## A BILL

8 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

- 10 **Section 1**. W.S. 9-2-1101, 9-2-1102(a)(intro), (i),
- 11 (v), by creating new paragraphs (vii) through (xiv) and (c)
- 12 9-2-1103, 9-2-1104(a)(i), (v) and by creating a new
- 13 paragraph (vi), 9-2-1105 and 9-2-1106(b)(intro), (i) and
- 14 (ii) are amended to read:

11	state or political subdivision entity that provides
12	emergency and public safety services, including state
13	agencies employing peace officers enumerated in W.S.
14	6-1-104(a)(vi)(C) through (F) and approved for
15	participation by the communications commission, fire
16	management services, correctional services, emergency
17	management, emergency and disaster relief services and if
18	desired, county, municipal and federal law enforcement
19	agencies;

21	(ii) "System" means the highband radio wireless
22	communications network providing regional and statewide
23	radio communications capabilities to the Wyoming game and
24	fish department, the Wyoming livestock board, the Wyoming

1 highway patrol, the division of criminal investigation,

2 office of the attorney general and other state agencies

3 employing peace officers enumerated in W.S.

4 6-1-104(a)(vi)(C) through (F) and approved for

5 participation by the communications commission and if

6 desired, to county, municipal and federal law enforcement

7 public safety agencies.

9 9-2-1102. Commission; composition; appointment of

10 members; removal; terms; officers; vacancies; meetings.

12 (a) The commission shall consist of seven (7)

13 thirteen (13) voting members to be appointed by the

14 governor and who may be removed by the governor as provided

15 in W.S. 9-1-202. One (1) member shall be appointed from the

16 public-at-large and the remaining six (6)—The thirteen (13)

17 members shall be appointed from a list of four (4) names

18 submitted by each of the following associations and

19 agencies from their membership:

21 (i) Wyoming police chiefs and sheriffs'

22 association;

4	(vii) Department of state parks and cultural

(c) The commission shall elect from its members a 1 2 chairman, a vice-chairman and a secretary. Vacancies in 3 these offices shall be filled by the commission from its 4 membership. The commission shall meet at least once every 5 three (3) months. Appointments by the governor shall be made within thirty (30) days of expiration of membership 6 7 terms. Nominee lists shall be furnished within ten (10) days upon expiration of any membership term. Each voting 8 9 member shall serve a three (3) year term. A vacancy on the 10 commission shall be filled for the unexpired term by the governor. from a list of two (2) names submitted within ten 11 (10) days of the vacancy by the appointing association or 12 13 agency.
