## A BILL

for

1 AN ACT relating to game and fish; providing an

2 appropriation for game and fish department funding;

3 specifying uses of the funds; providing for future

4 requested funding; making conforming amendments; and

5 providing for an effective date.

7 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

10 fish commission from the general fund ten million five 11 hundred fifty-seven thousand dollars (\$10,557,000.00) for

Section 1. (a) There is appropriated to the game and

12 the period commencing July 1, 2005 and ending June 30,

13 2006. The funds appropriated under this act shall be

14 placed in a separate account and notwithstanding W.S. 23-1-

15 501(b) shall not be placed within the game and fish fund

created in W.S. 23-1-501(b). The funds may be expended by 1

2 the game and fish commission in the manner authorized by

3 law for expenditures from the game and fish fund subject to

4 the following:

6 (i) To fund existing game and fish department

7 and for expansion of the following existing

programs, appropriations under this act shall be used: 8

10 Within the wildlife division: (A)

local sage grouse working group projects;

11

12 (I) Four hundred twenty-five thousand 13 dollars (\$425,000.00) shall be used for the existing terrestrial native species program and one million eighty-14 two thousand dollars (\$1,082,000.00) shall be used for the 15 expansion of that program. These funds shall be used for 16 five (5) existing permanent positions, six (6) additional 17 biologists and other program needs to improve comprehensive 18 planning, monitoring and sensitive species management 19 20 efforts. Of these funds for the expanded program five 21 hundred thousand dollars (\$500,000.00) shall be used for

1 (II) Two hundred thirty-five thousand

2 dollars (\$235,000.00) shall be used for the existing trophy

3 game conflict resolution program and five hundred fifty-

4 seven thousand dollars (\$557,000.00) shall be used for an

5 expansion of that program. These funds shall be used for

two (2) existing permanent positions, one-half (.5) of an 6

7 existing at-will contract employee position, four (4)

additional conflict resolution specialists and other 8

9 program needs to provide timely responses necessary for

effective conflict resolution; 10

12 hundred fifty thousand (III) One

13 dollars (\$150,000.00) shall be used for the

terrestrial habitat extension program and three hundred 14

eight-eight thousand dollars (\$388,000.00) shall be used 15

16 for an expansion of that program to provide habitat

17 extension services to landowners in order to

wildlife habitat. These funds shall be used for two (2) 18

existing permanent positions, one-half (.5) of an existing 19

20 at-will contract employee position, four (4) additional

21 biologists and other program needs;

22

23 hundred five (IV) Five thousand

24 dollars (\$505,000,00) shall be used for the existing 1 wildlife disease management program and seven hundred

2 seventy-five thousand dollars (\$775,000.00) shall be used

3 for additional wildlife disease management efforts. These

4 funds shall be used for six (6) existing permanent

5 positions, three (3) additional biologists, one (1)

6 feedground manager, one (1) feedground maintenance worker,

7 one (1) secretarial position, one (1) coordinator position

8 and other program needs;

9

10 (V) Eight hundred twenty-five thousand

11 dollars (\$825,000.00) shall be used for the existing

12 terrestrial habitat management program and two hundred

13 ninety-one thousand dollars (\$291,000.00) shall be used for

14 an expansion of that program to monitor and address long-

15 term chronic habitat issues affecting wildlife. These

16 funds shall be used for eleven (11) existing permanent

17 positions, three (3) additional biologists and other

18 program needs.

