1 AN ACT relating to disabled veterans; authorizing issuance of lifetime bucking horse permits to resident disabled 2 3 veterans as specified; imposing conditions; and providing for an effective date. 4 5 6 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming: 7 Section 1. W.S. 36-4-121(a) (intro) and by creating a 8 new subsection (n) is amended to read: 9 10 11 36-4-121. Permits to use state parks, recreation 12 areas and historic sites; disabled veteran's lifetime 13 permit. 14 15 The department of state parks and cultural (a) resources shall offer for sale permits that allow use of 16

1 the state parks, recreation areas, archeological sites and 2 historic sites. Daily use permits shall be required at 3 Glendo, Guernsey, Curt Gowdy, Edness Kimball Wilkins, 4 Buffalo Bill, Boysen, Seminoe and Keyhole state parks and 5 Fort Bridger, South Pass City, Trail End, Fort Fetterman and Fort Phil Kearney state historic sites, and Hawk 6 Springs state recreation area. 7 The department may establish voluntary pay stations at Bear River and Hot 8 9 Springs state parks to allow users of those parks to make 10 voluntary contributions for the use of the state parks. 11 Persons who enter or use Bear River or Hot Springs state park without paying daily use fees shall not be subject to 12 13 the penalties provided for in subsection (j) of this 14 section. Overnight camping permits shall be required at Boysen, Buffalo Bill, Curt Gowdy, Glendo, Guernsey, 15 Keyhole, Seminoe and Sinks Canyon state parks, Connor 16 17 Battlefield state historic site, Medicine Lodge state archeological site and Hawk Springs state recreation area 18 19 by the department during the entire calendar year. Except 20 for the lifetime permit issued without cost pursuant to 21 subsection (n) of this section, the cost of the permits 22 authorized under this section shall be:

1	(n) Any resident disabled veteran who receives fifty
2	percent (50%) or more service connected disability
3	compensation from the United States department of veteran's
4	affairs may apply to the department for a lifetime bucking
5	horse permit authorizing the use of state parks, recreation
6	areas, archeological sites and historic sites. Only one
7	(1) permit shall be issued to any qualified applicant under
8	this subsection and shall be valid for the vehicle owned or
9	identified by the applicant and for all occupants of that
10	vehicle. In addition to information and other application
11	procedural requirements prescribed by rule and regulation
12	of the department, application for the lifetime permit
13	shall include proof of residency, certification of the
14	service connected disability and vehicle registration,
15	identification or other necessary vehicle information. The
16	lifetime permit is valid as long as the holder is a Wyoming
17	resident. In addition to initial application for the
18	lifetime permit, the permit holder shall annually submit
19	written certification of eligibility under this subsection
20	to the department in a manner and subject to requirements
21	specified by department rule and regulation. A permit
22	under this subsection shall be issued to an eligible
23	applicant without the imposition of a fee.
