A BILL

for

1	AN ACT relating to the Wyoming Emergency Management Act;
2	transferring oversight and control of the emergency
3	management agency; providing for the appointment of a
4	emergency management coordinator; transferring the agency's
5	persons, functions, programs, authority and funds; and
6	providing for an effective date.

8	Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:
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10	Section 1. W.S. 19-7-101(a)(iv), 19-13-103(a)(i),
11	19-13-104(a), 19-13-105(a), (b), (c)(i) and (v), 19-13-106
12	and 19-13-111 are amended to read:
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14	19-7-101. Definitions.
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16	(a) As used in this act:

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2 (iv) "Military department" means the adjutant 3 general, the divisions of the army national guard, the air 4 national guard, <u>and</u> state military affairs; <u>and emergency</u> 5 management agency;

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7 19-13-103. Legislative determination; coordination
8 with federal government and other states.

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10 (a) Because of the possibility of the occurrence of 11 disasters of unprecedented size and destructiveness resulting from enemy attack, sabotage, terrorism, civil 12 13 disorder or other hostile action, or from fire, flood, earthquake, other natural causes and other technological 14 disasters, and to insure that preparations of Wyoming will 15 16 be adequate to deal with such disasters, and generally to 17 provide for the common defense and to protect the public peace, health and safety, and to preserve the lives and 18 property of the people of Wyoming, it is hereby found and 19 20 declared to be necessary:

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22 (i) To create a Wyoming emergency management 23 agency within the adjutant general's governor's office, and

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1 to authorize the creation of local emergency management programs in the political subdivisions of the state; 2 3 4 19-13-104. Powers of governor generally. 5 The governor has general direction and control of 6 (a) 7 the emergency management agency, and is responsible for the carrying out of the provisions of this act, and in the 8 9 event of disaster beyond local control, may assume direct 10 operational control over all or any part of the emergency 11 management functions within Wyoming. The governor may delegate such powers to the adjutant general directly, or 12 13 through the adjutant general to the coordinator of 14 emergency management to carry out this act. 15 19-13-105. Emergency management program. 16 17 18 emergency management agency within the (a) The adjutant general's governor's office is created. 19 The adjutant general governor shall employ appoint 20 а 21 coordinator of emergency management who shall be a 22 civilian and the administrator thereof, and may appoint 23 such assistants as may be necessary. The coordinator and 24 his assistants shall be compensated in an amount to be

1 determined and fixed by the Wyoming human resources 2 division. <u>The coordinator shall serve at the pleasure of</u> 3 <u>the governor and may be removed as provided in W.S.</u> 4 <u>9-1-202.</u>

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6 The coordinator, with the approval of (b) the 7 adjutant general governor, may employ technical, clerical, stenographic and other personnel and make such expenditures 8 9 within the appropriations or from other funds made available to him for purposes of emergency management as 10 11 necessary to carry out this act. He shall be provided with 12 appropriate office necessary and space, furniture, 13 equipment, stationery and printing in the same manner as for personnel of other state agencies. 14

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16 (c) The coordinator is the administrative head of the 17 Wyoming emergency management agency and:

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19 (i) Shall be responsible to the adjutant general 20 <u>governor</u> for the implementation of the state program for 21 emergency management for Wyoming;

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1 (v) Shall have additional authority, duties and 2 responsibilities authorized by this act as be may 3 prescribed by the adjutant general governor; and 4 5 19-13-106. Emergency management advisory board. 6 7 The emergency management advisory board is created, consisting of such members as deemed necessary, who shall 8 9 be appointed by the governor and may be removed by the 10 governor as provided in W.S. 9-1-202. The membership of the 11 board shall contain representative citizens of commercial 12 enterprises, service organizations and public-spirited 13 groups. The board shall assist in specific fields related 14 to emergency management preparedness and recovery and advise the governor, the adjutant general 15 and the 16 all matters pertaining to coordinator on emergency 17 management. The members thereof shall serve without compensation but may be reimbursed for the reasonable and 18 19 necessary expenses incurred in the performance of their 20 duties.

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19-13-111. Funds, supplies and equipment; authority
to make use of existing facilities.

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1 In carrying out the provisions of this act, the governor, 2 the adjutant general and the executive officers or 3 governing bodies of the political subdivisions of the state 4 are directed to utilize the services, equipment, supplies 5 and facilities of existing departments, offices and agencies of the state and of the political subdivisions 6 7 thereof to the maximum extent practicable, and the officers and personnel of all departments, offices and agencies are 8 9 directed to cooperate with and extend such services and 10 facilities to the governor, to the coordinator and to the 11 emergency management programs throughout the state upon 12 request.

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14 Section 2. W.S. 19-7-102(a)(iv), 19-7-104(c) and 15 19-7-105(a)(iv) are repealed.

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17 Section 3. Except as otherwise specified, the legislature hereby transfers all functions, programs and 18 19 authority of the Wyoming emergency management agency to the 20 governor's office. All personnel of the Wyoming emergency 21 management agency except the coordinator shall be 22 transferred to the governor's office. The adjutant general's position shall not be affected by this section. 23 24 Nothing in this act shall be deemed to affect the property

1 interests of current permanent employees within the 2 emergency management agency except for the coordinator who 3 shall be appointed by and subject to removal by the 4 governor.

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Section 4. This act is intended simply to transfer 6 7 the control of the Wyoming emergency management agency from the adjutant general to the governor's office. The Wyoming 8 9 legislature intends to make no substantive change to prior 10 law including, but not limited to revenue, either increases 11 or decreases, powers, duties, authorities, obligations, 12 definitions, administration, confidentiality, imposition, 13 tax rates, exemptions, licenses, permits, compliance, collection procedures, enforcement, remedies, statutes of 14 limitation or distribution of taxes. This act is not 15 16 intended to affect the validity of any rule or regulation 17 promulgated prior to the effective date of this act.

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19 Section 5. This act is effective July 1, 2003.
