"War orphan Eligible person" includes the 1 (i) surviving spouse and child of any person who was a resident 2 3 of Wyoming at the time of entering into active state 4 service or active service with the military forces of the 5 United States; and 6 7 (A) Who died while in such service during a period of war Whose death was service connected, as defined 8 9 in 81 Stat. 181, 38 U.S.C. 101, or is listed officially in the military records of the United States as being a 10 11 prisoner of war or missing in action as a result of the 12 Korean or Vietnam conflicts—active state service or active 13 service with the military forces of the United States; or 14 15 (B) Who was honorably discharged from the 16 military forces of the United States and thereafter died of 17 an injury or disease incurred while in active state service or active service with such military forces, being a 18 resident at the time of death. 19 20 21 (b) The state or any political educational 22 subdivision shall provide free tuition, matriculation and 23 other fees to all war orphans eligible persons who are

residents of this state and who are attending or may attend

any state institutions in elementary, secondary and college 1

grades, business colleges, state vocational training 2

schools or other educational institutions of this state 3

4 where courses of instruction are provided in subjects which

5 would tend to enable the orphans eligible persons to engage

in any useful trade, occupation or profession. 6
