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8	Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:
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10	Section 1. W.S. 9-5-401 through 9-5-404 are created

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13	ARTICLE 4
14	STATE CAPITAL CONSTRUCTION COMMISSION

16	9-5-401. Definitions.

1 2 As used in this article "commission" means the state 3 capital construction commission created by W.S. 9-5-402. 4 5 9-5-402. State capital construction commission; 6 membership; removal; terms; salary. 7 (a) The state capital construction commission is 8 9 created to consist of seven (7) members appointed by the state building commission with the advice and consent of 10 11 the senate. Members may be removed as provided in W.S. 12 9-1-202. Not more than four (4) members shall be of the 13 same political party. Appointments are for a term of four 14 (4) years, except that three (3) of the first appointees shall serve two (2) year terms. No person shall be 15 appointed for more than two (2) consecutive terms. No more 16 17 than two (2) residents of any county shall be appointed to the commission. The commission shall dissolve July 1, 18 19 2008, unless established as a separate operating agency or 20 placed within an existing department of state government by 21 further act of the legislature.

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23 (b) The commission shall biennially elect a chairman 24 and a secretary from its members.

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1 2 (c) Commission members shall receive a salary of one 3 hundred fifty dollars (\$150.00) and necessary per diem and 4 traveling expenses as provided in W.S. 9-3-102 and 9-3-103, 5 for attending and traveling to and from commission meetings. 6 7 8 9-5-403. Powers; duties; staff. 9 10 The commission shall: (a) 11 12 (i) Meet quarterly and as necessary and as the 13 state building commission may direct; 14 15 (ii) Submit an annual report of its activities, expenses and recommendations and other items to the state 16 17 building commission as provided by W.S. 9-5-107, the joint appropriations interim committee and the select committee 18 on capital financing and investments; 19 20 21 (iii) Review plans, specifications, designs and 22 cost estimates for the construction, reconstruction, rehabilitation, improvement, alteration or repair of any 23 state construction project subject to W.S. 9-5-107. 24 In 3

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conducting these activities the commission shall coordinate 1 2 with the school facilities commission as appropriate; 3 4 (iv) Make recommendations for priorities of 5 state construction projects in accordance with W.S. 9-5-107 and 9-5-108; 6 7 (v) Adopt rules and regulations to carry out its 8 duties under W.S. 9-5-107 and 9-5-108; 9 10 11 (vi) Have authority to contract for 12 professional, financial and technical assistance upon 13 approval of the state building commission; 14 (vii) Plan for all state agency office and other 15 space needs and construction projects required for those 16 17 space needs in accordance with the provisions of W.S. 9-5-101 through 9-5-108 and rules, procedures and criteria 18 adopted pursuant to those sections; 19 20 21 (viii) Perform other duties as directed by law. 22 The commission shall employ a director who shall 23 (b) have demonstrated competency in capital construction. 24 The

1 director shall receive an annual salary determined by the 2 commission and may be removed from office as provided under 3 W.S. 9-1-202(b). In addition to other powers granted under this act, the director may hire necessary staff as approved 4 5 by legislative appropriation who shall provide administrative support to the commission and the state 6 7 building commission. 8 9 (c) Any member of the commission who has a personal 10 or private interest in any matter proposed or pending before the commission shall publicly disclose this fact to 11 12 the commission and shall not vote thereon. 13 14 9-5-404. Assistance by state agencies. 15 Upon request of the commission, any state agency may lend 16 17 technical assistance, render advice and attend meetings with the members, director and employees of the commission 18 19 as the commission requires in carrying out its functions 20 and duties. 21 22 Section 2. W.S. 9-2-1013(d)(i), 9-5-105(a), 9-5-106(b), 9-5-107(a) through (c), (d)(intro), (e) and 23 (f), 9-5-108(a)(intro), (i)(H), (J), (ii)(D), (iii)(intro), 24

State budget; distribution of copies to legislators; copies and reports of authorizations. 7 8 9 (d) In addition to the items contained in subsection section and notwithstanding 10 this (a) of any other 11 recommendations made by the governor, the state budget 12 shall also include the governor's recommendations for 13 appropriations for the ensuing two (2) years, or if a supplemental budget request, the remainder of the budget 14 period, subject to the following: 15 16 17 (i) The state budget shall include the governor's recommendations for a total appropriation from 18 school foundation program account and based upon 19 the 20 recommendations of the school facilities commission under 21 W.S. 21-15-119, a total appropriation for school capital 22 construction purposes for both fiscal years. The state 23 budget shall include the governor's recommendations for

