- 1 AN ACT relating to elections; modifying requirements for
- 2 filing campaign reports of receipts and expenditures;
- 3 modifying enforcement provisions; and providing for an
- 4 effective date.

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6 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

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- 8 **Section 1.** W.S. 22-25-106(a), (b)(i) through (iii),
- 9 (c) and (d), 22-25-107(a)(intro), by creating new
- 10 subsections (b) and (c) and by renumbering (b) as (d),
- 11 22-25-108(a), (b)(intro), (ii) and (c) and 22-25-109 are
- 12 amended to read:

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14 22-25-106. Filing of campaign reports.

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1	(a) Except as otherwise provided in subsection (g) of
2	this section, and in addition to other statements required
3	by this subsection:
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5	(i) Every candidate shall file a fully itemized
6	statement of receipts at least seven (7) days before any
7	primary, general or special election with information
8	required by this subsection current to the fourteenth day
9	before the election;
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11	(ii) Every candidate, whether successful or not,
12	shall file a fully itemized statement of receipts and
13	expenditures within ten (10) days after any primary,
14	general or special election: The statement
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16	(iii) Every unsuccessful candidate in any
17	primary election shall file a fully itemized statement of
18	receipts and expenditures within ten (10) days after the
19	<pre>primary election;</pre>
20	
21	(iv) Statements under this subsection shall set
22	forth the full and complete record of receipts including
23	cash, goods or services and <u>except for statements of</u>
24	receipts required under paragraph (i) of this subsection,

and promised expenditures, including all

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2 identifiable expenses as set forth in W.S. 22-25-103. The

3 date of each receipt of twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) or

4 more, any expenditure or obligation, the name of the person

5 from whom received or to whom paid and the purpose of each

6 expenditure or obligation shall be listed. All receipts

7 under twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) shall be reported but

8 need not be itemized. Should the accumulation of receipts

9 from an individual exceed the twenty-five dollar (\$25.00)

10 threshold, all receipts from that individual shall be

11 itemized. Receipts, expenditures and obligations itemized

12 in a statement filed by a political action committee, a

13 candidate's campaign committee or by a political party

14 central committee need not be itemized in a candidate's

15 statement except by total with a reference to the

16 statement: The statement

18 <u>(v) Statements under this subsection</u> shall be

19 filed with those officers as provided in W.S. 22-25-107.

20 The statement may be filed by facsimile transmission if the

21 original is postmarked on the day the facsimile is sent.

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23 (b) Reports of itemized statements of receipt and

24 <u>statements of receipts and</u> expenditures, and statements of

1 termination shall be made with the appropriate filing

2 officers specified under W.S. 22-25-107 and in accordance

3 with the following:

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5 (i) Except as otherwise provided in this any political action committee, candidate's 6 section, 7 campaign committee, or any political action committee formed under federal law or the law of another state that 8 9 contributes to a Wyoming political action committee or to a 10 candidate's campaign committee, and any other organization 11 supporting or opposing any ballot proposition which expends 12 any funds in any primary, general or special election shall 13 file an itemized statement of receipts and expenditures at 14 least seven (7) days before the election current to the fourteenth day before the election and shall also file a 15 16 statement of receipts and expenditures within ten (10) days

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(ii) A committee formed after an election to
defray campaign expenses incurred during a previous
election and any political action or candidate's campaign
committee which has previously filed a statement of
receipts and expenditures and has not filed a statement of
termination shall file an itemized statement of receipts

after the a general or special election;

1 and expenditures on $\frac{\text{July 1}}{\text{and}}$ December 31 of each

2 odd-numbered year;

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(iii) All candidates and committees shall continue to make the biannual reports required under this subsection until the committee terminates and the candidate or committee files a statement of termination with the appropriate filing officer. A statement of termination may

be filed upon retirement of all debts;

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11 (c) All statements required by subsection (b) of this section shall be signed by both the chairman and treasurer. 12 13 The statements shall set forth the full and complete record 14 of receipts including cash, goods or services and except for statements of receipts required under paragraph (i) of 15 this subsection, of actual and promised expenditures. The 16 17 date of each receipt of twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) or more, any expenditure or obligation, the name of the person 18 from whom received or to whom paid and the purpose of each 19 20 expenditure or obligation shall be listed. Nothing in this 21 subsection shall be construed to require the disclosure of 22 the names of individuals paid to circulate an initiative or referendum petition. All receipts under twenty-five dollars 23 24 (\$25.00) shall be reported but need not be itemized. Should

1 the accumulation of receipts from an individual exceed the

2 twenty-five dollar (\$25.00) threshold, all receipts from

3 that individual shall be itemized. If the receipts,

4 expenditures or obligations were for more than one (1)

5 candidate, the amounts attributable to each shall be

6 itemized separately. The statement may be filed by

7 facsimile transmission if the original is postmarked on the

8 day the facsimile is sent.

