A BILL

- 6 certain conditions; and providing for an effective date.

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1. Hydropower study project sponsors must execute a project
agreement with the commission that stipulates that the cost
of the study shall be repaid, with interest at a rate of
seven and one quarter percent (7.25%) six percent (6%),
when power facilities described in the study are
constructed. Interest shall accrue when construction is

completed and power revenues are earned by the sponsor. If

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the power facilities are not constructed, the sponsor will not be required to pay for the cost of the study.

2. The sponsor must first acquire ownership of the existing water system before the study can begin.

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\*Hold projects include: Blackwillow, Rock Springs East,
Bridger Valley and Hawk Springs Water Supply Projects, Crow
Creek Groundwater Recharge, Goshen Reregulating Reservoir,
Middle Fork Dam, North Cheyenne and Smith's Fork Dam
Projects.

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REHABILITATION. The following sums of money are appropriated from water development account II to the commission to be expended to conduct the following feasibility studies as defined in W.S. 41-2-114. Funds appropriated under this section for a particular project which are in excess of the actual amount necessary to complete the study may, subject to the review of the select water committee, be expended by the commission to complete the feasibility study for any other project listed in this section. Appropriated funds not expended prior to July 1, 2004, shall revert to water development account II. The

commission shall submit a report to the legislature on each of the following studies prior to the 2004 legislative session.

The project sponsor for the Lake DeSmet Master Plan and Reservoir Rehabilitation Plan shall execute a project agreement with the commission which stipulates that the cost of the study shall be repaid with interest at a rate of seven and one-quarter percent (7.25%). Repayment of the study is only required if the sponsor receives revenue from a multi-year term water sales agreement for purchase of Lake DeSmet water. Interest shall accrue upon execution of a long-term contract. If the sponsor does not enter into a

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1	long-term contract, the sponsor shall not be required to
2	pay for the study.
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4	2. The sponsor shall first form a public entity prior to
5	commencement of the study.
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7	3. The following shall apply to the Ranchester Master
8	Plan:
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LO	(a) Use of funds for further study of raw water and
L1	treatment plant issues will only be authorized if:

L3	(i) It is shown that the well being drilled
L 4	west of the town of Dayton cannot meet the short-term and
L5	long-term needs of both the towns of Dayton and Ranchester;

L7	(ii) It is shown that it is less expensive for
L8	Ranchester to be served via the water treatment plant with
L 9	the improvements recommended in the Level I Study than the

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22	(iii) After a concerted effort by both of the
23	towns of Dayton and Ranchester, negotiations relating to
24	joint use of the well prove unsuccessful.
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26	(b) Use of funds for further study of emergency
27	power, water distribution and water storage issues will be

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1 authorized regardless of the outcome of subsection (a) of 2 this footnote. 3 4 Section 2.
