## HOUSE BILL NO. HB0058

State outdoor recreation areas and facilities-fees.

Sponsored by: Joint Travel, Recreation, Wildlife and Cultural Resources Interim Committee

## A BILL

for

1 ACT relating to state outdoor recreation areas; AN authorizing the establishment of fees for state outdoor 2 3 recreation areas by the department of state parks and 4 cultural resources; providing criteria and requirements for 5 the establishment of fees; providing for lifetime permits 6 as specified; repealing statutorily set fees; authorizing 7 the establishment of amenities and enhancements; providing for a continuous appropriation of fees; making conforming 8 amendments; and providing for an effective date. 9

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11 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

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Section 1. W.S. 36-4-121(a)(intro), by creating new paragraphs (xiii) through (xv), by amending and renumbering (xiii) and (xiv) as (xvi) and (xvii), (b), (c), (e), (h),

1 (j), (k) (n), (o) and by creating a new subsection (q),

2 36-4-123(a)(intro) and 36-8-1002(d) are amended to read:

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4 **36-4-121**. Permits to use outdoor recreation areas and 5 facilities.

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7 (a) department of state parks and cultural resources shall offer for sale permits that allow use of 8 9 the state parks, recreation areas, archeological sites and 10 historic sites. Daily use permits shall be required at 11 Glendo, Guernsey, Curt Gowdy, Edness Kimball Wilkins, Buffalo Bill, Boysen, Seminoe and Keyhole state parks and 12 Fort Bridger, South Pass City, Trail End, Fort Fetterman 13 and Fort Phil Kearney state historic sites, and Hawk 14 15 Springs state recreation area outdoor recreation areas and 16 facilities. There shall be no daily use fees established at 17 Bear River or Hot Springs State parks. The department may establish voluntary pay stations at Bear River and Hot 18 19 Springs state parks to allow users of those parks to make 20 voluntary contributions for the use of the state parks. 21 Persons who enter or use Bear River or Hot Springs state 22 park without paying daily use fees shall not be subject to 23 the penalties provided for in subsection (j) of this 24 section. Overnight camping permits shall be required at

Boysen, Buffalo Bill, Curt Gowdy, Glendo, Guernsey, 1 2 Keyhole, Seminoe and Sinks Canyon state parks, Connor 3 Battlefield state historic site, Medicine Lodge state 4 archeological site and Hawk Springs state recreation area by the department during the entire calendar year. Except 5 for as otherwise provided in this section, including the 6 7 lifetime permit issued without cost pursuant to subsection (n) of this section, the cost of the permits authorized 8 9 under this section shall be the department is authorized to 10 establish daily, overnight and annual permit fees by rule 11 and regulation annually. The permit fees may be 12 established to allow the use of all outdoor recreation 13 areas and facilities, any specified outdoor recreation area 14 or facility, or any combination thereof. The department shall maintain records sufficient to support the fees 15 charged and shall establish fees in accordance with the 16 17 following: 18 19 (xiii) Fees shall be established by rule 20 promulgated in accordance with the Wyoming Administrative 21 Procedure Act and approved by the commission. In addition 22 to all requirements for rulemaking pursuant to the Wyoming Administrative Procedure Act, prior to setting or altering 23 24 fees under this subsection by rule and regulation the

1	department shall conduct a public meeting in each community
2	with a population greater than three thousand (3,000)
3	residents and located within thirty (30) miles of an
4	outdoor recreation area or facility in which fees are set
5	or altered. The public meeting under this paragraph may be
6	held for purposes including, but not limited to,
7	information distribution, soliciting community input and
8	assessment of local needs and uses of the outdoor
9	recreation area or facility. Notice for a public meeting
10	under this paragrah shall be provided in accordance with
11	W.S. 16-3-103(a)(ii). Upon receipt of notice from the
12	department of its intent to adopt rules pursuant to this
13	subsection, the legislative service office shall give
14	notice to the joint travel, recreation, wildlife and
15	cultural resources interim committee;
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17	(xiv) Fees shall be reviewed at least annually
18	by the department and the commission. An annual report
19	shall be submitted to the joint travel, recreation,
20	wildlife and cultural resources interim committee;
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22	(xv) Fees shall be established in amounts based
23	on an economic analysis which shall consider, at least, the
24	following criteria:

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2	(A) Data regarding fees established for
3	similar outdoor recreation areas and facilities in
4	contiguous states;
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6	(B) The cost of access to outdoor
7	recreation areas and facilities;
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9	(C) Parameters within which the department
10	can be responsive to changing resource conditions and
11	<pre>market demand;</pre>
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13	(D) The operation and maintenance costs of
14	outdoor recreation areas and facilities;
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16	(E) Public input from prior public meetings
17	conducted pursuant to paragraph (xiii) of this subsection.
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19	(xiii) (xvi) Upon written request of a group
20	sponsoring a special event or upon the department's
21	sponsorship of a special event, the director of the
22	department may, with the approval of after informing the
23	parks and cultural resources commission, waive any fees
24	required under established pursuant to this subsection. A

fee which may exceed the daily use permit fee specified in 1 2 this section provided by rule may be charged for entry to 3 special events. Holders of annual bucking horse daily or 4 evernight permits may be charged the special event fee. A 5 special event fee may be charged at any park, area or site outdoor recreation area or facility under the jurisdiction 6 7 of the department, regardless of whether a daily use fee has been established by law rule; 8 9 10 (xiv) (xvii) Fees may be waived for by the 11 following: department with the approval of the commission. 12 (A) Persons needing to pass through a state 13 14 park or historic site to access private property shall be 15 exempt from the entrance permit requirements of this 16 section; 17 18 Persons needing access to a state park or historic site to conduct official business or only to 19 20 access a private commercial business without further use of 21 the state park or historic site shall be exempt from the 22 entrance permit requirements of this section; 23

(C) School groups on school sanctioned 1 2 events including events sanctioned by educational programs 3 defined under W.S. 21-4-101(a)(iii), (iv) and (v), and 4 residents and staff of publicly owned homes or institutions 5 while on official agency functions shall be exempt from the 6 entrance permit requirements of this section; 7 8 (D) Not for profit groups or organizations 9 needing access to a state park or historic site to provide 10 volunteer assistance or services that have been previously agreed upon by the department of state parks and cultural 11 12 resources shall be exempt from the permit requirements of 13 this section. 14 (b) Any holder of an annual bucking horse entrance 15 permit or an annual resident or nonresident overnight 16 camping permit may obtain additional vehicle annual bucking 17 horse entrance permits or additional vehicle annual 18 overnight camping permits from the department or 19 20 selling agent of the department upon payment of the 21 established fee, prescribed under paragraph (a) (vii) or (viii) of this section, as applicable, and upon submission 22 of proof satisfactory to the department that an original 23

annual permit was purchased and that the additional vehicle

is registered in the same name as the vehicle for which the 1 2 original annual permit is obtained, or that the additional 3 vehicle is operated by the person who purchased the 4 original annual permit or a member of his family under duly 5 granted authority from his employer. The director shall determine the validity of the authority of an applicant to 6 7 operate an employer-owned vehicle prior to issuance of an additional vehicle permit for that vehicle under this 8 9 section. Any vehicle in tow by another vehicle owned by the same person shall be considered a single vehicle for 10 purposes of this section and only a single annual bucking 11 12 horse daily use permit or fee shall be required for 13 entrance at state parks outdoor recreation areas and 14 facilities and a single annual overnight camping permit or 15 fee shall be required for overnight camping at state parks 16 outdoor recreation areas and facilities.

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If an annual bucking horse daily use permit or an annual resident or nonresident overnight camping permit is lost, mutilated or destroyed, the holder of the permit may obtain a duplicate annual permit from the department or any selling agent of the department upon filing an affidavit showing the loss, mutilation or destruction of the original

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1 permit and upon payment of the fee imposed under paragraph

2 (a) (ix) or (x) of this section by rule, as applicable.

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4 (e) The department through the division of state 5 parks and historic sites shall in accordance with W.S. 6 36-4-123, appoint selling agents to sell bucking horse 7 permits authorized under this section. Each appointed selling agent shall retain up to ten percent (10%) as 8 9 established by rule of the department under subsection (a) 10 of this section of the cost selling price of each permit 11 sold under this section as his sales commission. Designated 12 department employees may sell annual bucking horse daily 13 use permits and other permits required by this section but 14 no employee of the department shall receive any commission

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on permits sold.