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10 chairman of each political party central (d) 11 committee for the state or county, or an officer of the party designated by him, shall file an itemized statement 12 13 of receipts of twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) or more, and any expenditures and obligations. The itemized statement 14 15 shall be filed. The statement may shall be filed by 16 facsimile transmission within ten (10) days after a general 17 or special election. provided an original signed statement is sent by mail on the same day. The statement shall report 18 19 all receipts, expenditures and obligations relating to 20 campaign expenses, including normal operating expenses. All 21 receipts under twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) shall be 22 reported but need not be itemized. Should the accumulation 23 of receipts from an individual exceed the twenty-five 24 dollar (\$25.00) threshold, all receipts from that

- 1 individual shall be itemized. It shall attribute all
- 2 campaign receipts, expenses and obligations to a specific
- 3 candidate only if the campaign receipts, expenses and
- 4 obligations can be specifically identified to that specific
- 5 candidate to the exclusion of other candidates on the
- 6 ticket. A copy of the statement shall be furnished to each
- 7 candidate identified in the statement within ten (10) days
- 8 after the general or special election.

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10 22-25-107. Where statements to be filed.

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- 12 (a) All statements required under $\frac{W.S.}{22-25-101}$,
- 13 $\frac{22-25-102}{2}$ and $\frac{22-25-106}{2}$ this chapter shall be filed as
- 14 follows:

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- 16 (b) Statements required to be filed at least seven
- 17 (7) days before any primary, general or special election
- 18 may be filed by facsimile transmission without the original
- 19 signatures. Statements required to be filed after any
- 20 primary, general or special election may be filed by
- 21 facsimile transmission provided that an original with the
- 22 required signatures is postmarked on the day the facsimile
- 23 is sent.

1 (c) Any statement required under this chapter to be 2 filed with: 3 4 (i) The secretary of state, may be filed 5 electronically as provided under W.S. 9-2-2501 if the secretary of state has adopted rules which allow for the 6 7 electronic filing; 8 9 (ii) A county clerk, may be filed electronically if the board of county commissioners has adopted rules 10 11 consistent with the requirements of W.S. 9-2-2501 which 12 allow for electronic filing. 13 (b) (d) Whenever "county clerk" is used in this 14 chapter, it means the county clerk of the county in which 15 16 the person resides. 17 18 22-25-108. Failure of candidate or committee to file 19 statement. 20 21 (a) A candidate who fails to file, within the time 22 required, a full and complete itemized statement of receipts or a statement of receipts and expenditures shall 23 24 receive a notice by certified mail return receipt requested

stating that failure to file the statement within three (3) 1 2 calendar days of receipt of the notice shall result in a 3 vacancy in nomination or a vacancy in office, as the case 4 may be and may be charged with a criminal offense as 5 provided by W.S. 22-26-112 have his name printed on a list drafted by the appropriate filing office specified under 6 7 W.S. 22-25-107. The list shall immediately be posted in the filing office and made available to the public. If he fails 8 9 a candidate has failed to file within three (3) calendar a 10 full and complete itemized statement of receipts and 11 expenditures for more than fourteen (14) days after receipt 12 of notice it is due, he shall not receive a certificate of 13 nomination, or election, nor shall he enter upon the duties 14 of the office, as the case may be and may be charged with a misdemeanor as provided by W.S. 22-26-112. A late filing 15 fee of twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) shall accompany all 16 17 late reports.

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(b) In addition to any other penalty provided by law, a candidate who fails to file the statement required by subsection (a) of this section within one (1) month of receipt of the notice provided the report due date is ineligible to run as a candidate for any state or local

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1 office for which a statement is required by W.S. 22-25-106

2 until:

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4 (ii) The person has filed the required

5 statement. and has paid the late filing fee assessed under

6 subsection (a) of this section.

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(c) Any political action committee which fails to 8 9 file a report as required shall be sent notice by the secretary of state, by certified mail return receipt 10 11 requested or personal service in accordance with rule 4 of 12 the Wyoming Rules of Civil Procedure, stating that failure 13 to file the statement within three (3) calendar days of receipt of the notice may result in the filing of criminal 14 charges against the committee's officers responsible for 15 16 the filing. A late filing fee of twenty-five dollars 17 (\$25.00) shall accompany all late reports. Any officer of a political action committee who is responsible for filing a 18 report and who knowingly and willfully fails to file a 19 who 20 required or knowingly and willfully as 21 subscribes to, makes or causes to be made a false report is 22 guilty of a felony punishable by imprisonment not to exceed two (2) years. 23

1	22-25-109. Reporting candidates in violation.
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3	The secretary of state shall report the names of all
4	candidates in violation of the Election Code of the state
5	of Wyoming to the attorney general or to the district
6	attorney for appropriate action. The secretary of state
7	shall publish a list of those persons violating W.S.
8	22-25-106, once in a newspaper in general circulation
9	throughout the state.
