AN ACT relating to commercial driver's licenses; amending requirements for commercial driver's licenses as specified to comply with federal requirements; establishing a new classification for commercial driver's licenses; specifying

5 grounds for disqualification or cancellation of a

6 commercial driver's license; providing penalties; amending

7 definitions; and providing for an effective date.

18	conviction in another state or in federal court.
19 20	The division shall suspend or revoke the license of any
21	resident of this state or the privilege of a nonresident to
22	drive a motor vehicle in this state upon receiving notice
23	of the conviction of the person in another state or in a
24	federal court of an offense which, if committed in this

1 state, would be grounds for the suspension, or revocation 2 or disqualification of the license of a driver under W.S. 3 6-2-106, 31-5-233, 31-7-127, 31-7-128, or 31-7-134 or 31-7-4 305 or upon receiving notice of a violation of a statute 5 which, if committed in this state, would be grounds for suspension under the Motor Vehicle Safety-Responsibility 6 7 Act [$\S\S$ 31-9-101 through 31-9-414]. The division may suspend the license of any resident of the state or the 8 9 privilege of a nonresident to drive a motor vehicle in this 10 state upon receiving notice of the conviction of the person 11 in another state or federal court of an offense which, if 12 committed in this state, would be grounds for the 13 suspension of the license of a driver under W.S. 31-7-129.

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16 31-7-303. Exemptions.

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Notwithstanding any other provision of this act, 18 19 the department shall by rule and regulation grant an 20 exemption from compliance with the licensing requirements 21 of this act article or with any rule or regulation adopted 22 pursuant to the licensing requirements of this act article 23 to a class of persons or class of commercial motor vehicles 24 exempted by the secretary of the United States department

of transportation pursuant to title 49 U.S.C. \$ 10526 of the United States Code including:

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6 (a) Commercial driver's licenses may be issued with

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10 (a) Any person is disqualified from driving a commercial motor vehicle for a period of not less than one 11 (1) year if convicted of a first violation arising from 12

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(i) Driving or in actual physical control of a commercial motor vehicle under the influence of alcohol or a controlled substance to a degree which renders him incapable of safely driving a motor vehicle;

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20 (iii) Knowingly and willfully leaving the scene 21 of an accident involving a commercial motor vehicle driven 22 by the person;

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1 (iv) Using a commercial motor vehicle in the 2 commission of any felony; or 3 4 (v) Refusal to submit to a test to determine the 5 driver's alcohol concentration while driving or in actual physical control of a commercial motor vehicle; ... or 6 7 (vi) Driving a commercial vehicle when, as a 8 9 result of prior convictions, the driver's driving 10 privileges are canceled, suspended or revoked, or the driver is disqualified from operating a commercial motor 11 12 vehicle; or 13 14 (vii) Causing a fatality through the negligent operation of a commercial vehicle, including but not 15 16 limited to homicide by motor vehicle, negligent homicide, 17 motor vehicle manslaughter or a similar local ordinance or 18 similar state law from another jurisdiction. 19 20 (e) A person may be disqualified from driving a 21 commercial motor vehicle for life who uses a commercial 22 motor vehicle in the commission of any felony involving the

manufacture, distribution or dispensing of a controlled

1 substance, or possession with intent to manufacture,

2 distribute or dispense a controlled substance.

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4 (f) A person may be disqualified from driving a 5 commercial motor vehicle for a period of not less than sixty (60) days if convicted of two (2) serious traffic 6 7 violations or one hundred twenty (120) days if convicted of three (3) serious traffic violations, committed in a 8 9 commercial motor vehicle arising from separate incidents 10 occurring within a three (3) year period.

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12 (h) For offenses specified in this subsection 13 relating to a railroad-highway crossing, a person who 14 holds, or is required to have, a commercial driver's 15 license is disqualified from driving a commercial motor vehicle for a period of sixty (60) days if convicted of a 16 17 first offense, for a period of one hundred twenty (120) 18 days if convicted of second offense under this subsection 19 in a separate incident within a three (3) year period, or 20 for a period of one (1) year for a third or subsequent 21 conviction under this subsection within a three (3) year 22 period for driving a commercial motor vehicle in violation 23 of state or local law or regulation pertaining to one (1) of the following offenses at a railroad-highway crossing: 24

2 (i) For drivers who are not required to stop at 3 all railroad-highway crossings, failing to slow down and 4 check that the tracks are clear of an approaching train; 5 6 (ii) For drivers who are not required to stop at 7 all railroad-highway crossings, failing to stop before reaching the crossing if the tracks are not clear; 8 9 10 (iii) For drivers who are always required to stop at all railroad-highway crossings, failing to stop 11 12 before driving onto the crossing; 13 14 (iv) For all drivers, failing to have sufficient 15 space to drive completely through the crossing without 16 stopping; 17 18 (v) For all drivers, failing to obey a traffic 19 control device or the directions of an enforcement official 20 at the crossing; or 21 22 (vi) For all drivers, failing to negotiate a

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crossing because of insufficient undercarriage clearance.

(h)(j) After suspending, revoking, disqualifying or 1 2 canceling a commercial driver license, the state licensing 3 authority shall update its records to reflect that action 4 within ten (10) days. After suspending, revoking, 5 disqualifying or canceling a nonresident commercial driver's privileges, the department shall notify the 6 7 licensing authority of the state which issued the

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10 (i) (k) Before a person is disqualified from driving a 11 commercial motor vehicle under this act, the department 12 shall notify the person and provide an opportunity for a 13 hearing and appeal in accordance with the provisions of W.S. 31-7-105. 14

commercial driver license within ten (10) days.

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(k) (m) A disqualification under this section does not affect the department's authority to suspend, revoke, cancel or deny a license under any other law.

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20 (n) A discharge or dismissal under W.S. 7-13-301 21 shall not limit the authority of the department to 22 disqualify a driver from operating a commercial vehicle if the discharge or dismissal under W.S. 7-13-301 is from an 23

1 offense specified in this section and the person has been

2 placed on probation as provided in W.S. 7-13-301(a).

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31-7-310. Rulemaking authority.

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- The department may adopt rules and regulations necessary to 6
- 7 carry out the provisions of this article and the
- requirements of the federal motor carrier safety 8
- 9 regulations in Title 49, Code of Federal Regulations.

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31-7-313. Temporary commercial driver license; fees. 11

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- 13 If a person has his driving privileges suspended or revoked
- for a violation committed while driving a noncommercial 14
- vehicle and the department, hearing officer or court issues 15
- an order pursuant to W.S. 31-7-105 permitting the person to 16
- 17 a motor vehicle for purposes of the person's
- employment, the department shall issue a temporary 18
- 19 commercial driver license to be used by the person to drive
- 20 to and from work and to drive a commercial motor vehicle
- 21 only for employment purposes during the period of the
- 22 suspension or revocation. the department shall not issue a
- 23 temporary commercial driver's license to be used by the
- 24 person to drive a commercial motor vehicle for the period

- of the suspension or revocation. The department may issue a 1
- 2 noncommercial temporary license as specified in W.S. 31-7-
- 105 if the person is otherwise eligible. The fee for the 3
- 4 temporary license shall be the same as for a commercial
- 5 driver noncommercial driver's license under W.S.
