for

- 1 AN ACT relating to the Wyoming Pharmacy Act; amending
- 2 licensing requirements for resident and nonresident
- 3 pharmacies as specified; amending grounds for denial,
- 4 suspension, revocation or nonrenewal of licenses as
- 5 specified; amending grounds for required notice by
- 6 licensees to the board of pharmacy; specifing procedures
- 7 for appeals; and providing for an effective date.

9 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

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- 11 **Section 1.** W.S. 33-24-113 and 33-24-152(a)(intro),
- 12 (ii), by creating new paragraphs (v) and (vi), (c) through
- 13 (e), (g) and by creating a new subsection (h) are amended
- 14 to read:

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1	33-24-113. Licensing of resident pharmacy;
2	exceptions; display of license; suspension, revocation,
3	letter of admonition, administrative penalty or refusal to
4	renew; appeals.

6	(a) Every commercial operation Any pharmacy located
7	in the this state operating a pharmacy which dispenses,
8	mails or in any manner delivers controlled substances or
9	dangerous drugs or devices in this state pursuant to a
10	prescription or provides pharmaceutical care in this state
11	shall: annually make
12	
13	(i) Submit a license application to the board
14	for a license on a form prescribed by the board and pay the
15	license fee established in accordance with this act by the
16	board in its rules and regulations. Where pharmaceutical
17	operations are conducted at more than one (1) location,
18	each location shall be separately licensed;
19	
20	(ii) Notify the board of the occurrence of any
21	of the following:

23	(A) Permanent closing of the pharmacy;

Τ	(B) Change in pharmacy ownership, hame,
2	management, location or pharmacist in charge;

4	(C) Conviction of any pharmacy owner or
5	employee for violation of any state or federal drug law;

7	(D) Any substantial theft or loss of
8	dangerous drugs, controlled substances or medical devices;

L3	(b) The license shall be displayed in a conspicuous
L 4	place in the pharmacy for which it is issued, and shall
L 5	expire one (1) year after the date of issue be renewed
L 6	annually on or before June 30 by submitting a renewal
L7	application to the board.

L 9	(c) It is unlawful for any person or commercial
20	operation to operate a pharmacy unless a license has been
21	issued to the operator by the board of pharmacy.
22	
23	(d) The board of pharmacy may deny, suspend, revoke
24	or refuse to renew a license issued under the section, may

1	issue a letter of admonition $_{ au}$ to a resident pharmacy
2	licensee and may assess an administrative penalty, of up to
3	<pre>not to exceed two thousand dollars (\$2,000.00) or refuse to</pre>
4	renew any registration obtained by false representation or
5	fraud, or when the pharmacy for which the registration was
6	made is kept open for the transaction of business without a
7	registered pharmacist in charge thereof, or when the person
8	to whom registration was granted or his employees or other
9	persons under his supervision or control has been convicted
10	of a violation of W.S. 33-24-101 through 33-24-301. per
11	violation, against a resident pharmacy licensee on any of
12	the following grounds:
13	
14	(i) Failure to comply with any requirement of
15	this chapter or the Wyoming Controlled Substances Act;
16	
17	(ii) Failure to comply with rules and
18	regulations of the board;
19	
20	(iii) Conviction of a pharmacy owner, pharmacist
21	in charge, staff pharmacist or pharmacy technician for a
22	felony under any state or federal law, if the conviction is
23	related to the practice of pharmacy;
24	

1	(iv) Obtaining any remuneration by fraud,
2	misrepresentation or deception;
3	
4	(v) Suspension or revocation of a pharmacy
5	license in any other state;
6	
7	(vi) Knowing submission of false, misleading or
8	fraudulent information to the board in connection with an
9	initial or renewal application for a resident pharmacy
10	license;
11	
12	(vii) Purchase or receipt of a dangerous drug,
13	controlled substance or medical device from a source other
14	than a manufacturer, wholesaler or pharmacy licensed by the
15	board;
16	
17	(viii) Purchase or receipt of a dangerous drug,
18	controlled substance or medical device that is not approved
19	by the federal drug administration;
20	
21	(ix) Keeping the pharmacy open for business
22	without a licensed pharmacist in charge on site;
23	

1	(x) Allowing a person who is not licensed by the
2	board to perform duties as a pharmacist, pharmacy
3	technician or pharmacy technician in training.
4	
5	(e) Before any <u>final adverse</u> administrative penalty
6	may be assessed action is taken against a pharmacy
7	<u>licensee</u> , the <u>holder of the registration</u> <u>licensee</u> is
8	entitled to a hearing by the board of pharmacy upon due
9	notice of the time and place where the hearing will be
LO	held. The accused may be represented by legal counsel, is
L1	entitled to compulsory attendance of witnesses and may
L2	appeal to the district court of the county in which the
L3	pharmacy is situated, in accordance with the Wyoming
L 4	Administrative Procedure Act.

L 6	(f) Any administrative penalty assessed shall be paid
L 7	to the board who shall remit the monies to the county
L 8	treasurer to the credit of the public school fund of the
L 9	county in which the violation occurred.

2 (a) Any pharmacy located outside this state which
3 ships, mails or delivers, in any manner, controlled
4 substances or dangerous drugs or devices into this state
5 pursuant to a prescription or provides pharmaceutical care
6 to a resident of this state shall be considered a
7 nonresident pharmacy, shall register with obtain a license
8 from the board, and shall:

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(ii) Comply with all directions and requests for 10 11 information from the regulatory or licensing agency of the 12 state in which it is licensed as well as with all requests 13 for information made by the board pursuant to this section. The nonresident pharmacy shall maintain, at all times, a 14 valid unexpired license, permit or registration to conduct 15 16 the pharmacy in compliance with the laws of the state in 17 which it is a resident; . As a prerequisite to registering with the board, the nonresident pharmacy shall submit a 18 19 copy of the most recent inspection report resulting from an 20 inspection conducted by the regulatory or licensing agency of the state in which it is located; 21

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1	(v) Submit a license application to the board or
2	a form prescribed by the board and pay the license fee
3	established by the board in its rules and regulations;

5	(vi) Immediately notify the board of the
6	occurrence of any of the following:

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5 (d) A nonresident pharmacy registration license under
6 this section shall be renewed annually on or before the
7 first day of July of each year June 30 by submitting a
8 renewal application to the board.

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10 (e) The board may deny, suspend, revoke or refuse to 11 renew a license issued under this section, may issue a 12 letter of admonition, to a nonresident pharmacy licensee 13 and may assess an administrative penalty, not to exceed two thousand dollars (\$2,000.00) per violation, revoke or 14 suspend against a nonresident pharmacy registration for 15 16 failure to comply with any requirement of this chapter. 17 licensee on any of the following grounds:

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(i) Failure to comply with any requirement of
the pharmacy practice act of the state of domicile or the
Wyoming Controlled Substances Act;

1 regulatory authority in the state where the pharmacy is 2 located; 3 4 (viii) Purchase or receipt of a dangerous drug, 5 controlled substance or medical device that is not approved by the federal drug administration; 6 7 (ix) Keeping the pharmacy open for business 8 9 without a licensed pharmacist in charge on site. 10 11 (q) It is unlawful for any nonresident pharmacy which 12 is not registered pursuant to this section licensed by the 13 board to advertise its services in this state, or for any 14 person who is a resident of this state to advertise the pharmacy services of a nonresident pharmacy which has not 15 registered with been licensed by the board, with the 16 17 knowledge that the advertisement will or is likely to induce members of the public in this state to use the 18 pharmacy to fill prescriptions. Any person convicted of 19 20 violating this subsection shall be subject to the penalties 21 provided by W.S. 33-24-142. 22 (h) Before any final adverse administrative action is 23 24 taken against a nonresident pharmacy licensee, the licensee

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is entitled to a hearing by the board of pharmacy upon due 1 2 notice of the time and place where the hearing will be held. The accused may be represented by legal counsel, is 3 4 entitled to the compulsory attendance of witnesses and may 5 appeal to the first judicial district court located in Laramie county in <u>accordance</u> with the Wyoming 6 7 Administrative Procedure Act. 8 9 **Section 2.** W.S. 33-24-152(a)(i), (iv) and (f) is 10 repealed. 11 Section 3. This act is effective July 1, 2005. 12
