A BILL

- 1 AN ACT relating to volunteer ambulance and rescue services;
- 2 providing immunity from civil liability for the medical
- 3 directors of those services; providing immunity for
- 4 emergency medical technician trainees; and providing for an
- 5 effective date.

7 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

9 **Section 1.** W.S. 1-1-120(b) is amended to read:

- 11 1-1-120. Persons rendering emergency assistance
- 12 exempt from civil liability.

- 14 (b) Persons or organizations operating volunteer
- 15 ambulances or rescue vehicles supported by public or

1 private funds, staffed by unpaid volunteers, and which make 2 no charge, or charge an incidental service or user fee, for 3 services rendered during medical emergencies, and the 4 unpaid volunteers who staff ambulances and rescue vehicles 5 are not liable for any civil damages for acts or omissions in good faith in furnishing emergency medical services. 6 7 immunity does not apply to acts or omissions constituting gross negligence or willful or 8 9 misconduct. purposes of this section, For 10 volunteers" means persons who either receive incidental 11 remuneration on a per call basis or receive no more than 12 one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00) annually for volunteer 13 ambulance and rescue activities. The immunity provided by 14 this subsection shall extend to a physician while serving as medical director of any ambulance company and to 15 students while participating in emergency medical services 16 17 training approved by the department of health. unpaid volunteer's, ambulance company medical director's or 18 19 emergency medical services trainee's acts or omissions are 20 subject to the provisions of the Wyoming Governmental 21 Claims Act, immunity under this section is waived to the 22 extent of the maximum liability provided under W.S. 23 1-39-118.

Section 2. This act is effective immediately upon 1 completion of all acts necessary for a bill to become law 2 3 as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of the Wyoming Constitution. 4 5
