A BILL

for

AN ACT relating to school finance; establishing a cost-1 2 based adjustment to the education resource block grant 3 model for vocational education; providing for grants to 4 districts to assist with initiating and expanding vocational education programs; defining terms; 5 imposing 6 funding conditions and criteria; delegating rulemaking authority to and imposing specified duties upon the state 7 department of education and the school audit section of the 8 9 department of audit; imposing reporting requirements upon 10 school districts; providing for recognition of program delivery; providing for data collection of post-secondary 11 12 education program data; providing appropriations and 13 authorizing position; and providing for effective dates.

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15 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming: 16

Section 1. W.S. 21-12-105 and 21-13-329 are created 1 2 to read: 3 4 21-12-105. Career-vocational education program 5 grants; application; criteria; limitations; expiration. 6 (a) A school district may apply to the 7 state department of education for state assistance to fund 8 9 expenses associated with the planning, development and 10 implementation of a new or the expansion of an existing 11 career-vocational education program within any high school 12 in the district. As used in this section, "career-13 vocational education program" shall be as defined by W.S. 14 21-13-329(a)(i). Amounts awarded under this section shall

be used to fund curricular development and program design 15 costs, employ certified teachers to provide course 16 17 instruction during the introductory year and to fund initial purchases of equipment and supplies necessary for 18 program delivery. Any amount awarded to a district under 19 this section shall be in addition to and not be considered 20 21 in determining the vocational education adjustment to the 22 education resource block grant model under W.S. 21-13-329. No grant awarded under this section shall exceed fifty 23 thousand dollars (\$50,000.00) for the expansion of any 24

1 existing program nor more than one hundred thousand dollars 2 (\$100,000.00) for the implementation of any new program, 3 and no one (1) district is eligible for a grant within two 4 (2) years after receiving a grant award under this section. 5 In addition, preference for grants awarded under this section shall be given to those school districts which have 6 7 applied for and used other grants for vocational education. 8 9 (b) Application for a grant under this section shall 10 be on a form and in a manner specified by rule and regulation of the department, shall be filed with the 11 12 department on or before June 30 to secure a grant during 13 the immediately succeeding school year, and shall at minimum include: 14 15 16 (i) A proposal documenting the need for 17 introducing the proposed career-vocational education 18 program; 19 20 (ii) Labor market information detailing the need 21 for instruction in the proposed program; 22 23 (iii) The purposes and plan for expenditure of

24 grant amounts;

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2 (iv) An outline of the course curriculum for the3 proposed program; and

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5 (v) Other necessary information required by the 6 state department.

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(c) Not later than August 15 of the applicable school 8 9 year and following review of applications submitted under 10 section, the department shall notify applicant this 11 districts of its decision and shall provide each applicant 12 district a written statement of reasons for approving or denying the application. In determining and establishing 13 an amount for any grant award to an applicant district 14 under this section, the department shall consider funds 15 available to the district from the termination of any 16 17 career-vocational education program by the district prior to the application filing date. If the application is 18 approved, the department shall award the grant from amounts 19 20 made available by legislative appropriation within the 21 school foundation program account for purposes of this 22 section.

Vocational education; qualification and funding eligibility; adjustment 14 limitations on to 15 foundation program formula. 16 17 (a) As used in this section: 18 19 (i) "Career-vocational education program" means 20 a program offered in grades nine (9) through twelve (12) 21 consisting of a sequence of three (3) or more vocational 22 courses in an occupational area or career cluster that provides the student with the technical knowledge, skills 23 or proficiencies necessary to obtain employment in current 24

1 or emerging occupations or to pursue advanced skill
2 training;

4 (ii) "Vocational course" means instruction in 5 career-vocational education programs offered in grades nine (9) through twelve (12) by districts pursuant to W.S. 6 21-9-101(b)(i)(J) that is aligned with state content and 7 performance standards prescribed by the state board of 8 9 education under W.S. 21-2-304(a)(iii), and is provided by a 10 teacher certified by the Wyoming professional teaching 11 standards board for the vocational subject area associated 12 with the course;

