A BILL

for

AN ACT relating to medical assistance and services;

providing an additional payment for obstetric services 2 under the Wyoming Medical Assistance and Services Act; 3 providing for an appropriation; and providing for an 4 effective date. 5 6 7 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming: 8 Section 1. 9 10 (a) For calendar years 2004 and 2005 for the first 11 12 ten (10) deliveries performed by each physician and paid for under the Wyoming Medical Assistance and Services Act, 13 an additional malpractice insurance 14 there shall be compensation payment of two thousand five hundred dollars 15 16 (\$2,500.00) per delivery. For calendar year 2004 only

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1 deliveries performed on or after the effective date of this
2 act shall be so compensated. Deliveries before the
3 effective date shall not be counted.

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5 (b) If in any year the funds appropriated for the purposes of this act are expended and there are additional 6 7 that would otherwise deliveries be eligible for compensation under subsection (a) of this section, 8 no 9 payments in excess of appropriated funds shall be made, 10 however the joint appropriations interim committee shall be 11 informed that the funds are expended and shall be given an 12 estimate of the supplemental appropriation that would be 13 required to pay for the additional eligible deliveries.

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15 (c) The department of health shall make the payments 16 on behalf of the state and may utilize a fiscal agent to do 17 so. The department of health may structure the payments in 18 any way to capture any federal share available under the 19 Medicaid program, provided the payment structure makes the 20 full payment authorized to each physician participating for 21 the first ten (10) eligible deliveries.

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23 (d) If a community is without obstetric services and24 the physicians who had previously provided obstetric

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1 services have purchased the insurance coverage known as tail coverage to provide coverage for incidents occurring 2 3 but not discovered while they were providing obstetric 4 services, the health department may contract to purchase 5 any such additional coverage that may be required at the end of this program if the physicians will return to 6 provide obstetric services for recipients eligible for 7 services under the Wyoming Medical Assistance and Services 8 9 Act for the duration of this program.

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11 (e) The Wyoming legislature finds that the payment 12 authorized by this act is necessary to assure the continued 13 availability of obstetric services for recipients eligible 14 for services under the Wyoming Medical Assistance and 15 Services Act and thus constitutes a necessary support of 16 the poor as permitted by Article 16, Section 6 of the 17 Wyoming Constitution.

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19 Section 2. There is appropriated from the general 20 fund to the department of health for the purposes of this 21 act three million two hundred thousand dollars 22 (\$3,200,000.00) of which two hundred thousand dollars 23 (\$200,000.00) is reserved for the purchase of tail coverage

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1	and shall remain available for expenditure until June 30,
2	2006.
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4	Section 3. This act is effective April 1, 2004.
