A BILL

For

1 AN ACT relating to game and fish; modifying and clarifying

- 2 residency requirements for purposes of purchasing hunting
- 3 and fishing licenses, permits and tags; and providing for
- 4 an effective date.

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6 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

7 *** STAFF COMMENTS ***

This bill has been proposed by the Game and Fish Department in an attempt to clarify and simplify existing law, which has been found by some prosecutors and judges to be vague and contradictory.

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> This working draft has been prepared to show the changes made to the existing law. Because it was very confusing to amend the existing section, in the formal draft of the bill the section will be repealed and recreated entirely. In order for the committee to follow the changes, this draft indicates the origin of each "newly created" provision and all changes to the closest corresponding existing provision through usual strike and underline format.

Overall, the section has been nearly completely reorganized, with the substantive requirements for residency removed from the definitional provision of existing law and placed in the substantive section. The reorganization is intended to address like issues in the same subsection, i.e., establishing residency, losing it, special provisions for the military, etc. Under current law different issues are interwoven in the same subsections.

The definition of "domicile" (upon which residency is dependent) is expounded upon in the definition section; including a listing of the factors used to determine domicile.

The same change is often made throughout the revised statute for consistency. Those changes are noted only once.

The residency of minors has not been a major issue according to the Game and Fish; but there have been instances of minors claiming residency for hunting and fishing purposes in multiple The Game and Fish believes restricting claims of residency to one state for hunting and fishing purposes is appropriate for minors. now written, subject to that requirement, the provision allows a minor to qualify custodial parent is a resident or if he will be spending any portion of the year in which the license is valid with a noncustodial parent who qualifies as a resident. The restriction on minors claiming residency elsewhere, comes from subsection (m), with the addition of the one year requirement specified here.

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(c) A person shall lose his residency in Wyoming if he moves to another state, territory or country with the intent of making and makes it his residence domicile, or makes any claim of residency for any purpose to that state,

14 The first sentence is from current subsection 15 The second from the current (f). addressed totally 16 student issue is now 17 subsection (e). "Elsewhere" is changed to "any 18 other state, territory or country" throughout. 19 "elsewhere" is broader While the term 20 shorter, the longer phrase was more precise and the use of "elsewhere" was awkward in certain 21 22 provisions.

From subsection (c). There seemed to be no reason to include a non-exhaustive listing of reasons for absence. The 180 day provision is new in both the first and second sentences and is a major change. The remainder is clarification.

The thinking is that if another state somehow "automatically confers" residency on a person, that is not the same as a person claiming residency elsewhere and that will be the department's interpretation of the new law.
21	(f) any active duty member, the spouse or minor child
22	of Any active duty member of the armed forces of the United
23	States who has been stationed in Wyoming for ninety (90)
24	days shall qualify as a resident under this section, so
25	long as the member remains stationed in Wyoming. Any person
26	serving in active military duty including his dependents in
27	any other state, territory or country, may maintain
28	resident status if: all the following requirements are met:

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(i) The person is on active military duty and is
not a civilian employee of the military;
(ii) The person makes no claim of residency
elsewhere except as a privilege that might be provided or
required by the law of the state, territory or country
where the person is serving in any other state, territory
or country for any purpose; and
(iii) The person was a resident of Wyoming when
he entered the military service and Wyoming remains his
declared home of record or the person:
(A) Makes no current claim of residency in
any other state, territory or country for any purpose;
(B) Has established his home of record in
Wyoming; and
(C) Has maintained his voter registration in
Wyoming.
*** STAFF COMMENTS ***

From subsection (e) and from the definition of

resident in 23-1-102(a)(ix). The subsection

first consolidates the military residency provisions for the person serving. As long as the person remains in Wyoming residency is established after 90 days. But the person would not now qualify for continued residency if transferred elsewhere unless the requirements of all provisions of paragraph (iii) are met. Spouses and minor dependents of military are now addressed in the following subsection.

11 (g) The spouse and minor dependents of a person
12 qualifying as a resident under subsection (f) of this
13 section shall qualify as resident for the same periods
14 unless they have made a claim of residency elsewhere in any
15 other state, territory or country for any purposes during
16 those periods.

***** STAFF COMMENTS *****

These provisions are also from subsection (e) and the definition of resident in 23-1-102. Those provisions seemed to make the military person's dependent's and spouse's residency status dependent upon the status of the person serving; though not as clearly as the rewritten provision. For example, the definition spoke to "spouse or minor child"; the substantive provision spoke to "his dependents".

7 *** STAFF COMMENTS ***

The lifetime license does not require continued residency and therefore is not valid to establish residency. The stricken requirement relating to minors was moved to subsection (b) since this provision deals with types of proof, not substantive requirements.

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15 (j) The commission may promulgate rules and

16 regulations in accordance with the Wyoming Administrative

17 Procedure Act to ensure that only bona fide Wyoming

18 residents as defined in this act are issued resident game

19 and fish licenses, permits and tags.

The following have been deleted as separate provisions. The substantive provisions on establishing and maintaining residency address (g). The provisions of (h) appear unclear and did not seem necessary; e.g., which "family" is the subject of the provision?

(g) A person shall lose his residency in Wyoming if 1 he moves to another state, territory or country with the 2 3 intent of making it his residence, or makes any claim of residency for any purpose to that state, territory or 4 5 country. 6 7 (h) The place where a person's family resides is 8 presumed to be his place of residence, but a person who 9 establishes or continues his place of abode with the intent of remaining at a place other than where his family resides 10 shall be presumed a resident of the place where he actually 11 12 resides. 13 14 **Section 2.** W.S. 23-1-102(a)(ix), (xv) and by creating a new paragraph (xvii) and 23-2-301 are amended to read: 15 16 23-1-102.