13

14 (iii) "Vocational education student" means a 15 student enrolled in grade nine (9), ten (10), eleven (11) 16 or twelve (12) and participating in career-vocational 17 education programs on a full-time equivalency (FTE) basis, 18 as computed in accordance with guidelines established by 19 the state department of education;

20

(iv) "Vocational education teacher" means a teacher certified by the Wyoming professional teaching standards board to provide instruction at the high school level for vocational education courses comprising career-

1 vocational education programs and is employed by a Wyoming 2 school district for high school career-vocational education 3 program instruction on a full-time equivalency basis (FTE) 4 as computed in accordance with guidelines prescribed by the 5 department of education. Nothing in this paragraph shall require a district to employ teachers certified for high 6 7 school vocational education instruction on a full-time basis or to require teachers to teach only high school 8 9 vocational education courses on a full-time basis.

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11 (b) The adjustment for vocational education pursuant 12 to W.S. 21-13-309(n)(xii) shall be computed as prescribed 13 by this section.

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(c) The prototypical school model amount for grades 15 16 nine (9) through twelve (12) computed under W.S. 17 21-13-309(m)(ii)(C) shall be reduced for each district by the following amounts: 18

20 (i) The vocational education amount within the 21 teacher salaries and benefits component, as recalibrated 22 for the 2001-2002 school year; and

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(ii) The vocational education amount within the 1 equipment and supplies component, as recalibrated for the 2 3 2001-2002 school year.

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5 (d) An amount shall be computed for each high school within each school district in accordance with the 6 7 following:

9 (i) Any high school in the school district that is located within a five (5) mile radius of another high 10 11 school in that district shall for purposes of computations under this subsection, be combined and considered as one 12 13 (1) high school;

14

15 (ii) A weight factor of one and twenty-nine 16 hundredths (1.29) shall be multiplied by each full-time 17 equivalent (FTE) vocational education student for that school for the immediately preceding school year, 18 as computed in accordance with guidelines prescribed by the 19 20 department;

21

22 (iii) The amount computed under paragraph (ii) of this subsection shall be multiplied by the vocational 23 education amount contained within the teacher salaries and 24

benefits component of the prototypical school model for 1 2 grades nine (9) through twelve (12), as specified under 3 W.S. 21-13-309(m)(ii)(C), as recalibrated for the 2001-2002 4 school year, subject to reallocation limitations imposed by 5 the education resource block grant model for school year 2001-2002; 6

7

(iv) In addition to the amount computed under 8 9 paragraph (iii) of this subsection for a school, the number of full-time equivalent (FTE) vocational education teachers 10 11 computed for that school for the immediately preceding 12 school year, as computed pursuant to guidelines prescribed 13 by the department, shall be multiplied by the vocational education amount contained within the equipment 14 and supplies component of the prototypical school model for 15 grades nine (9) through twelve (12), as prescribed by W.S. 16 17 21-13-309(m)(ii)(C), as recalibrated for the 2001-2002 school year; 18

20 In addition to the amount computed under (V) 21 paragraph (iv) of this subsection for vocational education 22 equipment and supplies, an amount shall be computed for 23 that school for vocation education equipment replacement and enhancement by multiplying the number of full-time 24

equivalent (FTE) teachers computed for that school for the 1 2 preceding school year under guidelines prescribed by the 3 department, by an amount within the education resource 4 block grant model which is based upon an adjustment factor 5 for vocational education equipment replacement and 6 enhancement;

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(vi) Notwithstanding paragraphs (iii) and (iv) 8 9 of this subsection, the one and twenty-nine hundredths 10 (1.29) weight factor specified under paragraph (ii) of this 11 subsection and the number computed for full-time equivalent 12 (FTE) vocational education teachers under paragraph (iv) of 13 this subsection for any school shall be increased to the 14 level specified by the education resource block grant model to fund the additional costs necessary to provide a minimum 15 16 program quality standard of two (2) career-vocational education programs within that school. The minimum program 17 quality standard of two (2) shall be applied to each school 18 to the extent prior student participation rates in career-19 20 vocational education programs and vocational education 21 equipment and supply amounts provided that school support 22 the two (2) program minimum standard.

