A BILL

for

1 AN ACT relating to wolf management; amending provisions for the reclassification of gray wolves; and providing for an 2 3 effective date. 4 5 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming: *** STAFF COMMENTS *** 6 7 At the last meeting the Committee asked for alternative bill drafts on this issue. The first 8 9 providing for a target of 15 wolf packs within the entire state. The second changing the 10 provision from "or" to "and"; i.e., for 15 packs 11 12 within the state in total and 7 outside the 13 Yellowstone areas specified in current law. This 14 draft contains both alternatives. No other 15 substantive statutory changes are made. 16 17 ALTERNATIVE A - Wolves would always be trophy 18 in game animals the designated areas, 19 Yellowstone, etc., (including the contiguous wilderness areas); but would be predators in the 20 21 remaining areas of the state unless the G&F 22 Commission found there were less than 15 packs in 23 the entire state. If the Commission found there were less than 15 packs within the state, it 24

1 would designate areas in which taking of wolves 2 would be prohibited in order to ensure that 15 3 packs would exist somewhere in the state. 4 5 Section 1. W.S. 23-1-101(a) (viii) (B) (I), 23-1-6 304(b)(i)(A) and (ii) are amended to read: 7 8 23-1-101. Definitions of wildlife. 9 10 (a) As used in this act: 11 12 (viii) "Predatory animal" means: 13 14 (B) Until the date gray wolves are removed from the list of experimental nonessential population, 15 16 endangered species or threatened species in Wyoming as 17 provided by W.S. 23-1-108, "predatory animal" includes wolves. After that date, "predatory animal" shall include 18 any gray wolf not within an area of the state in which the 19 20 gray wolf is: 21 22 (I) Designated as a trophy game animal under subdivision (xii) (B) (I) of this subsection; or 23 24

1 (II) Classified as a trophy game animal by 2 the commission pursuant to W.S. 23-1-304(b)(i)(A). 3 4 23-1-304. Classification of gray wolves. 5 The department shall provide to the commission at 6 (b) least a quarterly monitoring report on the number of gray 7 wolf packs within this state and their general location. 8 9 Within thirty (30) days of receiving a department report 10 the commission shall at a public meeting: 11 12 (i) Determine if there are less than seven (7) 13 packs of gray wolves located in this state and primarily 14 outside of Yellowstone National Park, Grand Teton National 15 Park and John D. Rockefeller, Jr. Memorial Parkway and less 16 than fifteen (15) packs of gray wolves located within this state., including Yellowstone National Park, Grand Teton 17 National Park and John D. Rockefeller, Jr. Memorial 18 Parkway. If such a determination is made: 19 20 21 (A) The commission shall adopt rules and 22 regulations to classify the gray wolf as a trophy game animal and prohibit the taking of gray wolves except as 23 provided by W.S. 23-3-115(c), within that area of the state 24

1 the commission determines is necessary to reasonably ensure 2 seven (7) fifteen (15) packs of gray wolves are located in this state and primarily outside of Yellowstone National 3 4 Park, Grand Teton National Park and John D. Rockefeller, 5 Jr. Memorial Parkway at the end of the current calendar 6 year; 7 8 (ii) Maintain the classification of gray wolves 9 as a predatory animal and trophy game animal as specified in W.S. 23-1-101(a) (viii) and (xii) (B) (I), if it determines 10 there were at least seven (7) fifteen (15) packs of gray 11 12 wolves located in this state and primarily outside of Yellowstone National Park, Grand Teton National Park and 13 14 John D. Rockefeller, Jr. Memorial Parkway or and at least 15 fifteen (15) packs within this state, including Yellowstone National Park, Grand Teton National Park and John D. 16 Rockefeller, Jr. Memorial Parkway as of the end of the 17

18 preceding calendar quarter.

20 *** STAFF COMMENTS *** 21 ALTERNATIVE B - Wolves would always be trophy 22 animals in the designated game areas, 23 Yellowstone, etc. (including the contiguous 24 wilderness areas); but would be predators in the 25 remaining areas of the state unless the G&F 26 Commission found there were less than 15 packs in 27 the state or less than 7 packs located primarily 28 outside of the specified areas of Yellowstone,

If 2 either situation existed the Commission would 3 designate areas in the state in which taking of 4 wolves would be prohibited in order to ensure 5 that 7 packs would exist in the state and 6 primarily outside of the specified areas, 7 Yellowstone, etc., (excluding wilderness areas). 8 9 23-1-304. Classification of gray wolves. 10 11 The department shall provide to the commission at (b)

12 least a quarterly monitoring report on the number of gray 13 wolf packs within this state and their general location. 14 Within thirty (30) days of receiving a department report 15 the commission shall at a public meeting:

17 (i) Determine if there are less than seven (7) 18 packs of gray wolves located in this state and primarily outside of Yellowstone National Park, Grand Teton National 19 Park and John D. Rockefeller, Jr. Memorial Parkway and or 20 less than fifteen (15) packs within this state, including 21 22 Yellowstone National Park, Grand Teton National Park and 23 John D. Rockefeller, Jr. Memorial Parkway. If either such a determination is made: 24

26 (ii) Maintain the classification of gray wolves27 as a predatory animal and trophy game animal as specified

in W.S. 23-1-101(a)(viii) and (xii)(B)(I), if it determines 1 2 there were at least seven (7) packs of gray wolves located 3 in this state and primarily outside of Yellowstone National 4 Park, Grand Teton National Park and John D. Rockefeller, Jr. Memorial Parkway or and at least fifteen (15) packs 5 within this state, including Yellowstone National Park, 6 7 Grand Teton National Park and John D. Rockefeller, Jr. Memorial Parkway as of the end of the preceding calendar 8 9 quarter. 10

11 Section 2. This act is effective immediately upon 12 completion of all acts necessary for a bill to become law 13 as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of the Wyoming Constitution. 14
