- 1 AN ACT relating to insurance; creating a joint legislative
- 2 executive committee to study insurance reform and
- 3 alternatives to tort reform; providing an appropriation;
- 4 providing for a report; and providing for an effective

7 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

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9 Section 1.

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- 11 (a) There is created a joint legislative executive
- 12 committee to study issues relating to insurance reform and
- 13 alternatives to tort reform. The committee shall consist
- 14 of:

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1 (i) Five (5) members from the house of 2 representatives, with not more than three (3) members from

3 the same political party. The members shall be appointed by

4 the speaker of the house, who shall also appoint a

5 cochairman of the committee;

7 (ii) Five (5) members from the senate, with not

more than three (3) members from the same political party. 8

9 The members shall be appointed by the president of the

10 senate, who shall also appoint a cochairman of the

11 committee;

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13 (iii) The governor or his designee.

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(b) The committee shall study issues specified in 15 this subsection relating to insurance and tort reform. The 16 17 insurance department and any state agency shall provide information and other support to the committee 18 requested. The legislative service office shall staff the 19 20 committee. The committee shall report to the management 21 council its findings, including any recommendations for

statutory changes. The report shall be provided not later

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than November 1, 2004. The committee shall study:

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1	(i) Self insurance pools;
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3	(ii) Reinsurance issues;
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5	(iii) Subsidies for doctors in health care
6	crisis areas;
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8	(iv) The necessity for additional power for the
9	insurance commissioner;
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11	(v) Any other issues the committee deems
12	appropriate and necessary for this study.
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14	(c) The committee shall have the ability to contract
15	for consultants or administrative services as required to
16	aid in preparation of the report.
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18	(d) There is appropriated from the general fund to
19	the legislative service office fifty thousand dollars
20	(\$50,000.00) or as much thereof as is necessary for
21	purposes of this act.

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1 Section 2. This act is effective immediately upon

2 completion of all acts necessary for a bill to become law

3 as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of the Wyoming

4 Constitution.
