Aeronautics commission-amendments.

A BILL

for

1	AN ACT relating to the aeronautics commission; removing
2	limitations on loans and grants; increasing the size of the
3	commission as specified; requiring the commission to meet
4	as specified; specifying that joint powers boards may
5	participate in the grant-in-aid program; establishing and
6	modifying duties of the commission as specified; requiring
7	a report; amending the authority of the department of
8	transportation to provide air transportation to state
9	agencies as specified; providing term limit for
10	commissioners; authorizing position and appropriation;
11	repealing a duty of the commission; and providing for an
12	effective date.

14 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

15

Section 1. W.S. 10-3-101(a) and by creating a new 16 17 subsection (h), 10-3-201(b), (c)(intro), (ii) and by

- 1 creating new subsections (d) through (h), 10-3-202,
- 2 10-3-401(a) and by creating a new subsection (d), 10-3-402
- 3 and 10-3-403 (a) are amended to read:

- 5 10-3-101. Creation; composition; appointment; term;
- 6 removal; qualifications; vacancies; compensation; office;
- 7 acceptance of grants.

8

- 9 (a) The commission is created to consist of $\frac{1}{2}$
- 10 eight (8) commissioners. Seven (7) commissioners shall be
- 11 appointed by the governor, by and with the consent of the
- 12 senate, each to serve for a term of six (6) years not to
- 13 exceed two (2) terms. Two (2) commissioners shall be
- 14 appointed at-large for a term of six (6) years. The
- 15 director of the department shall serve as an ex officio and
- 16 eighth member of the commission but shall not vote on
- 17 matters before the commission. The governor may remove any
- 18 appointed commissioner as provided in W.S. 9-1-202.

- 20 (h) The commission shall meet as necessary to
- 21 properly exercise its functions, but shall meet not less
- 22 than quarterly to consider the distribution of grants and
- 23 loans under W.S. 10-3-401 and 10-3-403.

10-3-201. Powers and duties generally. 1

2

3	(b) <u>In lieu of the requirements of this subsection</u> ,
4	any airport sponsor may directly apply for, receive or
5	disburse federal airport funds, and may also direct all
6	construction and maintenance of the airport. The
7	aeronautics commission may designate the airports to be
8	built and maintained with the assistance of state or
9	federal funds and is the sole authority to determine the
10	disbursement of funds for the state's airports. The
11	aeronautics commission through the department shall be the
12	authority in the state to apply for, or directly accept,
13	receive, receipt for or disburse any funds granted by the
14	United States government for airport construction or
15	maintenance. A county, city, town or other political
16	subdivision joint powers board may enter into an agreement
17	with the division describing the terms and conditions of
18	the agency in accordance with federal laws, rules and
19	regulations and applicable laws of this state. The division
20	may enforce the proper maintenance of these airports by the
21	counties, cities and towns or joint powers boards as agreed
22	in the contracts existing between the sponsors of the
23	airports and the federal government. All construction and

1 maintenance of these airports shall be under the direction

2 of the department.

3

4 (c) The department may offer engineering or other

5 technical advice to any municipality, county, joint powers

board or other qualified party in connection with the 6

7 construction, maintenance or operation of airports. The

commission shall encourage: 8

9

10 (ii) Interest in private flying and privately-

11 owned planes; and

12

13 (d) The commission shall establish policies as may be

14 appropriate for the division to implement the decisions of

the commission and the aeronautical purposes of this title 15

and for the exercise of duties of the division. 16

17

18 (e) The commission shall assist communities in

19 coordinating efforts, facilitating, recruiting and

20 attracting and promoting the development, improvement and

21 retention of commercial air service in the state. The

22 assistance may include studying airline and aircraft

profitability, route analysis, air fare monitoring and 23

1 recommendations for legislative changes to enhance air

2 services in the state.

3

4 (f) There is created a new position in the office of

5 the governor that shall coordinate with the commission to

6 market and advocate airline service in Wyoming pursuant to

7 subsection (e) of this section. The person appointed by

the governor may be an at-will employee or an at-will 8

9 contract employee and may be removed by the governor as

provided in W.S. 9-1-202. 10

11

(g) The commission may promulgate reasonable rules, 12

13 regulations and procedures and establish standards as

14 necessary to carry out the functions of the division.

15

(h) No later than September 1, 2006, the commission 16

17 shall submit a report to the joint transportation and

highways interim committee detailing the duties performed 18

19 by the division and commission, including recommendations

20 regarding the structure and functions of the division and

21 commission, and whether the division should continue their

22 duties within the department or operate as a separate

23 operating agency. In addition, the commission shall report

- 1 on the efficacy of the position in the governor's office to
- 2 market and advocate airline service in Wyoming.

3

- 4 10-3-202. Authority to provide air transportation to
- 5 departments and agencies of state.

6

- 7 The department may division may provide air transportation
- 8 to departments and agencies of state government directly,
- 9 but may contract for such services under fractional
- 10 ownership agreements or otherwise under conditions which
- are considered by the department or agency head to be 11
- urgent and to justify such air transportation and when 12
- 13 justified within the limits of W.S. 9-4-204(p)
- 14 9-4-205(e).

15

- 16 10-3-401. Grants-in-aid for airport construction and
- 17 improvement and air service promotion; authority to make;
- 18 limitation.

- 20 The commission may make grants-in-aid from state
- 21 funds for construction and development of airports to
- 22 counties, cities, and towns and joint powers boards within
- the state. No grant-in-aid for planning, construction or 23
- 24 improvement of any airport shall be made unless the airport

1 is owned, leased or held under a state or federal special

2 use permit or agreement, exclusively or jointly, by the

3 county, city, or town or joint powers board to which the

4 grant is made. Each grant shall be limited to five hundred

5 thousand dollars (\$500,000.00). Grants may be spent for

6 runways, terminals, hangars and other improvements and for

7 planning any such improvements to the airport. The

commission may designate state funds for purposes 8 of

9 creating, amending and updating any system plan of an

10 airport for the state.

11

12 (d) In administering the grant program, and in

13 consultation with the Federal Aviation Administration and

14 local airport sponsors, the commission shall establish,

15 amend and have available, at least one hundred twenty (120)

16 days before each biennial legislative budget session, a

17 five (5) year capital improvement plan for airports in the

18 state and a system for prioritizing projects to be funded

19 by state and federal grants.

20

21 10-3-402. Grants-in-aid for airport construction and

22 improvement; expenditures by county, city or town.

No Expenditure of state funds shall be made under W.S. 1

10-3-401 unless the county, city or town expends at least 2

3 fifty percent (50%) of the local-state share of any project

4 for which the grant-in-aid is made. However, the commission

5 may grant in excess of fifty percent (50%) of the local-

state share of a project if the commission determines that 6

7 the applicant is utilizing all other local revenue sources

8 reasonably and legally available to finance a project the

9 discretion of the commission.

10

10-3-403. Loans for airport construction 11

12 improvement and air service promotion; authority to make;

13 security; rulemaking authority; limitation.

14

15 (a) The commission may make loans to counties, cities

16 and towns and joint powers boards within the state for

17 construction, development and improvement of airport

facilities generating user fees. The loans shall be from 18

the permanent mineral trust fund and shall not exceed the 19

20 aggregate of two million dollars (\$2,000,000.00) four

21 million dollars (\$4,000,000.00), not including all loans

22 made under this subsection prior to July 1, 1999 2003 and

23 still outstanding on that date. No single loan shall exceed

24 five hundred thousand dollars (\$500,000.00). 1

2 **Section 2.** W.S. 10-3-201(c)(iv) is repealed.

3

4 Section 3. There is appropriated seventy-six thousand

5 dollars (\$76,000.00), or as much thereof as is necessary,

from the general fund to the governor's office for the 6

7 fiscal year beginning July 1, 2003, for one (1) full-time

equivalent position for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 8

9 2003, to implement the purposes of this act, provided this

position shall coordinate with the commission. 10

12 Section 4. This act is effective July 1, 2003.
