Nursing education.

Sponsored by: Joint Labor, Health and Social Services Interim Committee

## A BILL

for

1	AN ACT relating to nursing education programs; establishing
2	a Wyoming investment in nursing program as specified;
3	specifying eligibility criteria; providing procedures for
4	application, administration and repayment of loans under
5	the Wyoming investment in nursing program as specified;
6	providing for appeals; requiring the Wyoming community
7	college commission to coordinate the development and
8	implementation of nurse education programs as specified;
9	requiring the commission to coordinate internet or similar
10	proprietary or common carrier electronic system courses to
11	meet prerequisites for entry into nursing programs as
12	specified; specifying conditions under which the Wyoming
13	community college commission and the University of Wyoming
14	shall fund additional teaching positions in nursing
15	education programs; providing for a sunset date; providing
16	appropriations; and providing for an effective date.

2 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

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4 **Section 1.** W.S. 9-2-123 is created to read:

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6 9-2-123. Wyoming investment in nursing loan and grant

7 program; eligibility criteria; procedures.

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- 9 (a) There is created the Wyoming investment in
- 10 nursing program administered by the Wyoming higher
- 11 education assistance authority created under W.S.
- 12 21-16-703. The program shall be known as the WYIN program.
- 13 Applicants may apply for loans from the WYIN program in
- 14 accordance with this section.

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- 16 (b) To qualify for a loan under the WYIN program, the
- 17 applicant shall first:

- 19 (i) Be accepted into a nursing education program
- 20 at a Wyoming community college, the University of Wyoming,
- 21 or, in the case of a candidate for a doctoral degree, an
- 22 institution providing the required nursing education
- 23 courses under contract with the western interstate
- 24 commission for higher education; and

2 (ii) Apply for federal financial
3 assistance. Wyoming community colleges shall allow
4 students who apply for admission into an approved nurse
5 aide training or nursing education program, and who will
6 enroll in fewer than six (6) academic credit hours, to

7 apply for federal financial assistance.

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9 (c) Subject to the availability of funds appropriated 10 for this program, loans under the WYIN program may be 11 granted to applicants enrolled or planning to enroll in 12 nursing education programs as follows:

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(i) An applicant who is accepted into a Wyoming
licensed practical nurse or registered nursing education
program may be eligible for a loan to pay the costs of
attendance at the licensed practical nursing education
program or the registered nursing education program leading
to an associate's or baccalaureate degree;

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(ii) A registered nurse with a baccalaureate degree who holds an unencumbered license with the Wyoming board of nursing, has the equivalent of at least two (2) years of full-time, continuous service teaching in a

1 nursing education program in Wyoming as a registered nurse

2 with a baccalaureate degree and is accepted into a Wyoming

3 nursing education program at the University of Wyoming

4 leading to a master's degree in nursing may be eligible for

5 a loan to pay the costs of attendance at the nursing

6 education program leading to a master's degree in nursing

7 provided that in order to receive a loan for a master's

8 degree program, the applicant shall agree to repay the loan

9 by teaching at a Wyoming college or the University of

10 Wyoming;

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12 (iii) A registered nurse with a master's degree 13 in nursing who holds an unencumbered license with the Wyoming board of nursing, has the equivalent of at least 14 two (2) years of full-time, continuous service teaching in 15 16 a nursing education program in Wyoming as a registered 17 nurse with a master's degree in nursing and is accepted into a nursing education program 18 at an institution providing the required nursing education courses under 19 20 contract with the western interstate commission for higher 21 education leading to a doctorate level degree in nursing 22 may be eligible for a loan to pay the costs of attendance at the nursing education program leading to a doctorate 23

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level degree in nursing provided that in order to receive a

- 1 loan for a doctorate level degree program, the applicant
- 2 shall agree to repay the loan by teaching at the University

3 of Wyoming.

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- 5 (d) A loan provided under this section shall not
- 6 exceed the cost of attendance for the approved program,
- 7 reduced by the amount of any Pell or other federal grant
- 8 received by the applicant.

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- 10 (e) A recipient of a WYIN loan under this section may
- 11 repay the loan without cash payment by working in Wyoming
- 12 as a nurse or nurse educator as provided in subsection (f)
- 13 of this section. To qualify as repayment under this
- 14 subsection, work shall be performed within the following
- 15 time periods which begin with the calendar month following
- 16 the month in which the student completed the academic
- 17 program:

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- 19 (i) If the loan can be repaid with work of two
- 20 (2) years or less, within three (3) years;

- 22 (ii) If the loan can be repaid with work of
- 23 greater than two (2) years, but no more than four (4)
- 24 years, within five (5) years;

2 (iii) If the loan can be repaid with work of

3 greater than four (4) years, within the amount of time the

4 loan could be repaid, plus two (2) years.

