Projects specified by this section shall be

considered as an immediate priority by the commission in developing 2004 1 2 funding recommendations. 3 4 (b) Nothing in this section prohibits Johnson County School District 5 #1 from expending amounts within the school capital construction account 6 appropriated pursuant to 2002 Wyoming Session Laws, Chapter 83, Section 7 316(a), footnote 6(b)(ii) for purposes of preparing planning and schematic 8 design documents necessary to make a determination under this section. 9 Expenditures made from the school capital construction account shall be 10 subject to review and approval by the school facilities commission. 11 12 [EFFECTIVE DATE] 13 14 Section 400.
