ACT relating to peace officers; amending the 1 AN 2 extraterritorial authority of peace officers as specified; providing for immunity; apportioning compensation and costs 3 4 as specified; conforming provisions; and providing for an effective date. 5 6 7 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming: 8 Section 1. W.S. 7-2-108 is created to read: 9 10 11 7-2-108. Municipal peace officers; jurisdiction. 12 (a) Any peace officer employed by a municipal police 13 force and qualified pursuant to W.S. 9-1-701 through 14 9-1-707 may exercise his authority as peace officer: 15

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2 (i) Anywhere within the corporate limits of the3 municipality in which the officer is employed;

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5 (ii) Outside the corporate limits of the 6 municipality in which the officer is employed when on 7 property owned by or under the control of the municipality; 8 and

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10 (iii) Outside the corporate limits of the 11 municipality in which the peace officer is employed, when 12 in fresh pursuit of an individual. For purposes of this 13 paragraph, "fresh pursuit" means pursuit without 14 unnecessary delay of a person whom the officer has probable cause to believe has committed a violation of a municipal 15 ordinance or state law within the officer's jurisdiction or 16 17 for whom an arrest warrant is outstanding for any criminal or traffic offense. 18

Requests for assignment of peace officers; 14 extraterritorial authority of peace officers; liability; 15 compensation. 16 17 (a) The chief of police of any municipality or his designee, or the sheriff of any county or his designee, 18 subject to in accordance with the rules and procedures 19 20 established by the governing body of any municipality or 21 county, may request the chief of police of any other 22 municipality, or his designee, or the sheriff of any other county, or his designee, to assign certified peace officers 23 24 under their respective command to perform temporary law

enforcement duties relating to a specific incident within 1 2 the jurisdiction of the requesting chief of police or 3 sheriff. and under the direction and control of the 4 requesting chief or sheriff. Peace officers, while so 5 assigned and performing duties, are subject to the direction and control of the requesting chief or sheriff 6 7 and shall have full peace officer's officer authority within the requesting agency's jurisdiction during the 8 9 temporary assignment.

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9-1-633. Wyoming law enforcement academy; director; 11 12 appointment; term; qualifications; employees; salaries; 13 curriculum and training programs; fees; disposition.

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(b) The director may employ assistants, instructors 15 16 and other personnel as approved by the attorney general 17 with the consent of the governor. The attorney general may appoint the director as a peace officer, if qualified 18 pursuant to W.S. 9-1-701 through 9-1-707. The director may 19 20 appoint full-time staff instructors who qualify pursuant to 21 W.S. 9-1-701 through 9-1-707 to perform as peace officers. 22 Persons appointed as peace officers pursuant to this subsection shall be considered peace officers only: 23

Qualifications, appointment, duties and salary of undersheriff; deputies, clerks, stenographers and 11 assistants; appointment of deputies for special acts; 12 appointment of deputies by county commissioners. 13 14 (f) Each county sheriff may also appoint as deputies 15 16 any other peace officers as defined in W.S. 17 7-2-101(a)(iv)(A) through (G) and (N) for the purpose of countywide law enforcement. Before becoming effective, an 18 19 appointment under this section shall be approved by the 20 officer's employing agency. Appointments under this section 21 are not required to be filed or revoked as in the case of 22 regular deputies.

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1	(g) A Wyoming peace officer acting pursuant to an
2	appointment under subsection (f) of this section shall be
3	deemed to be acting within the scope of his duties for
4	purposes of the Wyoming Governmental Claims Act and the
5	state self-insurance program, W.S. 1-41-101 through
6	1-41-111 or the local government self-insurance program,
7	W.S. 1-42-101 through 1-42-207. All privileges and
8	immunities from liability, and all pension, disability,
9	workers' compensation and other benefits which normally
10	apply to peace officers while they perform their duties
11	within their own jurisdiction shall also apply to them when
12	acting as provided in subsection (f) of this section. For
13	purposes of W.S. 27-14-104, the requesting law enforcement
14	agency and the law enforcement agency employing the
15	designated peace officer shall be a joint employer as
16	defined under W.S. 27-14-102(a)(xix) and the designated
17	peace officer shall be a joint employee as defined in W.S.
18	27-14-102(a)(xxi). The cost of salary and benefits
19	accruing to a peace officer, while performing duties
20	pursuant to an appointment under subsection (f) of this
21	section, shall be borne by the peace officer's own
22	employing agency. The cost of any damage to equipment
23	belonging to the officer or his employer occurring while

1	acting under the provisions of subsection (f) of this
2	section shall be borne by the county sheriff.
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4	Section 3. This act is effective immediately upon
5	completion of all acts necessary for a bill to become law
6	as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of the Wyoming
7	Constitution.
