A BILL

for

1 AN ACT relating to the administration of the government;

2 requiring reports by the department of health on

3 developmental disabilities as specified; requiring all rule

4 adoption proceedings of the department to comply with the

5 Administrative Procedure Act; establishing a select

6 committee on developmental disabilities programs as

7 specified; prescribing duties; requiring a report;

8 providing for an appropriation; and providing for an

9 effective date.

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11 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

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13 **Section 1.** W.S. 9-2-103(a) and 9-2-106(a) (vii) are

14 amended to read:

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1 9-2-103. Division administrators; appointment; 2 qualifications; duties; salaries, tenure and removal generally; necessary personnel. 3 4 5 (a) The director shall appoint a separate administrator for the divisions of the department of health 6 7 and he may discharge the administrators as provided in W.S. 9-2-1706(c)(ii). Appointments under this subsection shall 8 9 be subject to the following: 10 11 (i) The administrator for a division dealing 12 primarily with public health shall: 13 14 (i) (A) Have theoretical knowledge practical and managerial skill and experience which fits 15 him for the position, as determined by the director; and 16 17 18 (ii) (B) Repealed By Laws 1998, ch. 20, § 2. 19 20 (iii) (C) Administer a program for the 21 supervision of volunteer physicians who provide medical care, assistance or medical administrative services without 22 charge for the medical services rendered in an eligible 23 24 program in compliance with rules and regulations

promulgated by the department. To qualify as an eligible 1 2 program, the medical services shall be provided in any 3 hospital, clinic, health care facility or institution owned 4 or operated by the state, University of Wyoming or any 5 local government. A disclosure statement shall be signed in advance by the recipients informing them of the physician's 6 7 limited liability under the program. 8 9 The administrator for a division dealing (ii) 10 primarily with developmental disabilities shall annually on 11 October 1 provide reports by program to the legislature, 12 which reports shall include but not be limited to trend 13 data by fiscal year for: 14 15 (A) The number of ongoing and emergency 16 clients served or put on a waiting list for service; 17 18 Amounts expended, both total and per (B) 19 client average, for ongoing and emergency client service; 20 21 (C) The source of funds for services to 22 newly served clients, whether from excess funding for 23 existing clients, funds appropriated for the waiting list,

1	funds appropriated for emergencies or funds from another
2	source;

4	(D) The number of clients projected to
5	become eligible for services in the subsequent year who are
6	not already on a waiting list for service;
7	
8	(E) The number of clients who are expected
9	to transition from one (1) category of service eligibility
10	to another category and their projected costs;
11	
12	(F) The number of clients who are expected
13	to transition from school district services to department
14	of health services at age twenty-one (21) and their
15	<pre>projected costs.</pre>

17	9-2-106. Duties and powers of director of department.
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19	(a) The director shall:
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21	(vii) Ensure that the department and all of its
22	<u>divisions</u> promulgate reasonable rules and regulations.
23	after consultation with the departmental advisory council,
24	and in compliance with the Wyoming Administrative Procedure

1 Act, for the implementation of all state and federal public 2 health, mental health and medical services laws. 3

4 Section 2.

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6 (a) There is created the select committee on 7 developmental disabilities programs consisting of the

8 following members:

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10 (i) Three (3) members of the Wyoming senate
11 appointed by the president of the senate subject to the
12 following:

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14 (A) At least one (1) of the appointees
15 shall be a member of the senate labor, health and social
16 services committee;

18 (B) Not more than two (2) of the appointees
19 shall be from the same political party.

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(ii) Four (4) members of the Wyoming house of representatives appointed by the speaker of the house of representatives subject to the following:

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1 (A) At least two (2) of the appointees 2 shall be members of the house labor, health and social 3 services committee; 4 5 (B) Not more than three (3) of the appointees shall be from the same political party. 6 7 (b) The president of the senate and the speaker of 8 9 the house of representatives shall each appoint cochairman of the select committee. 10 The committee may 11 contract with consultants as necessary. 12 13 (c) The select committee shall: 14 15 (i) Study the state's programs for the 16 developmentally disabled and other states' programs for the 17 delivery of assistance to the developmentally disabled; 18 19 (ii) Identify system changes for improvement in 20 delivery of services to persons afflicted 21 developmental disabilities; 22 23 Sponsor necessary legislation implementing (iii) committee recommendations. 24

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- 2 (d) The select committee shall report to the
- 3 legislature and the governor not later than October 1,
- 4 2004, on conclusions and recommendations developed under
- 5 subsection (c) of this section.

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- 7 (e) Thirty-five thousand dollars (\$35,000.00) is
- 8 appropriated from the general fund to the legislative
- 9 service office to fund activities of the select committee.

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- 11 **Section 3.** The office of planning and administration
- 12 within the department of health shall review all program
- 13 manuals and all internal operating procedures and policies
- 14 affecting services provided by the division of
- 15 developmental disabilities and ensure that all policies of
- 16 general applicability are promulgated as rules in
- 17 accordance with the Wyoming Administrative Procedure Act.

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- 19 **Section 4.** This act is effective immediately upon
- 20 completion of all acts necessary for a bill to become law
- 21 as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of the Wyoming

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22 Constitution.