5

6 (f) Qualified work under subsection (e) of this

7 section shall be credited so that the student's loan

8 balance is reduced on the basis of one (1) year of full-

9 time employment repaying the loan balance for one (1)

10 academic year of full-time enrollment. Qualified work shall

11 be credited on a proportional basis.

12

13 (g) Any recipient of a WYIN loan who fails:

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15 (i) To complete the academic program for which

16 the loan was provided shall commence cash repayment of the

17 loan no later than forty-five (45) days after the recipient

18 leaves the academic program;

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20 (ii) To obtain employment in the targeted

21 occupation for which the person received the education

22 within ninety (90) days after successfully passing the

23 appropriate certification examination shall commence cash

24 repayment of the loan within one hundred twenty (120) days

1 after successfully passing the appropriate certification

2 examination;

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4 (iii) The appropriate certification examination 5 on the first attempt may retake the appropriate certification examination at the next available opportunity 6 before commencing repayment of the loan. The recipient 7 shall notify the Wyoming higher education assistance 8 9 authority or its contractor of the intent to retake the 10 examination and the date the examination will be taken. Any 11 recipient of a WYIN loan who fails the appropriate 12 certification examination after the second attempt shall 13 commence cash repayment of the loan within forty-five (45) 14 days after receipt of notification of the second failure by the board of nursing. If the recipient of a WYIN loan who 15 fails the appropriate certification examination on the 16 17 first attempt does not retake the examination at the next available opportunity, cash repayment shall commence within 18 forty-five (45) days after the next available examination 19

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22 (h) Loan repayment options under this section may be 23 deferred for a period not to exceed four (4) years while a

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is conducted.

1 loan recipient is serving on full-time active duty with any

2 branch of the military services of the United States.

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- 4 (j) The Wyoming higher education assistance authority
- 5 shall have the powers and duties specified in W.S.
- 6 21-16-705 to implement this section and shall establish
- 7 terms and conditions of loans issued under this section,
- 8 including:

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10 (i) Interest rates and loan terms;

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- 12 (ii) The form and process for loan application,
- 13 review and award;

14

- 15 (iii) Criteria under which students may be
- 16 relieved from having to repay loans and interest thereon,
- 17 in whole or in part, where the requirement to repay would
- 18 cause undue hardship.

- 20 (k) Funding of the loan program established under
- 21 this section shall be by appropriation of the legislature.
- 22 The authority shall transfer approved loan amounts to the
- 23 University of Wyoming and to Wyoming community colleges at
- 24 which loan recipients are enrolled. In consultation with

- 1 the university and affected community colleges, the
- 2 authority shall establish procedures for transferring loan
- 3 amounts and for reporting requirements on the expenditure
- 4 of transferred loan amounts.

- 6 (m) Cash repayment of loans and interest thereon
- 7 shall be credited to the general fund.

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- 9 (n) The authority shall annually review the loan
- 10 program established under this section and report to the
- 11 governor and the legislature in accordance with W.S.
- 12 9-2-1014, regarding program results, funds received and
- 13 loans issued during the preceding academic year, together
- 14 with the status of all outstanding loan commitments and
- 15 repayments under the program.

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- 17 (o) This program created by this section shall expire
- 18 effective June 30, 2011.

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20 (p) Notwithstanding subsection (o) of this section:

- 22 (i) Any person beginning a nursing education
- 23 program as authorized by this section shall continue to

1 receive funding for the program so long as the person

2 remains eligible as required by this section;

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- 4 (ii) Repayment of loans provided under this
- 5 section shall continue as specified in this section until
- 6 all loan obligations have been satisfied.

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- 8 **Section 2.** W.S. 21-17-107, 21-18-202(b) by creating
- 9 new paragraphs (v) and (vi), (c) by creating a new
- 10 paragraph (vii) and 21-18-317 are amended to read:

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12 **21-17-107**. Legislature to make appropriations.

- 14 (a) The legislature shall appropriate monies intended
- 15 for the support and maintenance of the University of
- 16 Wyoming. The appropriations shall specify the purposes for
- 17 which the monies are intended and may be used. The
- 18 appropriations shall apply to and include all monies
- 19 received by the university from the United States for the
- 20 endowment and support of colleges for the benefit of
- 21 agriculture and mechanic arts. No expenditure shall be
- 22 made in excess of an appropriation, and no monies so
- 23 appropriated shall be used for any purpose other than that
- 24 for which they are appropriated.