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4	9-5-105. Purchase or lease of state lands and
5	buildings; state building commission authority.
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7	(a) Before purchasing any land for any state purpose,
8	the state agency or board shall, in accordance with rules
9	of the state building commission, determine if any land
10	owned by the state is available and could be used for the
11	state purpose. The agency or board shall, in accordance
12	with rules of the state building commission, negotiate with
13	the agency or board owning or controlling the land for
14	purchase or lease of the lands. <u>In planning for state</u>
15	agency office and other needs and construction projects
16	required for those needs, the state building commission and
17	the state capital construction commission shall, prior to
18	recommending additional construction, determine the
19	feasibility of leasing space in existing buildings within
20	the vicinity.
21	
22	9-5-106. State building commission; powers relative
23	to use of state buildings; rules authorized; exceptions.

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The secretary to the commission under W.S. 1 (b) 2 9-2-1016(b)(xxi) shall administratively implement any rules 3 of the state building commission adopted under this 4 section. The director of the department of administration 5 and information may adopt rules and regulations which make violation of rules adopted by the commission under 6 7 subsection (a) of this section grounds for disciplinary action for any state employee violating the rules of the 8 9 state building commission regarding operation, management 10 or use of state buildings.

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9-5-107. State building commission and state capital 12 construction commission; duties and responsibilities with 13 14 respect to state buildings; state capital construction 15 needs assessment and priorities.

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The general services division of the department 17 (a) of administration and information state capital 18 construction commission shall, subject to the direction of 19 20 the state building commission and with the assistance of 21 other state agencies as necessary, conduct and maintain a 22 comprehensive needs assessment of existing state buildings and of future space and facility requirements for state 23 agencies. The assessment shall be conducted in accordance 24

1 with rules of the state building commission adopted 2 pursuant to subsection (d) of this section and be designed 3 to provide uniform statewide data describing the condition 4 of state buildings and projecting building longevity and 5 space and facility requirements. Through the identification of building conditions and needs, the assessment shall 6 7 the evaluation of capital construction and enable renovation requirements for all state buildings. The needs 8 9 assessment shall be revised annually on or before October 10 September 1 of each year. The needs assessment shall 11 specify construction and renovation requirements for the 12 remainder of the current fiscal year and the succeeding four (4) fiscal years. 13

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(b) On or before November 1 September 15 of each year 15 and based upon the statewide needs assessment of state 16 17 buildings performed under subsection (a) of this section, the state building commission shall establish 18 and prioritize construction and renovation needs for state 19 20 buildings. The listing shall specifically identify and 21 prioritize those buildings in need of building construction 22 or renovation and the estimated costs of required construction or renovation during the current fiscal year 23 24 and during the succeeding four (4) fiscal years. The

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1	listing shall include information on building needs of the
2	University of Wyoming, community college districts state
3	agencies submitted pursuant to subsection (e) of this
4	section. Building needs of the university and community
5	college districts may be included within the state building
6	commission's recommendations for funding under this
7	section, but nothing in this section shall limit the
8	university or community college districts from prioritizing
9	and funding building needs independently from this section.
10	Building needs of state agencies, the construction or
11	renovation of which is not funded by state general funds,
12	shall not be included within the state building
13	commission's recommendations for funding, but shall be
14	prioritized by those agencies independently from this
15	section. The listing shall contain a budget recommendation
16	to implement this section and to fulfill the needs on the
17	<u>list.</u>

(c) On or before December 1 September 15, of each 19 year, the state building commission shall provide copies of 20 the needs assessment, and statewide construction and 21 renovation priorities established under this section and 22 23 proposed program construction schedule under W.S. 9-5-108 24 to members of the legislature the joint appropriations

1 interim committee and to the select committee on capital 2 financing and investments.

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4 (d) The state building commission shall adopt rules 5 implementing policies for the management and assessment of 6 state buildings. The rules shall establish:

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Rules and procedures adopted under this section 8 (e) 9 by the state building commission shall be applicable to all 10 state owned buildings unless the operation, management and 11 use of the building has been assigned by statute to a specific state agency and no state general funds are used 12 13 for the construction or renovation of the building. The 14 agency responsible for the operation and management of a 15 state building exempted by the provisions of this 16 subsection, shall provide the assessment required by 17 subsections (a) through (c) of this section to the state 18 building commission for inclusion in the commission's report to the legislature joint appropriations interim 19 20 committee and the select committee on capital financing and 21 investments. The rules adopted by the commission under 22 subsection (d) of this section shall be used as quidelines 23 for the management of state buildings assigned by statute 24 to other state agencies and for which no state general

1 funds are used for the construction or renovation of the 2 building, including the University of Wyoming, community 3 college districts, department of transportation, game and 4 fish commission and state institutions.

