1	AN ACT relating to labor organizations; authorizing labor
2	organizations to bargain with employers for the assessment
3	of fees for required representation under the National
4	Labor Relations Act; imposing conditions; and providing for
5	an effective date.
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7	Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:
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9	Section 1. W.S. 27-7-111 is amended to read:
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11	27-7-111. Right to work; payment or nonpayment of
12	dues not required; exception.
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14	(a) Except as provided by subsection (b) of this
15	section, no person is required to pay or refrain from
16	paying any dues, fees $_{ au}$ or other charges of any kind to any

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labor organization as a condition of employment or
continuation of employment.

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4 Notwithstanding W.S. 27-7-108 through 27-7-115, (b) 5 any labor organization recognized under the National Labor 6 Relations Act, 29 U.S.C. §§ 151 through 169, as the 7 exclusive bargaining agent for employees of any employer 8 and required under this act to represent the employees even 9 though the employees are not members of the organization, 10 may bargain with the employer for an agreement requiring 11 the payment of a fair share fee by employees who are not 12 members of the labor organization paying regular membership 13 dues, subject to the following:

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15 <u>(i) The fair share fee shall be an amount equal</u> 16 <u>to a percentage of the labor organization's regular</u> 17 <u>membership dues, representing the nonmember employee's pro</u> 18 <u>rata share of the expenses of activities or undertakings</u> 19 <u>normally or reasonably employed by a labor organization</u> 20 <u>that is acting as an exclusive bargaining agent under the</u> 21 <u>National Labor Relations Act;</u>

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- 23 (ii) The fee shall not exceed the amount of the 24 labor organization's membership dues;

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2	(iii) Any labor organization or employer shall
3	not discriminate against any employee or otherwise
4	prejudice his right to continued employment upon failure of
5	the employee to pay a fee assessed under this subsection.
6	Any labor organization assessing a fee under this
7	subsection may recover any fee not paid by a nonmember
8	employee through a civil action.
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10	Section 2. This act is effective immediately upon
11	completion of all acts necessary for a bill to become law
12	as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of the Wyoming
13	Constitution.