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2	(b) Subject to appropriation by the legislature, the
3	board of trustees shall fund an entry level teaching
4	faculty position whenever the university expands its
5	nursing program capacity by eight (8) students. The
6	university shall expend the funding under this subsection
7	only if enrollment in the nursing program of the university
8	was not less than ninety-five percent (95%) of the total
9	nursing program capacity at the beginning of the most
LO	recent fall academic semester. Funding available for
L1	expenditure under this subsection for the specific purpose
L2	of expanding a nursing program capacity shall be reduced by
L3	an amount equal to that provided to fund one (1) entry
L 4	level teaching position for every reduction of eight (8)
L 5	full-time equivalent students in the nursing program, as
L 6	determined by comparing the beginning enrollments of the
L 7	two (2) most recent fall academic semesters. Any
L 8	appropriation made for purposes of this subsection shall be
L 9	accounted for and distributed separately from
20	appropriations made pursuant to subsection (a) of this
21	section.

23 **21-18-202**. Powers and duties of the commission.

1	(b) The commission shall perform the following
2	coordination functions. In performing these coordination
3	functions all affected colleges and the commission shall be
4	involved:
5	
6	(v) Subject to appropriation by the legislature,
7	coordinate the development and implementation of outreach
8	nurse education programs, including:
9	
10	(A) Reviewing applications for development
11	of the programs;
12	
13	(B) Contracting with Wyoming community
14	colleges to provide the programs established under this
15	paragraph, giving due consideration to the community
16	college with responsibility for the service area in which a
17	program is offered.
18	
19	(vi) Coordinate the provision by means of
20	electronic internet or similar proprietary or common
21	carrier electronic system technology, by a community
22	college or several community colleges, of all prerequisite
23	courses necessary for entry into an educational program in
24	the field of nursing at a community college or a

1 baccalaureate degree program in nursing at the University

2 of Wyoming.

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4 The commission shall perform the following

5 administrative functions:

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(vii) Subject to appropriation by the legislature, the commission shall fully fund an entry level 8 9 teaching faculty position whenever a community college expands its nursing program capacity by eight (8) students. 10 A community college shall be eligible to apply for the 11 12 funding under this paragraph only if enrollment in the 13 nursing program of the applicant institution was not less 14 than ninety-five percent (95%) of the total nursing program 15 capacity at the beginning of the most recent fall academic 16 semester. Funding provided under this paragraph for the 17 specific purpose of expanding a nursing program capacity shall be reduced by an amount equal to that provided to 18 19 fund one (1) entry level teaching position for every 20 reduction of eight (8) full-time equivalent students in the 21 nursing program, as determined by comparing the beginning 22 enrollments of the two (2) most recent fall academic 23 semesters. Funding reductions shall not exceed the total 24 amount of funding provided to a community college under

- 1 this paragraph. Any appropriation made for purposes of this
- 2 paragraph shall, in accordance with W.S. 21-18-205(e), be
- 3 accounted for and distributed separately from the funding
- 4 allocation model for community colleges.

- 6 21-18-317. Authority to provide educational program;
- 7 scope and approval of program.

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- 9 The community college district board of any community
- 10 college in this state may provide the an educational
- 11 program education in the field of nursing. The educational
- 12 program shall be of such the duration and intensity as may
- 13 be deemed appropriate by the community college district
- 14 board and the Wyoming state board of nursing and shall lead
- 15 to an associate degree in nursing and prepare each student
- 16 for licensure as provided by law. Approval of the Wyoming
- 17 state board of nursing is required prior to the
- 18 establishment of any such the nursing education.

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20 Section 3.

- 22 (a) There is appropriated two million eight hundred
- 23 seventy-seven thousand three hundred twenty-five dollars
- 24 (\$2,877,325.00) to the Wyoming higher education assistance

- 1 authority from the general fund for the fiscal year
- 2 beginning July 1, 2003, to implement the provisions of W.S.
- 3 9-2-123. Any funds appropriated under this subsection that
- 4 are not expended, encumbered or obligated at the end of the
- 5 biennium shall revert to the general fund as provided by
- 6 W.S. 9-4-207.

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- 8 (b) There is appropriated from the general fund to
- 9 the Wyoming community college commission five hundred
- 10 fifty-one thousand three hundred sixty-four dollars
- 11 (\$551,364.00) for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2003,
- 12 to implement the provisions of W.S. 21-18-202(b)(v).

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- 14 (c) There is appropriated from the general fund to
- 15 the Wyoming community college commission three hundred
- 16 seventy-eight thousand three hundred twenty-five dollars
- 17 (\$378,325.00) for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2003,
- 18 to implement the provisions of W.S. 21-18-202(c)(vii).

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- 20 (d) There is appropriated from the general fund to
- 21 the University of Wyoming sixty-five thousand dollars
- 22 (\$65,000.00) for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2003, to
- 23 implement the provisions of W.S. 21-17-107(b).

Section 4. This act is effective July 1, 2003.
