) if the amount 13 not reported is ten thousand dollars (\$10,0000.00) or less, 14 or the amount falsely reported is five thousand dollars (\$5,000.00) or less, otherwise the officer is guilty of a 15 felony punishable by imprisonment not to exceed two (2) 16 17 years.

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19 22-25-109. Reporting candidates in violation.

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21 The secretary of state shall report the names of all 22 candidates in violation of the Election Code of the state of Wyoming to the attorney general or to the district 23 24 attorney for appropriate action. The secretary of state

1	shall publish a list of those persons violating W.S.
2	22-25-106, once in a newspaper in general circulation
3	throughout the state.

5	Section 2. This act is effective July 1, 2003.
