- 14 school age children residing in the district who possess
- 15 any of the disabilities covered under this article shall,
- 16 subject to the rules and regulations of the state

superintendent, provide for the appropriate diagnosis, 1 2 evaluation, education or training and necessary related 3 services and may include, but is not limited to room and 4 board, for those children. If the school district is unable 5 to provide the necessary and appropriate programs and services, it shall contract with another school district or 6 7 agency to obtain them. If the programs and services cannot reasonably be provided by the district or by interdistrict 8 9 contracts, the state superintendent shall assist local 10 boards of trustees in arranging for the appropriate 11 educational programs and services either within or without 12 the state pursuant to its rules and regulations and 13 financed as provided by law. 14 15 (b) Notwithstanding W.S. 21-2-501 and subsection (a) 16 of this section, any child with a mental, physical or 17 psychological disability receiving programs and services
