FIFTY-SEVENTH LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WYOMING 2003 GENERAL SESSION

A JOINT RESOLUTION requesting Congress to equalize the tax treatment of employer-provided and individually purchased health insurance by creating a tax credit for the full amount of insurance purchased by individuals.

WHEREAS, the high cost of health insurance has created a large number of uninsured citizens in the United States and the State of Wyoming;

WHEREAS, those without health insurance are less likely to receive adequate health care;

WHEREAS, insurance purchasing decisions are to a large extent made by employers and not insurance beneficiaries;

WHEREAS, overreliance on employer-provided health insurance impedes worker mobility;

WHEREAS, spiraling health care costs are in part caused by a lack of active consumer participation in health care markets;

WHEREAS, employers can deduct the full cost of employee health insurance as a business expense, while individuals may not.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MEMBERS OF THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WYOMING:

Section 1. That the Wyoming State Legislature petitions the Congress of the United States to equalize the tax treatment of employer-provided and individually purchased health insurance by creating a tax credit for the full amount of insurance purchased by individuals.