The amount computed for each high school within 1 (e) 2 district for the vocational education each school 3 adjustment under paragraphs (d)(iii) and (iv) or (vi) of 4 this section, as applicable, and the amount computed under 5 paragraph (d) (v) of this section, shall be added for that district and divided by the district's total average daily 6 7 membership (ADM) for the applicable school year as computed under W.S. 21-13-309(q). 8

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10 (f) Upon written application filed by a school 11 district, the department of education may exempt а 12 vocational course from the certified teacher requirements 13 imposed under paragraph (a)(i) of this section, or a 14 career-vocational education program from the sequential course or cluster course requirements imposed 15 under paragraph (a) (ii) of this section, if the district verifies 16 17 the alignment of the proposed course or program with the state content and performance standards for career-18 19 vocational education programs, documents the additional 20 costs associated with the proposed course or program 21 including class size and specialized equipment needs and if 22 applicable, clearly states the experiences and education of the noncertified teacher that would otherwise qualify the 23 24 teacher to instruct the proposed course. Application shall

be in a manner and form and subject to a schedule 1 2 established by rule and regulation of the department. An 3 exemption granted under this subsection shall allow 4 students participating in the course or program to be 5 included in the full-time equivalency (FTE) computations under this section. 6

12	(a) The state department of education shall provide
13	recognition of best practices for delivering quality
14	vocational education programs in the state. This
15	recognition shall be for programs offered during school
16	year 2003-2004, shall recognize career awareness and
17	development activities commencing with grade eight (8) and
18	shall recognize programs providing for and encouraging
19	district cooperative efforts in delivering vocational
20	education programs and opportunities.

state department of education, with the 6 (a) The assistance of the school finance section of the department 7 of audit, shall review the data used in establishing the 8 9 components of the vocational education adjustment provided 10 by this act and ensure that the data accurately reflects 11 career-vocational education program requirements, student participation levels and other criteria imposed under this 12 13 act for the proper implementation of the adjustment.

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(b) On or before November 1, 2003, and based upon the 15 16 review undertaken pursuant to subsection (a) of this 17 section, the state department of education shall report to the joint education interim committee on findings regarding 18 the accuracy of the vocational education data used in 19 20 developing the vocational education adjustment, and present 21 any recommended modifications to the adjustment based upon 22 its review of the data.

2 The Wyoming community college commission shall (a) 3 compile information on vocational education programs 4 provided in Wyoming community colleges, including community 5 college programs open to enrollment by high school students, and shall compile information on vocational 6 7 education programs provided by boards of cooperative educational services. Information collected under this 8 9 section shall include student participation data, program 10 content and program expenditure information.

12 (b) The community college commission, with the 13 assistance of the state department of education, shall 14 develop and conduct information collection efforts under 15 subsection (a) of this section in such a manner that 16 information relates to and may be used in conjunction with 17 information collected and compiled pursuant to 2002 Wyoming 18 Session Laws, Chapter 76, Section 4.

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20 (c) On or before November 1, 2003, results of this 21 effort shall be summarized and reported to the joint 22 education interim committee and the joint appropriations 23 interim committee.

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1 (d) Boards of cooperative educational services shall 2 assist the community college commission with data 3 collection efforts required under subsection (a) of this 4 section.

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8 (a) Two hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$250,000.00) 9 is appropriated from within the public school foundation 10 program account for distribution by the state department of 11 education to school districts as career-vocational 12 education grants authorized under W.S. 21-12-105 as created 13 under section 1 of this act.

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15 (b) Seventy-nine thousand three hundred fifty-two 16 dollars (\$79,352.00) is appropriated from the general fund 17 to the state superintendent of public instruction for one 18 (1)full-time permanent position for purposes of 19 implementing the career-vocational education grant program 20 established under this act. On or before July 1, 2004, the 21 state superintendent shall report to the joint education 22 interim committee and the joint appropriations committee on the expenditure of funds appropriated under this section, 23 24 the position filled and the status of this position. The

17	upon completion of all acts necessary for a bill to become
18	law as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of the Wyoming
19	Constitution.
