A BILL

for

- 1 AN ACT relating to the Wyoming Emergency Management Act;
- 2 transferring oversight and control of the emergency
- 3 management agency; providing for the appointment of a
- 4 homeland security director and an emergency management
- 5 coordinator; transferring the agency's persons, functions,
- 6 programs, authority and funds; requiring a report; and
- 7 providing for an effective date.

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- 7 (a) Because of the possibility of the occurrence of
- disasters of unprecedented size and destructiveness 8
- 9 resulting from enemy attack, sabotage, terrorism, civil
- 10 disorder or other hostile action, or from fire, flood,
- 11 earthquake, other natural causes and other technological
- 12 disasters, and to insure that preparations of Wyoming will
- 13 be adequate to deal with such disasters, and generally to
- 14 provide for the common defense and to protect the public
- peace, health and safety, and to preserve the lives and 15
- 16 property of the people of Wyoming, it is hereby found and
- 17 declared to be necessary:

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- 19 (i) To create a Wyoming emergency management
- 20 agency within the adjutant general's governor's office, and
- 21 to authorize the creation of local emergency management
- 22 programs in the political subdivisions of the state;

19-13-104. Powers of governor generally; state 1 2 homeland security director. 3 The governor has general direction and control of 4 5 the emergency management agency, and is responsible for the carrying out of the provisions of this act, and in the 6 7 event of disaster beyond local control, may assume direct operational control over all or any part of the emergency 8 9 management functions within Wyoming. The governor may 10 delegate such powers to the adjutant general directly, or 11 through the adjutant general to the director established 12 under subsection (d) of this section, or through the 13 director to the coordinator of emergency management to 14 carry out this act. 15 16 (d) The position of the state homeland security 17 director is created in the governor's office and shall be appointed by the governor. He shall be responsible to the 18 19 governor and may be removed by the governor as provided in 20 W.S. 9-1-202. The director shall:

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(i) Supervise the Wyoming emergency management

1 (ii) Provide technical assistance to public 2 safety agencies in the area of homeland security; 3 4 (iii) Coordinate with the federal office of 5 homeland security; and 6 (iv) Perform other duties assigned by the 7 governor for homeland security. 8 9 19-13-105. Emergency management program. 10 11 The emergency management agency within the 12 (a) adjutant general's governor's office is created. The 13 14 adjutant general governor shall employ appoint a coordinator of emergency management who shall be a 15 civilian and the administrator thereof, and may appoint 16 17 such assistants as may be necessary. The coordinator and his assistants shall be compensated in an amount to be 18 determined and fixed by the Wyoming human resources 19 20 division. The coordinator shall serve at the pleasure of

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the governor and may be removed as provided in W.S.

1	(b) The coordinator, with the approval of the
2	adjutant general director, may employ technical, clerical,
3	stenographic and other personnel and make such expenditures
4	within the appropriations or from other funds made
5	available to him for purposes of emergency management as
6	necessary to carry out this act. He shall be provided with
7	necessary and appropriate office space, furniture,
8	equipment, stationery and printing in the same manner as
9	for personnel of other state agencies.
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11	(c) The coordinator <u>director</u> is the administrative
12	head of the Wyoming emergency management agency and:
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14	(i) Shall be responsible to the adjutant general
15	governor for the implementation of the state program for
16	emergency management for Wyoming;
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18	(v) Shall have additional authority, duties and
19	responsibilities authorized by this act as may be
20	prescribed by the adjutant general governor; and
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22	19-13-106. Emergency management advisory board.

1 The emergency management advisory board is created, 2 consisting of such members as deemed necessary, who shall 3 be appointed by the governor and may be removed by the 4 governor as provided in W.S. 9-1-202. The membership of the 5 board shall contain representative citizens of commercial enterprises, service organizations and public-spirited 6 groups. The board shall assist in specific fields related 7 to emergency management preparedness and recovery and 8 9 advise the governor, the adjutant general and 10 coordinator director on all matters pertaining to emergency 11 The members thereof shall serve without management. 12 compensation but may be reimbursed for the reasonable and 13 necessary expenses incurred in the performance of their 14 duties.

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16 19-13-111. Funds, supplies and equipment; authority
17 to make use of existing facilities.

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In carrying out the provisions of this act, the governor, the adjutant general and the executive officers or governing bodies of the political subdivisions of the state are directed to utilize the services, equipment, supplies and facilities of existing departments, offices and agencies of the state and of the political subdivisions

- 1 thereof to the maximum extent practicable, and the officers
- 2 and personnel of all departments, offices and agencies are
- 3 directed to cooperate with and extend such services and
- 4 facilities to the governor, to the coordinator and to the
- 5 emergency management programs throughout the state upon
- 6 request.

- 8 **Section 2.** W.S. 19-7-102 (a) (iv), 19-7-104 (c) and
- 19-7-105(a)(iv) are repealed. 9

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- Section 3. Except as otherwise specified, the 11
- 12 legislature hereby transfers all functions, programs and
- 13 authority of the Wyoming emergency management agency to the
- governor's office. All personnel of the Wyoming emergency 14
- management agency except the coordinator shall 15
- 16 transferred to the governor's office. The adiutant
- 17 general's position shall not be affected by this section.
- Nothing in this act shall be deemed to affect the property 18
- 19 interests of current permanent employees within
- 20 emergency management agency except for the coordinator who
- 21 shall be appointed by and subject to removal by the
- 22 governor.

Section 4. This act is intended simply to transfer 1 2 the control of the Wyoming emergency management agency from 3 the adjutant general to the governor's office. The Wyoming 4 legislature intends to make no substantive change to prior 5 law including, but not limited to revenue, either increases or decreases, powers, duties, authorities, obligations, 6 definitions, administration, confidentiality, imposition, 7 tax rates, exemptions, licenses, permits, compliance, 8 9 collection procedures, enforcement, remedies, statutes of limitation or distribution of taxes. This act is not 10 11 intended to affect the validity of any rule or regulation

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14 Section 5. On or before July 1, 2005, the homeland security director appointed under section 1 of this act 15 shall report to the joint transportation and highways 16 interim committee on the efficacy of the transfer of the 17 Wyoming emergency management agency pursuant to this act. 18
