for

1 AN ACT relating to wildlife; providing for the 2 reclassification, taking and other regulation of gray 3 wolves as trophy game animals as specified; providing for 4 the regulation of wolf hybrids; providing a definition of

5 livestock for purposes of the game and fish provisions;

6 providing for meetings and for rulemaking; providing a

7 statement of legislative intent; providing for

8 implementation and a report; making conforming amendments;

9 and providing for an effective date.

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11 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

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13 **Section 1.** W.S. 23-1-108 and 23-1-304 are created to

14 read:

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- 23-1-108. Delisting of gray wolves as experimental,
- 2 nonessential species.

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- 4 Gray wolves shall be deemed removed from the list of
- 5 experimental, nonessential species in Wyoming upon final
- 6 publication in the Federal Register by appropriate federal
- 7 agencies removing the gray wolf from its listing as an
- 8 experimental, nonessential species in Wyoming.

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10 23-1-304. Classification of gray wolves.

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- 12 (a) The commission shall determine the classification
- 13 of gray wolves as provided in this section. In making this
- 14 classification the commission shall rely upon information
- 15 provided by department personnel and shall consult with the
- 16 Wyoming animal damage management board created by W.S.
- 17 11-6-303, and consider any additional information provided
- 18 by that board.

- 20 (b) Not later than March 15, of each year, the
- 21 commission shall at a public meeting:

- (i) Remove gray wolves as a predatory animal and
- 24 classify all gray wolves within this state as trophy game

1 animals if it determines there were less than fifteen (15)

2 packs of gray wolves within this state as of the end of the

3 preceding calendar year. If such a determination is made:

5 (A) The commission shall adopt rules and

6 regulations to prohibit the taking of gray wolves within

7 this state, except as provided by W.S. 23-3-115(c), until

8 the commission determines that a sufficient population of

9 gray wolves exists within this state so that at least

10 fifteen (15) packs will be within this state at the end of

11 the current calendar year;

12

13 (B) The commission shall again meet in

14 public not later than May 15, of any year in which the gray

15 wolf is classified solely as a trophy game animal, and may

16 also meet at any subsequent time to regulate the taking of

17 gray wolves as trophy game animals for the balance of the

18 calendar year.

20 (ii) Maintain the classification of gray wolves

21 as a predatory animal and trophy game animal as provided in

22 W.S. 23-1-101(a)(viii) and (xii), if it determines there

23 were fifteen (15) or more packs of gray wolves within this

24 state as of the end of the preceding calendar year.

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2 (c) For purposes of this section "pack" means five

3 (5) or more gray wolves traveling together.

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5 (d) This section shall apply from and after the date

gray wolves are removed from the list of experimental, 6

Powers and duties. 5 (a) The commission is directed and empowered: 6 7 8 (xxix) After the date gray wolves are removed from the list of experimental, nonessential species in 9 10 Wyoming as provided by W.S. 23-1-108, to classify gray 11 wolves as predatory or trophy game animals in accordance 12 with W.S. 23-1-304. 13 14 23-2-101. 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(e) When hunting antelope, bighorn sheep, black bear, deer, mountain goat or mountain lion the longbow hunter must be equipped with a longbow of not less than forty (40) pounds draw weight or possessing the ability to cast a hunting arrow of four hundred (400) grain weight at least one hundred sixty (160) yards. When hunting elk, grizzly bear or moose, the longbow hunter must be equipped with a longbow of not less than fifty (50) pounds draw weight or possessing the ability to cast a hunting arrow of five hundred (500) grain weight at least one hundred sixty (160) yards. The crossbow hunter must be equipped with a crossbow of not less than ninety (90) pounds draw weight which has a minimum draw length of fourteen (14) inches (from front of bow to back of string in the cocked position), a positive

1 safety mechanism, and, except as provided in subsection (f)

2 of this section, which must be cocked by hand without the

3 aid of leverage-gaining devices. Crossbow bolts must be at

4 least sixteen (16) inches long. The broadhead of arrows or

5 bolts shall be of sharp steel with a minimum cutting width

6 of one (1) inch. The provisions of this subsection

7 relating to the hunting of antelope, bighorn sheep, black

8 bear, deer, mountain goat and mountain lion shall also

9 apply to the hunting of the gray wolf as a trophy game

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23-2-303. Trapping licenses; tagging; traps and

15 snares; penalty; confiscation.

