A BILL

for

- 1 AN ACT relating to the Wyoming retirement system;
- 2 authorizing investigators employed by the board of
- 3 outfitters to participate in the law enforcement retirement
- 4 system; amending a definition; conditioning implementation
- 5 upon receipt of required payments and transfer of covered
- 6 employees as specified; providing for funding; and
- 7 providing for an effective date.

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14 **9-3-402**. **Definitions**.

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16 (a) As used in this article:

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2 (xviii) "Law enforcement officer" or "officer" 3 means any member who is a county sheriff, deputy county 4 sheriff, municipal police officer, duly authorized 5 investigator of the Wyoming livestock board meeting the specifications of W.S. 7-2-101(a)(iv)(E), investigator 6 7 employed by the Wyoming state board of outfitters and professional guides meeting the specifications of W.S. 8 9 7-2-101(a)(iv)(J), Wyoming correctional officer, Wyoming law enforcement academy instructor, University of Wyoming 10 11 campus police officer, detention officer or dispatcher for 12 law enforcement agencies;

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(j) Notwithstanding W.S. 9-3-421, any surviving 18 spouse of an officer who dies in the scope of employment 19 20 shall receive a monthly payment equal to sixty-two and one-21 half percent (62.5%) of the officer's salary at the time of 22 death, plus six percent (6%) of that salary for each child under age eighteen (18), not to exceed one hundred percent 23 (100%) of the officer's salary. 2 receive a monthly payment equal to fifty percent (50%) of

3 the officer's salary at the time of death, plus six percent

subsection, any surviving spouse of any officer who retired 7

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Section 2.

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17 (a) Coverage of investigators employed by the Wyoming state board of outfitters and professional guides under 18 W.S. 9-3-432 as provided by section 1 of this act shall not 19 20 be implemented by the Wyoming retirement board until funds 21 payable to the Wyoming retirement system are received for 22 deposit into the retirement account, as necessary for maintaining the actuarial integrity of the account and 23

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funding all liability arising under this act, for years of

1 service prior to the date of entry or expansion of

2 coverage.

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- 4 (b) In addition to subsection (a) of this section,
- 5 W.S. 9-3-432, with respect to investigators employed by the
- 6 Wyoming state board of outfitters and professional guides,
- 7 shall not be implemented by the Wyoming retirement board
- 8 until funds necessary for maintaining the actuarial
- 9 integrity of the account and funding any liability arising
- 10 under this act, are deposited into the Wyoming retirement
- 11 account by the Wyoming state board of outfitters and
- 12 professional guides, and contributions required under W.S.
- 13 9-3-432(a) and (b) are paid to the Wyoming retirement
- 14 system for deposit into the retirement account for at least
- 15 two (2) months of covered service following the date of
- 16 entry of coverage, as applicable.

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18 Section 3. This act is effective July 1, 2003.