17 (h) The funds received by the department from the sale of the permits shall be deposited in a capital 18 19 construction account within the enterprise fund and are 20 continuously appropriated to and may be expended by the 21 division department for capital construction projects, 22 major maintenance and site interpretation such as exhibits, signage and displays. as approved by the legislature. 23

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1 (j) Any person using state parks, recreation areas 2 and historic sites any outdoor recreation area or facility 3 and failing to obtain a bucking horse permit or the other 4 permits or pay the fee required by pursuant to this section 5 and any person otherwise violating this section is guilty of a misdemeanor punishable by a fine of not more than 6 seven hundred fifty dollars (\$750.00), imprisonment for not 7 more than six (6) months, or both. 8

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10 department of state parks and cultural (k) The 11 resources is authorized to contract with the town of 12 Ranchester to implement a fee collection program at Connor 13 Battlefield state historic site and to provide for park 14 maintenance and operation. Notwithstanding subsection (h) of this section, fees collected pursuant to paragraphs 15 16 (a) (ii) and (v) of this section for overnight camping at 17 Connor Battlefield state historic site shall be deposited into a separate account within the earmarked revenue fund 18 and are continuously appropriated to and may be expended by 19 20 the department pursuant to contracts entered into under 21 this subsection.

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Any resident disabled veteran who receives fifty 23 24 percent (50%) or more service connected disability

1 compensation from the United States department of veteran's 2 affairs and any resident person who is permanently and 3 totally disabled as defined by 42 U.S.C. § 1382c may apply 4 to the department for a lifetime bucking horse permit 5 authorizing the use of state parks, outdoor recreation areas, archeological sites and historic sites facilities 6 7 without payment of any daily use, overnight or other fee authorized to be charged pursuant to this section. Only one 8 9 (1) permit shall be issued to any qualified applicant under this subsection and shall be valid for the applicant and 10 11 for all occupants of the applicant's vehicle. In addition 12 information other application procedural to and 13 requirements prescribed by rule and regulation of the 14 department, application for the lifetime permit shall include proof of residency and certification of the service 15 connected disability or the qualifying disability, as 16 17 applicable. The lifetime permit is valid as long as the holder is a Wyoming resident. A permit under this 18 subsection shall be issued to an eligible applicant without 19 20 the imposition of a fee.

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22 (o) The department is authorized to sponsor special 23 events and to contract with groups sponsoring special 24 events at state parks, outdoor recreation areas,

archeological sites or historic sites and facilities. A 1 2 special event fee may be charged as provided in paragraph 3 (a) (xiii) (a) (xvi) of this section. The special event fee 4 need not be established by rule. All funds received from 5 special events sponsored or approved by the department shall be deposited in a special events enterprise account. 6 7 within the enterprise fund. The funds deposited within the account are continuously appropriated to and may be 8 9 expended by the department to conduct special events 10 directly or pursuant to contracts entered under this 11 subsection. 12 13 (q) The department is authorized to develop 14 additional amenities and enhancements at existing outdoor 15 recreation areas and facilities. The department may impose a fee for the use of any amenity or enhancement in excess 16 17 of fees charged for admission to the outdoor recreation area or facility, to fund the cost of the amenity or 18 19 enhancement authorized under this section. Fees under this 20 subsection shall be established in an amount to ensure 21 that, to the extent practicable, the revenue generated from 22 the additional fee collected approximates the direct and 23 indirect costs of maintaining and operating the amenity or 24 enhancement. Fees collected pursuant to this subsection

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1 shall be deposited and expended in accordance with 2 subsection (h) of this section. 3 4 36-4-123. Selling agents for registrations, licenses 5 and permits. 6 department of state parks and cultural 7 (a) The resources through the division of parks and historic sites 8 9 shall appoint selling agents to sell 10 registrations pursuant to W.S. 31-2-402, bucking horse 11 under W.S. 36-4-121 other permits and licenses, 12 registrations and permits for which the department may by law be required authorized to issue and collect fees. 13 14 Selling agents appointed under this section shall be bonded by the department, subject to the following: 15 16 Transfer of lands; park administration; 17 36-8-1002. 18 site administration; lease and contract agreements. 19 20 (d) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the 21 department may impose an admissions fee in excess of fees 22 charged for admissions to other state parks and sites

outdoor recreation areas and facilities, to fund necessary

expenses incurred for park and site development, operations

and maintenance. Notwithstanding W.S. 36-4-121(h) Daily 1 2 admission fees collected pursuant to this subsection shall 3 be deposited into a separate account within the earmarked 4 revenue fund and may be expended by the department upon legislative appropriation in accordance with W.S. 5 36-4-121(h). 6 7 8 **Section 2.** W.S. 36-4-121(a)(i) through (xii) is 9 repealed. 10 Section 3. This act is effective July 1, 2005. 11 12