19

20 (b) Within the fish division:

21

22 (I) One hundred thousand dollars

23 (\$100,000.00) shall be used for the existing aquatic native

24 species program and seven hundred seventy-five thousand

dollars (\$775,000.00) shall be used for an expansion of 1

2 program to begin a systematic and scientific

3 assessment strategy leading to management of native aquatic

4 species in order to, among other goals, forestall potential

5 Endangered Species Act listings by providing additional

data on the status of native species. These funds shall be 6

7 used for one (1) existing permanent position, eight (8)

additional biologists and other program needs; 8

9

10 Three hundred (II)eighty-eight

11 thousand dollars (\$388,000.00) shall be used for expanded

12 aquatic habitat extension services to landowners in order

13 to benefit aquatic wildlife habitat. These funds shall be

14 used for four (4) additional biologists and other program

15 needs;

16

17 (III) Eighty hundred fifty thousand

dollars (\$850,000.00) shall be used for the 18

aquatic habitat management program and one hundred ninety-19

20 four thousand dollars (\$194,000.00) shall be used for an

21 expansion of that program to monitor and restore aquatic

habitat. These funds shall be used for ten (10) existing 22

23 permanent positions, one (1) existing at-will contract

employee position, two (2) additional biologists and other 1

2 program needs.

3

4 (c) Within the services division:

5

6 hundred seventy-five (I) Three 7 thousand dollars (\$375,000.00) shall be used for the existing program to coordinate hunting and fishing 8 9 workshops and similar events and ninety-six thousand 10 dollars (\$96,000.00) shall be used to expand that program 11 in support of hunting and fishing activities. These funds 12 shall be used for five (5) existing permanent positions, 13 one (1) additional events coordinator position and other

program needs;

16 (II) Six hundred seventy-five thousand 17 dollars (\$675,000.00) shall be used for existing publication services. These funds shall be used for four 18 (4) existing permanent positions and other program needs; 19

20

21 (III) Eighty-five thousand dollars 22 (\$85,000.00) shall be used for the existing wildlife habitat imaging technology program and two hundred ninety-23 one thousand dollars (\$291,000.00) shall be used for an 24

1 e	expansion	of	that	program	to	assist	in	the	monitoring	and

2 management of wildlife and wildlife habitat. These funds

3 shall be used for one (1) existing permanent position and

4 three (3) additional technicians and other program needs.

6 (d) Within the office of the director:

7

8 (I) Six hundred thousand dollars

9 (\$600,000.00) shall be used for the allocation of funding

10 of the functions of that office for the programs specified

11 in this section;

12

13 (II) Two hundred seventy-five thousand

14 dollars (\$275,000.00) shall be used for the allocation of

15 the SALECS functions for the programs specified in this

16 section.

17

18 (ii) For the creation of new game and fish

19 department programs appropriations under this act shall be

20 used as follows:

21

22 (A) Within the fish division ninety-seven

23 thousand dollars (\$97,000.00) shall be used for a program

24 to address issues relating to aquatic nuisance species

1	which	pose	а	threat	to	the	state'	S	ecosystems.	These	funds

- 2 shall be used for one (1) additional biologist and other
- 3 program needs.

5 (B) Within the services division:

6

- 7 (I) Three hundred eighty-eight
- 8 thousand dollars (\$388,000.00) shall be used for a program
- 9 to address issues relating to energy and transportation
- 10 infrastructure development and coordination with wildlife
- 11 issues. These funds shall be used for four (4) additional
- 12 biologists and other program needs;

13

- 14 (II) One hundred thirty-five thousand
- 15 dollars (\$135,000.00) shall be used for grants management.
- 16 These funds shall be used for two (2) financial specialists
- 17 and other program needs.

18

- 19 (iii) The game and fish commission shall use
- 20 funds appropriated under this act for the programs and
- 21 positions specified, including payment of salary and all
- 22 employer paid benefits.

- The status of continued funding for the above
- 25 programs was left uncertain by the motion passed

by the Committee. The following would require the game and fish commission to submit a budget request for these general fund programs in the manner as other state agencies. If that is not the Committee's intent, all of the following could be deleted.

4	<pre>fund, counties, municipalities and school districts;</pre>

11	(iii) Consult with each entity which will
12	require a legislative appropriation either directly or
13	indirectly, excluding the Wyoming highway department, and
14	excluding the game and fish departments department for
15	appropriations other than from the general fund, in

submitting budget estimates or requests for funds, or for

instituting, recording and reporting all financial and
