for 1 AN ACT relating to a military assistance trust fund; 2 creating a military assistance trust fund as specified; specifying eligibility for financial assistance from the 3 4 interest on the trust funds; requiring an annual report; 5 requiring rulemaking; providing an appropriation; and providing for an effective date. 7 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming: 8 9 **Section 1.** W.S. 19-7-401 through 19-7-403 are created 10 11 to read:

- 13 ARTICLE 4
- 14 MILITARY ASSISTANCE TRUST FUND

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19-7-401. Wyoming military assistance trust fund; 1

2 establishment of trust fund; corpus inviolate; investment

3 by state treasurer.

4

5 An account within the trust and agency fund is

established which shall be referred to as the Wyoming 6

military assistance trust fund. The trust fund shall 7

consist of those funds designated to the account by law. 8

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10 monies deposited into the trust (b) The 11 established pursuant to this section are inviolate and 12 constitute a permanent or perpetual trust fund. The monies 13 shall be transmitted to the state treasurer for credit to 14 the trust fund and shall be invested by the state treasurer as authorized under W.S. 9-4-711 in a manner to obtain the 15 16 highest return possible consistent with the preservation of 17 the corpus. The interest earned from investment of the corpus of the trust fund shall be annually credited by the 18 state treasurer not later than June 30 of each year into a 19 20 separate account within the trust and agency fund and 21 distributed in accordance with W.S. 19-7-402.

19-7-402. Wyoming military assistance trust 23

uses of trust fund; administration; rulemaking. 24

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- 2 (a) The investment income from the military
- 3 assistance trust fund created by W.S. 19-7-401 shall be
- 4 administered by the adjutant general only to alleviate
- 5 financial hardships faced by:

- 7 (i) Any member of the Wyoming national guard or
- 8 a reserve unit that is based in Wyoming who has been called
- 9 to active duty or active state service;

10

- 11 (ii) Any Wyoming resident who is a member of a
- 12 military reserve unit that is not based in Wyoming, if the
- 13 member is called to active duty;

14

- 15 (iii) Any other Wyoming resident performing
- 16 service in the uniformed services as defined in W.S.
- 17 19-11-103(a)(ix) for any branch of the military of the
- 18 United States; and

- 20 (iv) Members of the immediate family of those
- 21 personnel identified in paragraphs (i) through (iii) of
- 22 this subsection. For purposes of this paragraph, "immediate
- 23 family" means spouse and each child as defined by W.S.
- 24 2-1-301(a)(v) and, if they are dependents of the member of

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- 1 the military, the parents, grandparents, siblings,
- 2 stepchildren and adult children of the member of the

3 military.

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- 5 (b) The interest income earned from the military
- assistance trust fund shall only be used as a last resort 6
- 7 to assist eligible military personnel and families deal
- with financial hardship resulting from the military 8
- 9 member's active duty status and shall not be used to
- supplant any other private or public funds to the extent 10
- such funds are available. 11

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- 13 (c) The adjutant general shall promulgate rules and
- regulations to establish eligibility requirements for 14
- assistance under this section. In developing rules and 15
- regulations, the adjutant general shall consult with 16
- 17 military support groups, including but not limited to the
- family assistance fund and family assistance centers. 18

1 (a) Beginning September 1, 2005, the adjutant general

2 shall provide a report to the governor and the joint

3 appropriations interim committee specifying:

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5 (i) The total amount of interest income earned

from the military assistance trust fund during 6

7 preceding state fiscal year;

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9 (ii) The total amount of assistance provided

10 from the interest income earned from the military

11 assistance trust fund;

12

13 (iii) The amount of assistance provided from the

14 interest income earned from the military assistance trust

fund by branch of service, regular or reserve duty 15

16 classification, amounts of individual assistance provided,

17 the reasons that qualified a member of the military or his

family for assistance and the balance remaining within the 18

interest income account for future disbursements; and 19

20

21 (iv) The name, address, rank and rating, branch

22 of service, deployment location and amounts of financial

assistance provided to each eligible military member and to 23

24 his family.

2 (b) The information provided pursuant to paragraphs

3 (a)(i) through (iii) of this section shall be public

4 records and available for inspection as provided by W.S.

5 16-4-201 et seq. The information provided pursuant to

paragraph (a) (iv) of this section shall be confidential and 6

7 shall be available for inspection only by the governor and

the legislature. Names, addresses and deployment locations 8

9 shall not be in any report available for public access.

The governor and legislators with legal access to the 10

report shall be required to hold names, addresses and 11

12 deployment locations confidential.

13

(c) The adjutant general may request assistance from 14

the state treasurer to prepare the annual report required 15

by this section. 16

18 Section 2.

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20 (a) Effective July 1, 2004, there is appropriated ten

million dollars (\$10,000,000.00) from the budget reserve 21

22 account to the military assistance trust fund created by

6

23 this act.

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(b) There is appropriated from the general fund to 1

2 military department one hundred thousand dollars

3 (\$100,000.00) for the purposes of administering the

4 provisions of this act. The monies appropriated from the

5 general fund under this section shall be reimbursed to the

general fund over a five (5) year period beginning on the 6

7 effective date of this act from the investment income

earnings from the military assistance trust fund created by 8

W.S. 19-7-401. 9

10

11 Section 3. This act is effective immediately upon

12 completion of all acts necessary for a bill to become law

13 as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of the

Constitution. 14
