- 31-5-1302. Definitions. 13
- (a) As used in this article: 15

1	(v) "Passenger vehicle" means a motor vehicle-
2	excluding emergency and law enforcement vehicles, designed
3	to carry people and that was equipped with safety belts at
4	the time of manufacture <u>r</u> + <u>excluding:</u>
5	
6	(A) Emergency and law enforcement vehicles;
7	
8	(B) School buses as defined under W.S.
9	31-5-102(a)(xlii), including buses registered to a private
10	school or church used to transport children to or from
11	school or church or in connection with school or church
12	activities;

14	(C) Buses, or other vehicles designed and
15	used for public transportation, whether intrastate or
16	interstate, that were not equipped with safety belts at the
17	time of manufacture.

19	31-5-1303. Child safety restraint system; required
20	use; exception.

22	(a) Except as otherwise provided in subsection (b) of
23	this section, no person shall operate a passenger vehicle

24 in this state unless each child who is a passenger in that

vehicle and who is eight (8) years of age or under, and who 1 2 weighs eighty (80) pounds or less, is properly secured in a 3 child safety restraint system in a seat of the vehicle 4 other than the front seat, except if the vehicle is only 5 equipped with one (1) row of seats, or if all safety belts 6 in the rows of seats behind the front seat are in use by 7 other child passengers in the vehicle, the child may be properly secured in a child safety restraint system in the 8 9 front passenger seat of the vehicle. Any child who is over 10 the age of eight (8) years or who weighs more than eighty 11 (80) pounds shall not be required to be in a child safety 12 restraint system while traveling in a passenger vehicle in 13 this state, except that if the lap and shoulder belts of 14 the vehicle will not fit properly across the collarbone, 15 chest and hips of the child and may pose a danger to the 16 neck, face or abdominal area of the child in the event of a 17 crash or sudden stop, the child shall be secured in an 18 appropriate child restraint system which meets standards 19 prescribed by 49 C.F.R. 571.213.
