- 15 (a) Any qualified person may purchase a fishing
- 16 license from the department or its authorized selling

agents. Purchase of a license entitles the licensee to take

2 any fish of Wyoming at the time, in a place, in a manner 3 and in an amount as provided by law and the orders of the 4 commission. At the time of application for a resident 5 license under this section, the applicant shall provide a valid Wyoming driver's license or a copy thereof, or other 6 7 residency. The commission shall promulgate proof of reasonable rules and regulations stating what proof of 8 9 residency is required so that only bona fide Wyoming 10 residents, as defined in W.S. 23-1-102(a)(ix), receive 11 resident licenses. For purposes of purchasing a lifetime 12 resident license under subsection (d) of this section and 13 except for the resident disabled veteran's lifetime license 14 issued under subsection (f) of this section, an applicant