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6 The state building commission shall meet at least (f) 7 quarterly and shall promulgate rules specifying procedures under which public comment may be received regarding any 8 9 actions of the state building commission or state capital 10 construction commission, excluding promulgation of rules to 11 which the Wyoming Administrative Procedure Act is applicable under this section and W.S. 9-5-108. 12 The promulgation of rules, procedures and criteria and 13 14 decisions of the state building commission or state capital construction commission relating to the recommendation and 15 16 prioritization of projects under this section and W.S. 17 9-5-108 are specifically exempt from all provisions of the Wyoming Administrative Procedure Act including provisions 18 19 for judicial review under W.S. 16-3-114 and 16-3-115.

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9-5-108. Development 21 of building projects; 22 rehabilitation of building projects.

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24 (a) The state capital construction commission shall,

1 on the basis of a state needs assessment plan or as 2 otherwise directed by the legislature or state building 3 commission and after consultation with and advice from 4 state agencies and officials, other appropriate agencies 5 and officials and members of the public, identify and select potential projects to be studied for inclusion in 6 7 the Wyoming public buildings construction program pursuant to the following schedule: 8 9 10 (i) Level I reconnaissance studies shall, to the 11 extent possible: 12 13 (H) Summarize public testimony received at 14 meetings held by the state capital construction commission 15 in the county of the proposed construction; and 16 17 (J) Contain the state building commission's recommendation to the legislature whether to terminate 18 further consideration of the proposed project or to 19 20 continue the project at its current level of study, or to 21 proceed with further activity under paragraph (ii), (iii) 22 or (iv) of this subsection. 23 24 (ii) Level II feasibility studies shall to the

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1 state capital construction commission in the preparation of 2 the studies. In the execution of these activities, subject 3 to the direction of the state building commission the state 4 capital construction commission shall: 5 6 The state building commission may suspend the (C) 7 expenditure of time or funds on a project at any level of activity, if it is established that it would be in the 8 9 public interest. The state building commission shall report 10 the reason for any suspension of activity to the 11 legislature. 12 13 Any agency seeking to rehabilitate an existing (d) 14 public building shall submit that request to the state capital construction commission. The 15 state capital

16 construction commission shall review and develop plans and 17 recommendations for the project as provided in this 18 section.

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20 (e) As used in this section, "project" means any 21 state owned public building and all works and facilities 22 necessary for the planning, construction and utilization of a state owned public building, including the improvement of 23 any feature, facility, function or portion of a project. 24

"Project" does not include those projects for which the 1 2 operation, management and use of the building, works or the 3 facility has been assigned by law to a specific state 4 agency and for which no state general funds are used for 5 the construction or renovation of the building. Projects of the University of Wyoming and community college districts 6 7 shall not be subject to the provisions of this section, unless the governing body of the university or community 8 9 college district requests and the state building commission 10 agrees to include the project in the construction program 11 under this section.

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13 24-2-109. Designation of state highways; vesting of 14 county interest in state; commission authorized to acquire 15 severed portions of land; land to be sold.

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17 (b) Pursuant to W.S. 24-2-102:

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19 (iii) Any parcel of land acquired pursuant to 20 paragraph (b)(ii) of this section and not otherwise used 21 for highway purposes or traded for land used for highway 22 purposes shall be offered for sale within two (2) years from the date of the completion of the project for which it 23 was acquired. After written notice to the state building 24

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commission and state capital construction commission, the 1 2 sale or disposition of this land shall be in accordance 3 with rules and regulations adopted by the transportation 4 commission. 5 28-11-201. 1 2 (ii) Review budgets and expenditures related to any aspect of state investment policy 3 and its implementation; 4 5 6 (iii) Review budgets and expenditures related to any aspect of state capital financing policy and its 7 implementation. 8 9 **Section 3.** W.S. 9-2-1016(b)(xxi) and (xxii) 10 is 11 repealed. 12 13 Section 4.
