Wyoming territorial prison state park management.

A BILL

for

- 1 AN ACT relating to the Wyoming territorial prison state
- 2 park and historic site; providing for management of the
- 3 park and site by the department of state parks and cultural
- 4 resources; making conforming amendments; and providing for
- 5 an effective date.

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7 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

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- 9 **Section 1.** W.S. 36-8-1001(d)(intro), (i), (ii), (viii)
- 10 and (f) and 36-8-1002(b)(intro), (i), (c) and (d) are
- 11 amended to read:

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- 36-8-1001. Description and declaration; plan for park
- 14 development and operation; plan for development of prison
- 15 buildings as state historic site.

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(d) The economic development and stabilization board 1 2 department of state parks and cultural resources shall 3 prepare a business plan for the development and operation 4 of the Wyoming territorial prison historic site and state 5 park which shall provide for private operation under 6 contract with the state with the authority to implement the 7 business plan by the department as part of the department's comprehensive plan under W.S. 36-4-106. The plan shall be 8 9 presented to the legislature joint travel, recreation, 10 wildlife and cultural resources interim committee not later 11 than the second Tuesday in January, 1987 September 1, 2004. 12 In developing the plan, the board department shall: 13 (i) Exclude from the state park the historic 14 prison buildings situated on the lands described under 15 subsection (a) of this section including the prison 16 17 building, the warden's residence, broom factory, adjacent buildings and the grounds immediately surrounding the 18 buildings not to exceed seven (7) acres of land, to be 19 20 administered by the state archives, museums and historical 21 department as a state historical site pursuant to subsection (e) of this section in a manner compatible with 22 the National Historic Preservation Act; 23

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1 (ii) Establish the boundary between the state park and the historical site to insure the integrity of the 2 3 historic structures for public enjoyment; and to insure 4 sufficient access to usable land for the development of 5 private business within the state park; 6 7 (viii) Cooperate with the Wyoming travel parks and cultural resources commission in development of the 8 9 park for maximum beneficial use by citizens and tourists. 10 11 (f) The department of commerce state parks and 12 cultural resources is authorized to enter into leasehold or 13 concession agreements in accordance with the business plan provided by subsection (d) of this section. 14 15 16 36-8-1002. Transfer of lands; park administration; site administration; lease and contract agreements. 17 18 19 The Wyoming recreation commission department of 20 state parks and cultural resources shall administer, 21 operate and maintain the state park, excluding lands and 22 buildings comprising the historic site as specified under W.S. 36-8-1001 (e), as follows: 23

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(i) Park development, operation and management 1 2 shall be in accordance with the business plan specified under W.S. 36-8-1001(d). and The commission shall 3 4 department may, under lease agreement or contract 5 management arrangement with a local public or private nonprofit entity, provide for special events at the park 6 7 development, operations and in accordance with W.S. 8 36-4-121(o) or management. Upon execution of the agreement 9 or arrangement, the local public or private nonprofit 10 entity shall serve as the single management group for the park of specified areas of the park by the public or 11 12 private entity; 13 14 (c) The state archives, museums department shall in accordance with standards of the 15 16 National Historic Preservation Act, 16 U.S.C. 470, and the 17 business plan specified under W.S. 36-8-1001(d), administer, operate and maintain the historic 18 site comprised of lands and buildings specified under W.S. 19 20 36-8-1001(e) 36-8-1001(d)(i). As authorized under W.S. 21 36-8-1001(f), the department shall enter into a lease 22 agreement or contract management arrangement with the local 23 public or private nonprofit entity serving as the single 24 management group pursuant to paragraph (b)(i) of this

section for on-site administration of site development, 1

maintenance and operation in accordance with conditions 2

3 imposed under this subsection.

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5 (d) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the 6 terms of any agreement or arrangement entered into under 7 subsections (b) and (c) of this section and W.S. 36-8-1001(f) may authorize the local public or private 8 9 nonprofit entity serving as the single management group to 10 department may impose an admissions fee in excess of fees 11 charged for admissions to other state parks and sites, to 12 fund necessary expenses incurred for park and site 13 development, operations and maintenance. conducted pursuant 14 to any lawful agreement or arrangement. Any authorization under this subsection shall require an accounting of fee 15 16 revenues to the commission or department, whichever is 17 appropriate. Unexpended or unencumbered revenues remaining at the end of any fiscal accounting period shall be 18 19 maintained by the single management group in an operating 20 fund for expenditure in subsequent fiscal accounting periods for purposes authorized under this subsection 21 Notwithstanding W.S. 36-4-121(h) daily admission fees 22 23 collected pursuant to this subsection shall be deposited 24 into a separate account within the earmarked revenue fund

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1 and may be expended by the department upon legislative

2 <u>appropriation</u>.

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4 **Section 2.** W.S. 12-4-506, 36-8-1001(d)(iii) through

5 (vii) and (e) and 36-8-1002(b)(ii) are repealed.

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Section 3. It is the intent of this act to transfer 7 management of the Wyoming territorial state prison park and 8 9 historic site from the single management group to the 10 department of state parks and cultural resources, and for 11 complete transfer of management to be accomplished no later 12 than April 30, 2005. The department, with the advice and 13 approval of the attorney general, is authorized to 14 negotiate for and terminate any and all leases or contracts 15 currently in existence pertaining to the management of all 16 or any portion of the state park and historic site by any 17 entity other than the department and to take such further actions as necessary to effectuate the intent of this act. 18 19 Until such time as current leases or contracts are 20 terminated and complete management of the park and site is 21 vested in the department under this act, the park and site 22 may be operated by the department or a single management group as authorized under W.S. 36-8-1001 and 36-8-1002 23 24 prior to the amendment of those provisions under this act,

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1 as mutually agreed by the department and the management

2 group. Any funds accruing to the state as a result of the

3 termination of any contract or lease pursuant to this act

4 shall be remitted to the state treasurer for deposit into

5 an account within the earmarked revenue fund. The

6 department shall submit a copy of the plan required by W.S.

7 36-8-1001(d) to the joint travel, recreation, wildlife and

8 cultural resources interim committee.

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10 **Section 4.** This act is effective immediately upon

11 completion of all acts necessary for a bill to become law

12 as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of the Wyoming

13 Constitution.