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17 All traps and snares used for furbearing predatory animals shall be permanently marked or tagged 18 19 with the and address of the name owner the 20 identification number assigned to the owner by 21 department. Any identification number attached to a trap or 22 snare pursuant to this subsection is solely for the use of 23 the department or appropriate law enforcement officers and

is not a public record for purposes of W.S. 16-4-201

1 through 16-4-205. No trap or snare shall be set for 2 furbearing or predatory animals within thirty (30) feet of 3 any exposed bait or carcass over five (5) pounds in weight. 4 As used in this subsection, "exposed bait or carcass" means 5 the meat or viscera of any part of a mammal, bird or fish, excluding dried bones. In addition, all snares used for 6 taking furbearing or predatory animals shall be equipped 7 with a break-away locking device that is designed to 8 9 release at two hundred ninety-five (295) pounds of pressure 10 or less and a snare loop not to exceed twelve (12) inches 11 diameter measured side to side. Unless otherwise 12 specified in this section, all traps, excluding snares set 13 for furbearing animals and predatory animals and quick kill 14 body grip traps as defined by commission rule and regulation, shall be checked by the owner at least once 15 16 during each seventy-two (72) hour period from the time the 17 traps were set. Quick kill body grip traps shall be checked by the owner not less than once each seven (7) day period 18 from the time the traps were set. All wildlife caught in 19 20 trap or snare shall upon discovery, be removed 21 immediately by the owner. Violation of this subsection 22 constitutes a ninth degree misdemeanor. After the date gray 23 wolves are removed from the list of experimental, nonessential species in Wyoming as provided by W.S. 24

1 23-1-108 the commission may enact rules and regulations setting forth the specifications for traps and snares used 2 3 for the taking of gray wolves. All traps and snares meeting 4 the specifications for taking gray wolves shall be checked 5 by the owner at least once each twenty-four (24) hour 6 period from the time the trap or snare was set. Except as 7 otherwise provided by commission rule, the provisions in this section regulating the trapping of furbearing and 8 predatory animals shall apply to the trapping of gray 9 10 wolves.

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23-3-102. Taking certain game animals without license or during a closed season prohibited.

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(b) Any person who takes any bighorn sheep, mountain goat, mountain lion, or grizzly bear or, if licensed hunting of wolves is authorized, gray wolf, without the proper license except as otherwise permitted by this act is guilty of a 4th degree misdemeanor.

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23-3-115. Taking black bear, mountain lion, gray
22 wolf, bobcat, weasel, badger, squirrels or muskrat for

1 (c) The provisions of subsection (a) of this section 2 relating to the taking of animals doing damage to private 3 property shall apply to gray wolves from and after the date 4 gray wolves are removed from the list of experimental, 5 nonessential species in Wyoming as provided by W.S. 23-1-108. The owner, employee or lessee acting under 6 7 authority of this section shall notify the nearest game warden of the killing of a gray wolf within an area of the 8 9 state in which the gray wolf is classified as a trophy game 10 animal. The notification shall be made within ten (10) 11 days of the kill.

23-3-301. Importation and sale of wildlife prohibited; exceptions.

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16 (a) No person shall import into Wyoming from any
17 source any living antelope, bear, deer, elk, moose,
18 mountain goat, mountain lion, bighorn sheep, wolf, wolf
19 hybrid nor any living wildlife except as otherwise
20 permitted by this act.

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22 (b) No person shall sell any living antelope, bear, 23 deer, elk, moose, mountain goat, mountain lion, bighorn

1 sheep, wolf, wolf hybrid or falcon except as permitted by 2 the commission. 3 4 23-3-304. Certain trapping devices unlawful; game for 5 bait prohibited; baiting big game animals prohibited; 6 penalties. 7 (a) No person shall take or wound any game animal, 8 9 game bird, or game fish by use of any pit, pitfall, net, 10 trap, deadfall, poison, or other similar device except as 11 otherwise provided. From and after the date gray wolves 12 are removed from the list of experimental, nonessential 13 species in Wyoming as provided by W.S. 23-1-108, gray 14 wolves may be taken with a trap or snare only as allowed by 15 and in accordance with rules and regulations of the 16 commission. 17 18 Section 3. Nothing in this act shall prohibit the ownership of a wolf hybrid if the animal was owned before 19 July 1, 2003 by a person then residing in this state. 20 21 22 Section 4.

1 (a) It is the purpose of this act, unless the 2 introduction of the gray wolf into Wyoming is determined by 3 lawful authorities not to have been in accordance with 4 federal law, to provide appropriate state management and 5 control of gray wolves in order to facilitate the removal of the gray wolf from its listing as an experimental, 6 7 nonessential species in Wyoming and to prevent future listing of the gray wolf as an experimental, nonessential 8 9 species or a threatened or endangered species in this 10 state.

In order to accomplish the purposes of this act, 12 (b) 13 the game and fish department shall enter into a memorandum 14 of understanding with appropriate federal agencies under which the department and federal agencies shall endeavor to 15 manage the prey base for gray wolves in a manner to 16 17 maintain a sufficient prey base in National Parks within the state for at least eight (8) packs of wolves. The game 18 19 and fish department shall endeavor to manage big game 20 populations providing a prey base for gray wolves in such a 21 manner as to mitigate to the greatest extent possible, 22 adverse effects on opportunities for licensed hunters to 23 take big game.

1 (c) The game and fish commission shall report to the
