A BILL

for

AN ACT relating to children and families; authorizing a study and development of a plan to address the needs of children and families; specifying duties of the department of family services in conducting the study and plan; requiring recommendations in the plan; requiring reports; providing an appropriation; and providing for an effective date.

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9 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

11 Section 1.

13 (a) The department of family services shall develop a
14 comprehensive plan to improve the lives and futures of all
15 children and families in Wyoming. In developing the plan,
16 the department shall collaborate with other state and local

1 agencies, including the department of health, the

2 department of workforce services, the department of

3 employment, the department of education, the department of

4 corrections, the Wyoming business council, the University

5 of Wyoming, Wyoming community colleges, the judiciary and

6 private groups and businesses, including faith-based

7 organizations and not-for-profit organizations, that

8 express an interest in participating in the development of

9 the plan. The plan shall:

11 (i) Consider development of mechanisms to employ

12 the use of public and private resources in an efficient

13 manner to meet the needs of children and families;

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15 (ii) Include life span recommendations,

16 including, in particular, prenatal and early childhood

17 intervention and development practices that promote

18 meaningful lifetime changes and minimize delays in life

19 skills development;

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21 (iii) Review the current judicial system and

22 make recommendations for reforms that may enable courts to

23 better meet the needs of children and families;

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1 (iv) Examine how schools, community organizations, state agencies and the judicial system can 2 3 work more closely together to enhance a sharing of 4 resources and information to meet the needs of parents, 5 preschool children and elementary and secondary school students; 6 7 (v) Examine causes of the most serious problems 8 9 facing children and families, including poverty, mental 10 health needs, violence, the lack of adequate health care, 11 the use of tobacco and illegal drugs and the abuse of 12 alcohol; 13 (vi) Examine issues of parent accountability; 14 15 (vii) Encourage and support family stability; 16 17 and 18 19 (viii) Review the state's existing efforts to 20 determine where present funding and human resources could 21 be employed in a more client-centered and efficient manner. 22 (b) The department of family services shall submit a 23 24 preliminary plan with recommendations for any initial

- 1 legislation to the joint labor, health and social services
- 2 interim committee no later than November 1, 2004. The final
- 3 plan shall be submitted no later than October 1, 2005. Any
- 4 recommendations contained in the plan shall be science-
- 5 based or reflect practices that have a record of success.
- 6 The plan shall specifically include recommendations:

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- 8 (i) For institutionalizing collaboration among
- 9 state and local agencies and the private sector, including
- 10 the business and faith community to provide seamless and
- 11 integrated services in which funding is blended, when
- 12 appropriate, to support client-centered plans that meet the
- 13 needs of individual children and families;

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- 15 (ii) For addressing gaps or deficiencies in
- 16 services;

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- 18 (iii) For early intervention and other services
- 19 that seek to strengthen the bond between children and
- 20 parents and place the primary responsibility for raising
- 21 children on the family;

- 23 (iv) For the consolidation of programs or
- 24 funding sources where appropriate;

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2 development of comprehensive, (v) For the

3 integrated state and community level approaches that will

4 leave no child unsupported in critical aspects of life,

5 particularly from birth through five (5) years of age;

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7 (vi) That will result in more integrated,

efficient and effective programs and cost savings. 8

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10 The department shall widely disseminate requests,

11 including through electronic media, for the

12 participation of private groups and organizations in the

13 development of the plans. Before submitting the preliminary

and final plans to the joint labor, health and social 14

services interim committee, the department shall issue 15

16 drafts of the plans for public review and hold at least one

17 (1) public meeting in a central location in the state to

receive public comments on each plan. 18

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20 In addition to the appropriation contained in

21 subsection (e) of this section, the department of family

22 services may utilize existing resources and apply for any

23 federal or private grants that may be available to augment

funding for the study and plan required under this act. 24

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1 The department may also contract with recognized experts

2 and consultants to conduct the study and develop the plan

3 and recommendations required by this act.

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5 (e) There is appropriated from the general fund to

6 the department of family services two hundred thousand

7 dollars (\$200,000.00) to implement the purposes of this

8 act.

9

10 **Section 2.** This act is effective immediately upon

11 completion of all acts necessary for a bill to become law

12 as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of the Wyoming

13 Constitution.
