A BILL

for

ACT relating to medical assistance and services; 1 AN providing an additional payment for obstetric services 2 under the Wyoming Medical Assistance and Services Act; and 3 4 providing for an effective date. 5 6 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming: 7 Section 1. 8 9 10 (a) For calendar years 2004 and 2005 for the first ten (10) deliveries performed by each physician who 11 averages fewer than fifty (50) deliveries per year for 12 calendar years 2001 through 2003 and which were paid for 13 under the Wyoming Medical Assistance and Services Act, 14 may be an additional malpractice insurance 15 there 16 compensation payment of two thousand five hundred dollars

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1 (\$2,500.00) per delivery. No physician shall be eligible 2 additional malpractice insurance compensation for an 3 payment under this section unless the physician is located 4 in an area of this state which is more than forty (40) 5 miles from not more than one (1) other physician providing obstetric services as determined by the department of 6 health. For calendar year 2004 only deliveries performed on 7 or after the effective date of this act may be 8 SO 9 compensated. Deliveries before the effective date may not 10 be counted.

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12 If in any year the funds appropriated for the (b) 13 purposes of this act are expended and there are additional would otherwise 14 deliveries that be eligible for compensation under subsection (a) of this section, no 15 16 payments in excess of appropriated funds shall be made, 17 however the joint appropriations interim committee shall be informed that the funds are expended and shall be given an 18 estimate of the supplemental appropriation that would be 19 20 required to pay for the additional eligible deliveries.

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(c) The department of health may make the payments on behalf of the state and may utilize a fiscal agent to do so. The department of health may structure the payments in

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1 any way to capture any federal share available under the 2 Medicaid program, provided the payment structure makes the 3 full payment authorized to each physician participating for 4 the first ten (10) eligible deliveries.

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If a community is without obstetric services and 6 (d) physicians who had previously provided obstetric 7 the services have purchased the insurance coverage known as 8 9 tail coverage to provide coverage for incidents occurring but not discovered while they were providing obstetric 10 11 services, the health department may contract to purchase 12 any such additional coverage that may be required at the 13 end of this program if the physicians will return to provide obstetric services for recipients eligible for 14 services under the Wyoming Medical Assistance and Services 15 16 Act for the duration of this program.

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(e) The Wyoming legislature finds that the payment authorized by this act is necessary to assure the continued availability of obstetric services for recipients eligible for services under the Wyoming Medical Assistance and Services Act and thus constitutes a necessary support of the poor as permitted by Article 16, Section 6 of the Wyoming Constitution.
