A BILL

for

- 1 AN ACT relating to psychologists; providing prescriptive
- 2 authority pursuant to licensure; expanding authority of the
- 3 psychology board; conforming provisions; providing
- 4 definitions; and providing for an effective date.

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6 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

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- 8 **Section 1.** W.S. 33-27-124 through 33-27-128 are
- 9 created to read:

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- 11 33-27-124. Initial application requirements for
- 12 prescriptive authority.

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- 14 (a) A psychologist who applies for prescriptive
- 15 authority shall demonstrate by official transcript or other
- 16 official evidence satisfactory to the board that the
- 17 applicant:

2 (i) Has completed a doctoral program in 3 psychology from a regionally accredited university 4 professional school or, if the program is not accredited at 5 the time of graduation, that the person has completed a doctoral program in psychology that meets recognized 6 acceptable professional standards as determined by the 7 board; 8

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10 (ii) Holds a current license to practice
11 psychology in this state;

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13 (iii) Has completed a program of education in an organized program of intensive didactic instruction as 14 defined by the board within the five (5) year period 15 16 immediately preceding the date of application, consisting 17 of the following core areas of instruction: neuroscience, 18 pharmacology, psychopharmacology, physiology, 19 pathophysiology, appropriate and relevant physical and 20 laboratory assessment and clinical pharmacotherapeutics or 21 within the preceding five (5) year period practiced with 22 prescriptive authority in a jurisdiction allowing such 23 practice. The board may waive the five (5) 24 requirement for an individual who has had the necessary

1 training and has taken refresher training adequate in the

2 board's judgment to ensure current competency;

4 (iv) Has obtained supervised and relevant

5 clinical experience sufficient to attain competency in the

6 treatment of a diverse patient population under the

7 direction of qualified practitioners as determined by the

8 board within the five (5) year period immediately preceding

9 the date of application; and

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11 (v) Has passed a certifying examination

12 administered by the board and developed by a nationally

13 recognized body approved by the board or developed by the

14 board.

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16 33-27-125. Renewal of prescriptive authority.

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18 (a) The board shall prescribe by rule a method for

19 the renewal of prescriptive authority at the time of, or in

20 conjunction with, the renewal of licenses to practice

21 psychology.

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23 (b) Each applicant for renewal of prescriptive

24 authority shall present satisfactory evidence to the board

- 1 demonstrating completion of six (6) contact hours of
- 2 instruction relevant to prescriptive authority in the
- 3 previous licensure period.

5 33-27-126. Prescribing practices.

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- 7 (a) Every prescription by a psychologist certified to
- 8 prescribe shall:

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- 10 (i) Comply with all applicable state and federal
- 11 laws; and

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- 13 (ii) Be identified as issued by the psychologist
- 14 as "psychologist certified to prescribe" and shall include
- 15 the prescriber's identification number assigned by the
- 16 board.

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- 18 (b) Records of all prescriptions shall be maintained
- 19 in patient records.

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- 21 (c) A psychologist shall not delegate the prescribing
- 22 of drugs to any person not otherwise licensed to prescribe
- 23 the drugs in question.

- 10 timely manner upon termination, suspension or reinstatement
- 11 of a psychologist's prescriptive authority.

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12 (vii) Filling a prescription without reasonable inquiry and confirmation of its validity if there are 13 reasonable grounds to doubt the current existence of a 14 doctor-patient relationship between the prescriber and the 15 16 customer seeking to obtain the drug or that the customer 17 seeking to obtain the drug is the current patient of a psychologist who has prescriptive authority pursuant to 18 19 W.S. 33-27-113(a)(xiv);

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33-24-136. Filing written memorandum of prescription;
labels generally; prescription defined; counseling and
patient profiles.

1 (b) "Prescription" means an order for medication by a person licensed and authorized by the state board of 2 3 medicine, the state board of dental examiners, the state 4 board of nursing, the state board of registration in 5 podiatry, the state board of examiners in optometry, or the state board of veterinary medicine or a psychologist who 6 7 has prescriptive authority pursuant to W.S. 33-27-113(a) (xiv) which is dispensed to or for an ultimate 8 9 user, but does not include an order for medication which is 10 dispensed for immediate administration to the ultimate user. Each prescription memorandum shall be maintained and 11 open for inspection by agents of the board for a period of 12 13 two (2) years from the date it is filed.

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15 **33-24-137**. Sale of poison.

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17 (a) It shall be unlawful:

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(i) For any person, either on his own behalf or while in the employ of another, to sell or give away any poison, as designated by the board of pharmacy without first recording in a book to be kept for that purpose, with an indelible pencil or ink, the date, the name and address of the person to whom, and the amount and kind of poison

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    delivered, except when such poison is sold on the written
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    prescription of an osteopath, physician, dentist,

22 (b) The board may suspend, place on probation, require remediation for a specified time to be determined 23 at the discretion of the board, restrict or revoke any 24

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1 license to practice psychology, or school psychology, or 2 prescriptive authority, deny an application for licensure, or take any other action specified in the rules and 3 4 regulations whenever the board shall find by a 5 preponderance of the evidence, following a hearing conducted by the board pursuant to this act, that the 6 7 psychologist, school psychologist or applicant has engaged in conduct prohibited by this act, rules or regulations 8 9 promulgated by the board, or in any of the following acts or offenses: 10 11 Section 3. This act is effective July 1, 2003. 12
