1 AN ACT relating to administration of government; providing
2 for state employee travel expenses as specified; and
3 providing for an effective date.

5 *Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:*

7 **Section 1.** W.S. 9-3-102(a) (intro) is amended to read:

9 **9-3-102. Meal allowance; actual expenses; exceptions.**

11 (a) Unless otherwise provided by law, when any state
12 officer or employee is required to travel on overnight
13 trips for official business of the state, he is entitled to
14 receive in addition to transportation expenses as provided
15 by W.S. 9-3-103, lodging expenses, an allowance for meals
16 and incidental expenses and other reimbursable expenses.

1 ~~The lodging and meal and incidental expense allowance shall~~
2 ~~be based on~~ in an amount approved by the state auditor
3 which shall not exceed the published federal travel
4 regulation rates in effect on ~~April 1, 2001~~ the date of
5 travel. The meal and incidental expense allowance shall be
6 computed so as to pay seventy-five percent (75%) of the
7 destination rate on the day of departure, one hundred
8 percent (100%) on all interim days of official travel and
9 seventy-five percent (75%) of the ~~destination~~ prior day's
10 rate on the day of return. Lodging expenses shall be
11 reimbursed up to the amount prescribed in the federal
12 travel regulation as provided in this subsection. The head
13 of the respective agency may approve lodging expenses in
14 excess of the published rate. In addition:
