A BILL

for

- 1 AN ACT relating to civil actions; permitting the court to
- 2 order structured payments in medical injury or death cases
- 3 as specified; providing for modification of orders;
- 4 providing definitions; and providing for an effective date.

6 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

8 **Section 1.** W.S. 1-1-129 is created to read:

9

- 10 1-1-129. Medical injury actions; periodic payments of
- 11 awards for future damages.

- 13 (a) In any action for damages for injury or death
- 14 against any health care provider, whether based on tort,
- 15 breach of contract or otherwise, arising out of the
- 16 provision of, or failure to provide, health care services,

the court in which the action is brought may enter a

1

judgment ordering future damages of the judgment creditor
to be paid in whole or in part by periodic payments rather
than by a lump-sum payment if the award equals or exceeds
one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000.00) in future
damages. In entering a judgment ordering the payment of
future damages by periodic payments, the court shall make a
specific finding as to the dollar amount of periodic

9 payments which will compensate the judgment creditor for

10 the future damages. As a condition to authorizing periodic

11 payments of future damages, the court shall require that

12 the payments be made through the establishment of a trust

13 fund or the purchase of an annuity for the life of the

14 judgment creditor or during the continuance of the

15 compensable injury or disability of the judgment creditor.

17 (b) The judgment ordering the payment of future 18 damages by periodic payments shall specify each recipient 19 of the payments, the dollar amount of the payments, the 20 interval between payments, and the number of payments or

23 (c) In the event that the court finds that the 24 judgment debtor has exhibited a continuing pattern of

the period of time over which payments shall be made.

1 failing to make the payments specified in subsection (a) of

- 2 this section, the court shall find the judgment debtor in
- 3 contempt of court and, in addition to the required periodic
- 4 payments, shall order the judgment debtor to pay the
- 5 judgment creditor all damages caused by the failure to make
- 6 the periodic payments, including court costs and attorney's
- 7 fees.

9 (d) As used in this section:

10

11 (i) "Future damages" includes damages for future

12 medical treatment, care or custody, loss of future

- 13 earnings, loss of bodily function or future pain and
- 14 suffering of the judgment creditor;

15

- 16 (ii) "Health care provider" means any doctor of
- 17 medicine, doctor of osteopathy or hospital licensed by this
- 18 state to provide health care services and an officer,
- 19 employee or agent of the provider acting in the course and
- 20 scope of employment;

21

- 22 (iii) "Health care services" means acts of
- 23 diagnosis, treatment, medical evaluation or advice or other

1 acts permissible under the health care licensing statutes 2 of this state; 3

4 (iv) "Judgment creditor" means a person who has

5 obtained a judgment against a health care provider for

injury or death, arising out of the provision of or failure 6

7 to provide health care services;

8

(v) "Judgment debtor" means a health care 9

10 provider against whom a judgment has been recovered or any

11 successors in interest of the person, where the judgment is

12 unsatisfied;

13

(vi) "Periodic payments" means the payment of 14

money or delivery of other property to the judgment 15

16 creditor at regular intervals.

17

18 Section 2. This act is effective July 1, 2003.
