## HOUSE BILL NO. HB0033

Children and families initiative.

Sponsored by: Joint Labor, Health and Social Services Interim Committee

## A BILL

## for

1 AN ACT relating to children and families; authorizing a study and development of a plan to address the needs of 2 children and families; specifying duties of the department 3 4 of family services in conducting the study and plan; 5 requiring recommendations in the plan; requiring reports; providing an appropriation; and providing for an effective 6 7 date. 8 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming: 9 10 11 Section 1. 12 The department of family services shall develop a 13 (a) 14 comprehensive plan to improve the lives and futures of all children and families in Wyoming. In developing the plan, 15 16 the department shall collaborate with the business councils

of the Northern Arapaho tribe and Eastern Shoshone tribe, 1 state and local agencies, including the department of 2 health, the department of workforce services, the 3 4 department of employment, the department of education, the 5 department of corrections, the Wyoming business council, the University of Wyoming, Wyoming community colleges, the 6 judiciary and private groups and businesses, including 7 faith-based organizations and not-for-profit organizations, 8 9 express an interest in participating in the that 10 development of the plan. The plan shall:

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12 (i) Consider development of mechanisms to employ 13 the use of public and private resources in an efficient 14 manner to meet the needs of children and families;

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16 (ii) Include life span recommendations, 17 including, in particular, prenatal and early childhood intervention and development practices that 18 promote meaningful lifetime changes and minimize delays in life 19 20 skills development;

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22 (iii) Review the current judicial system and make recommendations for reforms that may enable courts to 23 24 better meet the needs of children and families;

1 2 (iv) Examine how schools, community 3 organizations, state agencies and the judicial system can 4 work more closely together to enhance a sharing of resources and information to meet the needs of parents, 5 preschool children and elementary and secondary school 6 7 students; 8 9 (v) Examine causes of the most serious problems 10 facing children and families, including poverty, mental health needs, violence, the lack of adequate health care, 11 12 the use of tobacco and illegal drugs and the abuse of 13 alcohol; 14 15 (vi) Examine issues of parent accountability; 16 17 (vii) Encourage and support family stability; 18 and 19 20 (viii) Review the state's existing efforts to 21 determine where present funding and human resources could 22 be employed in a more client-centered and efficient manner. 23

1 (b) The department of family services shall submit a preliminary plan with recommendations for any initial 2 3 legislation to the joint labor, health and social services 4 interim committee no later than November 1, 2004. The final 5 plan shall be submitted no later than October 1, 2005. Any recommendations contained in the plan shall be science-6 7 based or reflect practices that have a record of success. The plan shall specifically include recommendations: 8 9 10 (i) For institutionalizing collaboration among state and local agencies and the private sector, including 11 12 the business and faith community to provide seamless and 13 integrated services in which funding is blended, when 14 appropriate, to support client-centered plans that meet the needs of individual children and families; 15

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17 (ii) For addressing gaps or deficiencies in 18 services;

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20 (iii) For early intervention and other services 21 that seek to strengthen the bond between children and 22 parents and place the primary responsibility for raising 23 children on the family;

1 (iv) For the consolidation of programs or 2 funding sources where appropriate; 3 4 (v) For the development of comprehensive, 5 integrated state and community level approaches that will leave no child unsupported in critical aspects of life, 6 7 particularly from birth through five (5) years of age; 8 9 (vi) That will result in integrated, more efficient and effective programs and cost savings. 10 11 The department shall widely disseminate requests, 12 (C) 13 including through electronic media, for the active participation of private groups and organizations in the 14 development of the plans. Before submitting the preliminary 15 and final plans to the joint labor, health and social 16 17 services interim committee, the department shall issue drafts of the plans for public review and hold at least one 18 (1) public meeting in a central location in the state to 19 20 receive public comments on each plan. 21

(d) In addition to the appropriation contained in subsection (e) of this section, the department of family services may utilize existing resources and apply for any

federal or private grants that may be available to augment 1 2 funding for the study and plan required under this act. 3 The department may also contract with recognized experts and consultants to conduct the study and develop the plan 4 5 and recommendations required by this act. 6

7 (e) There is appropriated from the general fund to the department of family services two hundred thousand 8 9 dollars (\$200,000.00) to implement the purposes of this 10 act.

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12 Section 2. This act is effective immediately upon completion of all acts necessary for a bill to become law 13 as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of the Wyoming 14 15 Constitution.
