AN ACT relating to the Wyoming Pharmacy Act; authorizing 1 telepharmacies as specified; providing definitions; and 2 providing for an effective date. 3 4 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming: 5 6 7 Section 1. W.S. 33-24-156 is created to read: 8 33-24-156. Telepharmacy practice authorized. 9 10 The board pursuant to its rules and regulations 11 (a) may authorize a licensed pharmacy to store and dispense 12 prescription drugs as provided in subsection (b) of this 13 section through a telepharmacy located at a site at least 14 twenty-five (25) miles from a licensed pharmacy. 15 16

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1 (b) Telepharmacies shall include the following 2 minimum features: 3 4 (i) Storage, security and dispensing of 5 prescription drugs in unit of issue packages; 6 7 (ii) Connection by a secure communication system to the parent pharmacy, with the capability of live video 8 9 and audio communication with a registered pharmacist at the 10 parent pharmacy during hours of operation; 11 12 (iii) Adequate provision for security, including 13 verification of customer identity and prescription information; 14 15 16 (iv) Automated inventory control using bar 17 codes, radio frequency tags or a similar identification 18 system; 19 20 (v) Prominent display of the name, address and 21 toll free telephone number of the parent pharmacy. 22 (c) A telepharmacy system operated as provided in 23 this act and in accord with rules and regulations of the 24

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1 board is deemed to be operated under the charge of a 2 registered pharmacist for purposes of W.S. 33-24-113(b). A 3 pharmacist may not serve as a pharmacist in charge for more 4 than one (1) telepharmacy at any one time. 5 Section 2. W.S. 33-24-101 is amended as follows: 6 7 8 33-24-101. Short title; definitions. 9 10 This act means W.S. 33-24-101 through 33-24-301 (a) 11 and shall be known as the "Wyoming Pharmacy Act". 12 "This act" means W.S. 33-24-101 through 13 (b) 24 - 301. 14 15 16 (c) As used in this act: τ 17 18 (i) "Direct supervision" means that a licensed 19 pharmacist shall be physically present and capable of 20 observing the actions of a pharmacy technician except at 21 telepharmacies where video oversight is maintained; 22 23 (ii) "Telepharmacy" means a site located within a medical clinic or community health center that is remote 24

1	from but under the active control and supervision of a
2	licensed pharmacist, and that is staffed during hours of
3	operation by a certified pharmacy technician or registered
4	pharmacy intern;
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6	(iii) "Collaborative pharmaceutical care" means
7	a pharmacist working in collaboration with physicians and
8	other medical providers authorized to prescribe
9	medications;
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11	(iv) "Unprofessional conduct" means:
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13	(i)(A) Dispensing a drug or brand of drug
14	in filling a prescription which differs from that specified
15	by the prescription without authority of the issuer of the
16	prescription;
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18	(ii)(B) Obtaining any fee by fraud or
19	misrepresentation;
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21	(iii)(C) Willfully betraying patient
22	confidences, provided a pharmacist may provide otherwise
23	confidential patient information to other licensed health
24	care professionals treating the patient;

1 2 (iv) (D) Employing directly or indirectly 3 any student or any suspended or unlicensed pharmacist to 4 practice pharmacy unless authorized by law; 5 6 (v) (E) Advertising in a misleading, false 7 or deceptive manner; 8 9 (vi) (F) Filling a prescription which is 10 more than two (2) years old; 11 12 (vii) (G) Filling a prescription without 13 reasonable inquiry and confirmation of its validity if there are reasonable grounds to doubt the current existence 14 of a doctor-patient relationship between the prescriber and 15 the customer seeking to obtain the drug; 16 17 18 (viii) (H) Filling a prescription with a drug that is past the expiration date provided by the 19 20 manufacturer or supplier of the drug or other competent 21 authority; 22 23 (ix) (J) Filling a prescription with drugs which have not been refrigerated as recommended by the 24

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   manufacturer or supplier of the drugs or by other competent
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   authority; or
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                 (x) (K) Other actions defined by rule and
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    regulations as relevant to the pharmacist's professional
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    character.
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        (d) "Collaborative pharmaceutical care" means a
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    pharmacist working in collaboration with physicians and
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   other medical providers authorized to prescribe
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   medications.
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        Section 3. This act is effective July 1, 2005.
