AN ACT relating to crimes and offenses; clarifying and
amending the definition of bingo as an activity excluded
from the definition of gambling; specifying entities
authorized to conduct bingo games; specifying conditions;
authorizing cities, towns and counties to prohibit or
restrict bingo activities; and providing for an effective
date.
Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

13 6-1-705. Bingo permitted for restricted purposes;

Section 1. W.S. 6-1-705 is created to read:

1	(a) The game of bingo as defined in W.S. 6-7-
2	101(a)(xi) shall not be construed as gambling under this
3	article if all of the following are met:

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6 (vii) The maximum price charged for each bingo 7 card shall be two dollars (\$2.00) and no prize in excess of 8 five hundred dollars (\$500.00) shall be awarded at any one

11 (viii) The entities authorized under paragraph 12 (i) of this subsection, before conducting a bingo game, 13 provide thirty (30) days written notice of the time and place thereof to the governing body of the city or town in 14 which it intends to conduct the bingo game, and the 15 governing body does not pass a resolution prohibiting the 16 17 conduct of the game. If the game is conducted in an unincorporated area of a county, 18 notice under this 19 paragraph shall be provided to board of 20 commissioners and the that board shall have authority to 21 pass a resolution prohibiting the conduct of the game. If 22 no such resolution is passed by the city, town or county having jurisdiction, the game may be conducted as specified 23

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(ix) No entity authorized under paragraph (i) of
this subsection to conduct a bingo game shall enter into
any lease or agreement with any other person to provide
equipment or services associated with the conduct of a
bingo game. The provisions of this paragraph shall not be
construed to prohibit the authorized entity from purchasing
equipment to conduct the bingo game;

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10 Any entity conducting bingo in this state (X)11 shall report to the department of revenue and the division 12 criminal investigation annually all income of 13 expenditures related to the operation of bingo. The report shall be filed not later than March 1, for the preceding 14 year. Records related to any bingo operation in this state 15 shall be made available upon request of the division of 16 17 criminal investigation; and

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(xi) Not less than seventy-five percent (75%) of all monies paid to the entity conducting the bingo game and not returned to players as winnings shall be used to support a benevolent purpose. For purposes of this paragraph "benevolent purpose" means for the relief of poverty, medical condition or condition of public concern

14 gain contingent in whole or in part upon lot, chance, the

15 operation of a gambling device or the happening or outcome

16 of an event, including a sporting event, over which the

17 person taking a risk has no control, but does not include:

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19 (D) Raffles or bingo conducted, or pull

20 tabs sold, by charitable or nonprofit organizations where

21 the tickets for the raffle or bingo are sold only in this

22 state and the pull tabs are sold only on the premises owned

23 or occupied by the charitable or nonprofit organization;

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1 (E) Any game, wager or transaction which is

2 incidental to a bona fide social relationship,

3 participated in by natural persons only, and in which no

4 person is participating, directly or indirectly, in

5 professional gambling; or

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(xi) "Bingo" means a game meeting the specifications of this paragraph. Each player is supplied a card or board containing five (5) adjoining horizontal and vertical rows with five (5) spaces in each row, each containing a number or symbol therein, except for the central row with four (4) spaces, each containing a number or symbol therein and the word "free" marked in the center space thereof. Upon announcement by the person conducting the game of any number or symbol appearing on the player's card or board, the space containing the symbol or number is covered by the player. When the player shall have covered all five (5) spaces in any horizontal or vertical row, or

1	shall have covered four (4) spaces and the "free" space in
2	a five (5) space diagonal, horizontal or vertical row, or
3	shall have covered the required combination of spaces in
4	some other preannounced pattern or arrangement, such
5	combination of spaces covered shall constitute "bingo".
6	The player or players first verified as covering the spaces
7	constituting "bingo" shall be awarded money, merchandise or
8	some other consideration by the person conducting the game.
9	Each bingo game shall continue until at least one (1)
10	player's card or board has reached the pattern or
11	arrangement which is verified as "bingo". All players
12	during the course of a game shall compete for the same
13	prizes utilizing different arrangements of the same set of
14	numbers or symbols.

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18	(a) The governing bodies of all cities and towns may:
