## A BILL

for

1 AN ACT relating to game and fish; modifying provisions

2 relating to fees charged for the sale of specified hunting

3 and fishing licenses, permits, stamps and tags; providing

4 for additional charges to the price of licenses, permits,

5 stamps and tags; modifying provisions for the retention of

6 fees by selling agents; conforming provisions; and

7 providing for an effective date.

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9 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

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11 Section 1. W.S. 23-1-701(a), (b) and (c), 23-1-702,

12 23-2-101(j) and by creating a new subsection (n), 23-2-

13 107(e), 23-2-201(d), 23-2-301(c) and 23-2-306(a) and

14 (b) (intro) are amended to read:

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23-1-701. Selling agents; administration of oaths; 1

2 game tags.

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4 The commission with the advice of the director 5 shall appoint agents to sell game, bird and fish licenses and tags. Any vendor engaged in the commercial sale of 6 7 sporting goods and equipment who holds a valid sales tax license issued by the department of revenue under W.S. 39-8 9 15-106 may apply to the commission and shall be appointed 10 as an agent to sell game, bird and fish licenses, permits, 11 stamps and tags. At the end of each year, the commission 12 shall renew the appointment of agents who had combined 13 game, bird and fish license, permit, stamp and tag sales 14 during that year of not less than one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00). Renewal of the appointment of agents selling 15 16 fish licenses only or agents serving remote locations shall 17 not be subject to the one thousand dollar (\$1,000.00) minimum sales requirement. The commission shall provide 18 19 bonding for agents for the purpose of selling game, bird 20 and fish licenses, permits, stamps and tags. Bonding shall 21 be provided upon receipt of a nonrefundable annual fee of 22 fifty dollars (\$50.00). The fees shall be deposited in a bond pool fund except in any month when the bond pool fund 23 24 contains one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000.00) or more

1 the fees shall be deposited in the game and fish fund. The

2 fee shall be paid to the commission before December 1

3 preceding the year for which the bond shall be in effect.

4 Newly appointed agents shall pay the same fee immediately

5 upon appointment by the commission to receive bonding for

the remainder of the calendar year in which the agent was 6

7 appointed. All claims against an agent's bond shall be paid

from the bond pool account. 8

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Each license selling agent shall charge a fee as (b) provided in this subsection for each license, permit, stamp or tag he sells or distributes pursuant to this act. The fee shall not be charged if this act specifies that the issuance shall be without fee or fails to establish a fee for the issuance of the license, permit, stamp or tag. Each selling agent shall retain fifty cents (\$.50) one dollar and fifty cents (\$1.50) for each license or tag and twentyfive cents (\$.25) fifty cents (\$.50) for each conservation stamp under W.S. 23-2-306 or permit he sells. For failure to comply with this section, selling agents shall not be entitled to fifty cents (\$.50) per license and twenty-five cents (\$.25) for each conservation stamp sold retain the amounts specified in this subsection and shall be liable on their bond. No employee of the commission shall receive any

L2	(c) On or before the 10th of each month every selling
L3	agent shall file a report for the preceding month with the
L 4	commission on forms approved by the commission. Selling
L 5	agents shall also remit all money collected during the
L 6	previous month less commission, and shall account for and
L 7	deliver all surplus, unused and damaged licenses, permits,
L 8	stamps, tags, and stubs of licenses received by the selling
L 9	agent to the commission.

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24	When any license issued under this act has been lost
25	or destroyed, the licensee may secure a duplicate of the

- 5 accordance with rule and regulation of the commission, the

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4 (a) Subject to subsection (b) of this section and the 5 applicable fee under W.S. 23-1-701, each sportsman licensed under W.S. 23-2-101, 23-2-107 or 23-2-201 shall purchase a 6 single conservation stamp for ten dollars (\$10.00) which 7 shall be valid for one (1) calendar year and in the 8 possession of any person exercising rights under any 9 10 fishing or hunting license issued pursuant to W.S. 23-2-11 101, 23-2-107 or 23-2-201. Holders of pioneer licenses as 12 defined under W.S. 23-1-705(d) and (e), of special limited 13 fishing permits issued under W.S. 23-2-207 and holders of licenses only under W.S. 23-2-101(j)(v) and (vi), 23-2-14 201(d)(vi) and (vii) and 23-2-201(f) are exempt from the 15 provisions of this section. Revenues collected from the 16 17 sale of each stamp under this subsection shall be deposited as follows: 18

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20 (b) A lifetime conservation stamp may be purchased
21 for one hundred fifty dollars (\$150.00) plus the applicable
22 fee under W.S. 23-1-701. Revenues collected from the sale
23 of each stamp under this subsection shall be deposited as
24 follows:

(b) Special management permits may be purchased from 

the department or its authorized selling agents for ten

dollars (\$10.00) plus the applicable fee under W.S. 23-1-

701 and shall be valid for one (1) calendar year.
